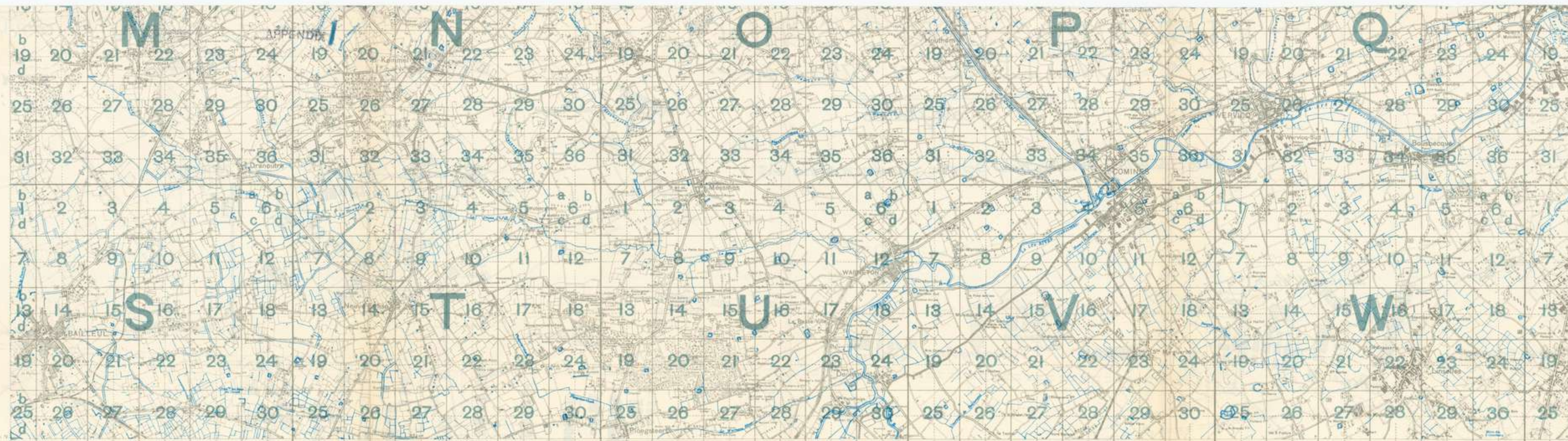

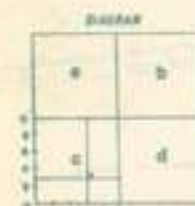


INSTRUCTIONS AS TO THE USE OF THE SQUARES.

1. The large rectangles on the map, lettered A, B, C, etc., are divided into squares of 1,000 yards side, which are numbered 1, 2, 3, etc. Each of these squares is subdivided into four minor squares of 500 yards side. These minor squares are considered as lettered a, b, c, d. (See Square No. 6 in each rectangle).

A point may thus be described as lying within Square B.6, M.3.b, etc.

2. To locate a point within a small square, consider the sides divided into tenths and define the point by taking so many tenths from W. to E. along Southern side, and so many from S. to N. along Western side; the S.W. corner always being taken as origin, and the Southern side being always given by the first figure. Thus the point Z would be 65, i.e. 6 divisions East and 5 divisions North from origin.



Note.—Spot heights enclosed in a rectangle are taken from the 1:50,000 map and are not always in agreement with the revised contours.

(c) Signal School

by bringing in the old Corps Signal School
from HENENCOURT (arrived 17th.May 1917)

The Provisional Establishment was fixed by 1st.ANZAC Corps
memo. G.S.72 and published in A.I.F. Orders.

The Site of the School was decided upon by the 1st.ANZAC Corps
Staff in consultation with the Commandant early in April.

The work of re-construction & construction commenced on April
11th.1917 & has gone on ever since.

The Map co-ordination is OVILLERS 57D.S.E.4 - Sq.X.1.C.7.3.
(Headquarters)

The Hutments taken over were those of ROBERTS, KITCHENER, and
GOUGH HUTS.

The subsequent development is shown in plan attached as Appendix
1.

The labour was furnished by 50 Prisoners of War & by Batmen.
Much work was done by Students & Staff in spare hours & the
whole was supervised by the Engineer Officer.

A Company of the 49th.Battalion was lent for the first
fortnight & subsequently a Pioneer Platoon from Divisions in turn assisted.

A resume of the work done is given in Appendix II.

TRAINING GROUND.

The Training Area affords every facility, embracing as it does portions of Battle-field, wood, river, ravine, & panorama.

The Drill-grounds are not very satisfactory, but fulfil requirements for the summer months.

FIELD-FIRING RANGE.

The Field-firing Range is contained in the area & as per attached plan - Appendix V.

This is the Army Battle-practice area. The precautionary measures and the responsibility for danger, etc, are vested in the hands of the School Commandant - vide copy of Third Army instructions attached .App.VII.

30 YARDS & LEWIS GUN RANGES.

Constructed into the old Railway Embankment at X.7a.3.9.

OPEN RIFLE RANGE.

Constructed during June at X1.B.Central on the same danger area as the Field Firing Range.

ADMINISTRATION.

Supervised by the Assistant-Commandant.

The general system is that of the English Mess & Barrack-room.

Standing Orders are given in Appendix III.

Syllabus for all Schools (current in Sept.) Appendix IV.

Messing is done for the Technical Schools by the Cookery School - for the Infantry by their own Wings. There are the following Officers Messes :-

- 1 for each Infantry Wing.
- 1 for Headquarters.
- 1 for Technical Schools.

Dining halls are provided for all N.C.O's & Staff.

There is a Canteen (Dry & Wet), a Recreation Room & two Writing Rooms.

The School is rationed from ALBERT rail-head, Water supply by pump from a water-bore near School Headquarters, Ammunition from "Q" Branch - 3rd. Army. The Infantry School Staff administers all the Subjoined Schools. Engineer Stores drawn by Engineer Officer through C.E.3rd.Army.

GENERAL NOTES.

Recreational Training is run by Committees of Students with Instructors as Presidents.

There is an Athletic Oval, two football grounds & a cricket pitch.

A Drill Sergeant from the Coldstream Guards was very kindly lent to the School by the Guards Division for the first two Infantry Courses.

Two special Demonstrations of Platoon Training were given on July 6th. & 14th. 1917 & were largely attended.

There are two Army Gymnastic Staff Instructors attached to the School.

An Aggregate Cup was bought for the School & is held by the Infantry Wing winning most points in the Competitions at the end of each Course. Prizes are given for

- (a) Events in School Competitions.
- (b) For specially good work in organisation of recreational Training.
- (c) For a School Essay.

There were 4 Infantry Divisions (1st. 2nd. 4th. 5th.) & Corps Troops furnishing Students until July 21st. when the 4th. Australian Division left the Corps.

- (1) APPLICATION. These orders apply to the Infantry, Subjoined Schools & all Troops coming under the Administration of the Commandant.
- (2) SYLLABUS OF WORK A Syllabus, liable to variation from time to time, is laid down & posted in each School.
- (3) ROUTINE ORDERS. Are published as required, not necessarily daily & are sent to all Wings & Subjoined Schools.

- Special work or extra Parades as punishment - 5.45-6.30pm.
Previous to night operations, afternoon work may be curtailed.
- (5) INSPECTIONS.
- Huts, Kits, beds, kitchens, & all surroundings are to be ready for inspection by 10 a.m.
 - Kits & beds are to be made up in School pattern & the Camp is to be clean in every detail.
 - This tidiness is to be maintained up to 5 p.m. Cleanliness & Sanitation at all times. Wing Commanders are held personally responsible for this, and the condition of all road drains & ditches in the vicinity of their areas & frontages.
 - Rifles are to be placed only in the racks provided.
 - Senior Instructors of Wings & Subjoined Schools are responsible for the above. The Adjutant is responsible for Headquarters.
 - Permanent School Staff, except Officers & N.C.O.'s Instrs. are to be inspected in Full Marching Order on the 2nd. & 4th. Saturdays of each Infantry Course, at 10 a.m. One cook only will remain in each Mess kitchen, changing round in turn, & 1 man in each Officers & NCO's Mess.
- (6) DISCIPLINE.
- For private soldiers, batmen, cooks, etc., an extra, or punishment parade is fixed for 5.45 p.m. Extra Parade will be given for any delinquency, such as failing to salute Officers, untidy hut or bed, unpunctuality, etc. This Parade may take the form of either Drill or Fatigue.
 - Naked lights after dark, are forbidden. All hut windows are to be provided with curtains & these are to be drawn at dusk.
 - Troops are not to cross ground which is wired off.
 - No explosives are to be thrown, or rifle or revolver shooting to be done unless in the presence of an Officer Instructor. Detonators, Bombs, or any live ammunition or other explosives must not be kept in Huts. All explosives found in the School area must be sent to the Bomb Store immediately.
 - It is forbidden to kick footballs about within the lines.
- (7) BOUNDS. No student may leave the School precincts during working hours except for instructional purposes or on duty, without permission of an Officer Instructor. In non-working hours the local villages are in bounds. Leave must come from the Headquarters Office & is necessary for forward areas beyond BAPAUME & for ALBERT & back areas.

(8) MESSES.

The Senior Instructor is responsible to the Commandant for the Discipline & Administration of the Messes in his Wing or Sub-joined School. Mess Rules are to be posted in all Messes.

(9) CANTEENS.

(a) All goods must be paid for cash down.
 (b) The Canteens are open at the following hours :-

(10) FIRE.

Orders in case of Fire are to be posted in all Huts.

(11) OFFICIAL TIME.

This is Corps Time & is available from the Telephone Room. To be checked daily at 8.a.m.

(12) POSTAL ARRANGEMENTS.

Letters are to be addressed simply 1st.ANZAC Corps Schools, FRANCE.All letters for post will be collected from Post-boxes at 7.p.m. daily,Censored by the appointed Officers on the same evening & despatched on the following morning.

(13) PAY.

Pay is issued fortnightly to all Staffs & School Students. Pay is issued to the Students of Sub-joined Schools of less duration than one month for the sole purpose of paying their Mess Bills (vide A.I.F.Orders).

(14) COMMITTEES. The following Permanent Committees are to exist :-

- (a) General Mess & Canteen - 3 members of Officer Staff
 (b) Permanent Staff Messes - 3 " " Staff.

The following General Committees will be appointed at the commencement of each Infantry Course,Composed as under :-

President. - 1 Staff or Student Officer.
 Members. - 1 Officer or NCO.Student of each Wing.
 1 Staff N.C.O. Instr.(Hon Sec).

for the following:-

- (a) Games & Sports.
 (b) Boxing.
 (c) Concerts & Amusements.

All complaints or suggestions must be brought to the above. These Committees are responsible to the Asst.Commandant.

(15) DRESS.

- (a) Smartness & Cleanliness in turn-out is to be kept at a high standard.Strict uniformity is to be maintained.
 (b) Australian Hats are to be worn on Parade with brim turned up.
 (c) Instructors & Asst.Instructors are to wear belts on Parade.

DRESS (contd)

(d) The following Orders of Dress are referred to in Routine Orders:-

- (1) Drill Order. Rifle, Belt & Side arms.
- (2) Musketry Order. Rifle, Side arms, belt & pouches. Loosened Sling.
- (3) Fighting Order. Rifle, Side arms & pouches, haversack, water bottle on back, Steel Helmets.
- (4) Clean Fatigue. Service Dress & Puttees.
- (5) Marching Order. According to Battalion pattern but must be uniform in Battalions.

- (e) Trousers are not to be worn on Parades or on duty or when walking out of the school area. Mounted Officers & men only will wear puttees reversed.
- (f) Gumboots are forbidden on Parade.
- (g) When walking out, Officers are to wear belt & carry a cane.
- (h) N.C.O's are to wear belts & side arms.
- (i) Other ranks are to wear belts.

(16) BATMEN.

- (a) All batmen whether of Staff or Student Officers are available for duty either in Messes, for fatigue, drills, parades, etc.
- (b) In each Wing or sub-joined School, 25% may be used in Officers Messes.
- (c) The remaining 75% parade daily (saturdays excepted) at 9.30 a.m. for general duties until 12 noon & from 2p.m. to 4.p.m. (excepting wednesday afternoons).
On saturdays they will parade at 10.45a.m. for Ceremonial Drill with School if specially ordered.
Towards the end of the course, batmen are available for Tactical Exercises in lieu of daily fatigues.
For Exercises, this same number will parade at the same time time & in same dress as students.

(17) GENERAL DUTY- MEN & NCO's Are to attend Parades as ordered from time to time at short notice. They must therefore keep their equipment in good order.

(18) WATER.

Great care will be necessary if the water supply is to be maintained. All ranks must join in seeing that there is as little waste as possible, turning off running taps, etc. It is forbidden to wash the person or clothing or to clean mess tins at stand pipes.

(19) CENSORSHIP.

Attention is drawn to the following Censorship Regulations. G.R.O. 1869. All ranks are forbidden to disclose in any letter, the Brigade, Division, or other formation to which their own or any other unit belong, unless it forms a necessary part of that unit's address. This applies equally to the address on the envelope & the contents of the letter. Censor. Page 15. The name of a place or the writer's unit should not be written at the head of a communication. Whenever it is necessary to indicate to the addressee how to address letters, etc, to the writer, this information should be embodied in the text. It is forbidden to mention the name of any place when the writer is with his unit. Page. 16. The rank & unit of the writer should not be added to his signature. Page 13. The taking of photographs is not permitted & the sending of photographs & films through the post is forbidden. Page. 10. Forbidden information. Picture Postcards which give dangerous information are included under this heading. It is not sufficient to cut off the name. Page. 17. The sending home of the following is prohibited:-
Tobacco & Cigarettes.
Captured Trophies.
Anything containing Explosives.

(20) SICK PARADE. Sick Parades will be held at School Hospital Hut, as under

Headquarters & all Wings 7.15 a.m.

Emergency Parade. 1.30 p.m.

The sick will parade under a N.C.O. from each Wing who will have sick reports prepared & hand same to M.O.

(21) NOTE-BOOKS. All students are to keep fair-copy note-books written up by Friday evenings of each week. These may be inspected at any time (Note Books may be purchased at the Canteen.)

(22) LEAVE.

- (a) Each student Officer may only have 2 week-end Leave Passes to AMIENS per course.
- (b) Other ranks maximum leave at week-ends to AMIENS will be 10% Staff, 25% Students.
- (c) Leave to visit ALBERT may be granted generally after Parades & on Sundays at the discretion of Wing Commanders. For other ranks, passes are necessary.
- (d) Applications for week-end leave forward beyond BAPAUME & for AMIENS & back areas must be made to Wing Commanders who will fill in & initial passes, if leave approved, for the Commandant's signature. No pass is valid without the School stamp. Applications must not be forwarded to the Adjutant, direct. Passes for ALBERT may be signed by the Wing Commanders.
- (e) Wing Commanders will use their own discretion in allotting leave to Officers, N.C.O's & men.
- (f) N.C.O's (below the rank of Sergeant) & men will be inspected by the Orderly Officer, immediately before departure & a note inserted to this effect in his report. All ranks before going on Leave must be properly dressed as laid down in School Standing Order No. 15.
- (g) In the case of AMIENS, leave cannot be granted to N.C.O's & men later than 8.p.m.
- (h) Passes filled in & initialled by Wing Commanders must be handed in to the Adjutant not later than 6.p.m. each Friday. Late applications will not be entertained.
- (i) Leave pass forms can be obtained on application at the Orderly Room.
- (j) Wing Commanders will keep a strict record of all Leave granted.
- (k) Any abuse of this privilege of week-end leave, will result in a curtailment. All ranks proceeding on leave will be warned to this effect.
- (l) Leave to GREAT BRITAIN and IRELAND for members of the School Staff, will be granted as per allotment by Corps H.Q. & in the rotation shown on the School Lists.
- (m) All passes other than under sub-para(c) will be usually signed by the Asst. Commandant, & in his absence by the Adjt.
- (n) On return from Leave, all passes must be handed to Orderly Officers for return to Issuing Officer.

(23) INTELLIGENCE. All information concerning Corps & Divisional Intelligence Corps R.O's, A.I.F. Orders, Maps of Western Front, etc., can be seen at any time at the Intelligence School Hut, at the convenience of the Chief Instructor of the Intelligence School.

(24) BATHS. Hot & cold water shower baths have been erected & weekly allotment made as per special Circular. Under-clothing may be changed as supplies become available.

(25) AUDIT OF ACCOUNTS. The following boards of auditors are constituted:-

- (1) Permanent Board of 2 Officer Instructors responsible for
 - (a) the continuous audit of the A/C's of
 - (i) The Canteen.
 - (ii) Permanent Staff Messes.
 - (iii) Tailor, Hairdresser, & Watchmaker's Establishments.
- (2) The above board, plus 2 students Officers (1 from Inf. & 1 from Technical (Signal School) appointed at beginning of each Infantry Course, responsible for the
 - (i) Course audit of all A/C's of student Officer & N.C.O. Messes.

The permanent Board is responsible for submitting a combined "Monthly report of Schools Audit" to the Asst Cmmdt. by the last day of each Infantry Course. The Boards of Audit shall have access to the books of all Messes & Canteen at all times.

- (26) TRADESLEN. The Armourer, Shoemaker, Hairdresser, Tailor, & Watchmaker are placed under the Administration of the Quartermaster.

- (27) HAIRDRESSING & SHAVING ESTABLISHMENT.
- (1) The Staff shall consist of 1 Barber & 1 Assistant who are responsible for the cleanliness & upkeep of the Saloon & all appliances; also for the washing of Towels, etc.
 - (2) A Day book will be kept, showing the gross takings under separate headings.
 - (3) Accounts will be audited monthly (para 25 (1) (a) (iii))
 - (4) Hours:-

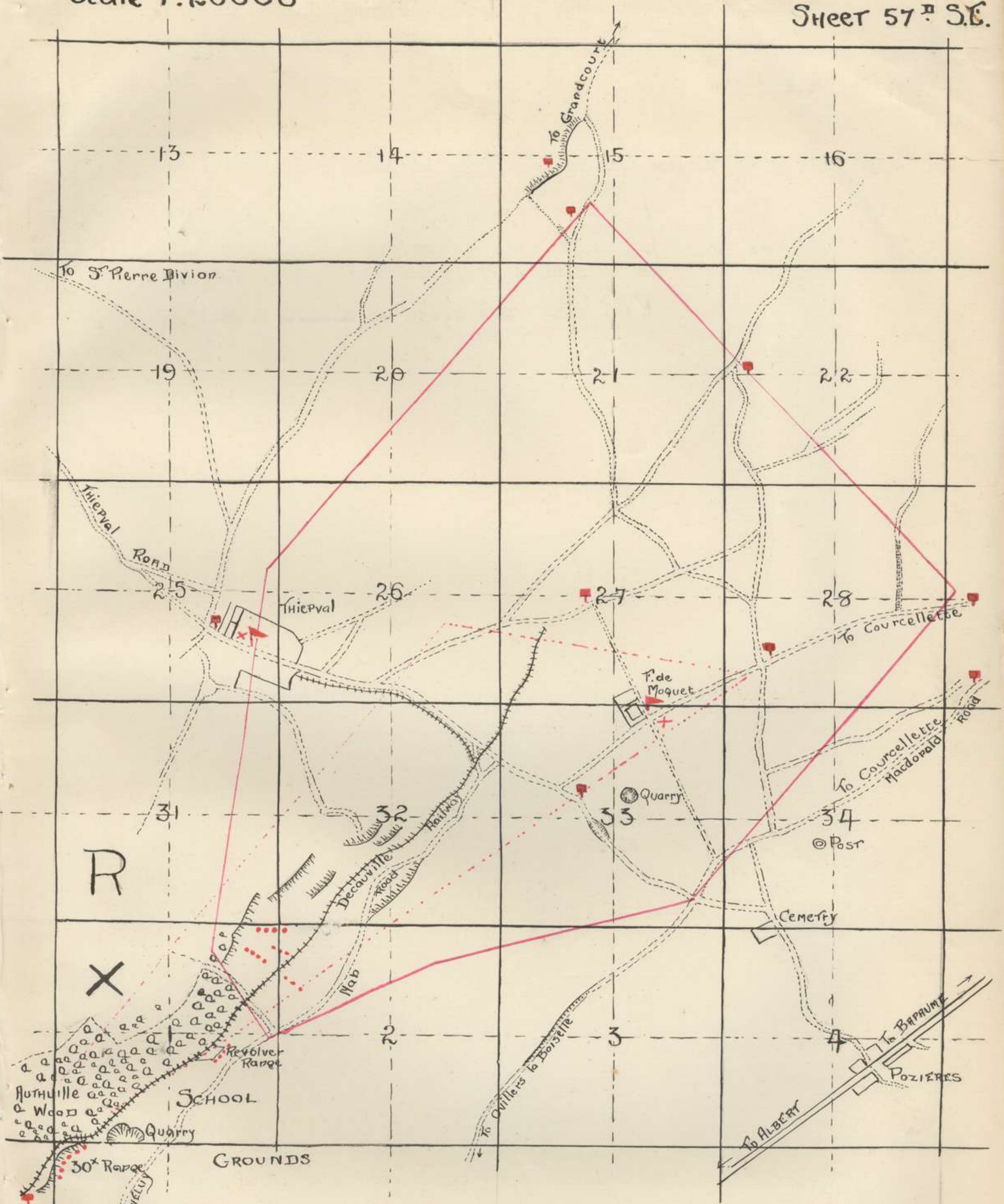

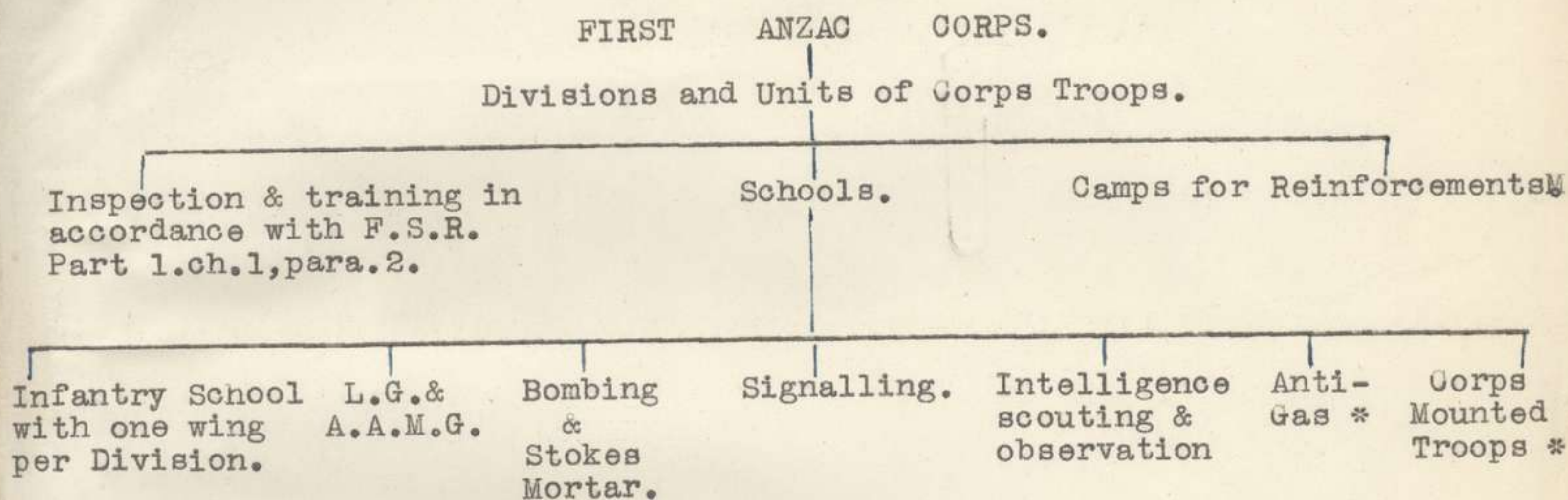

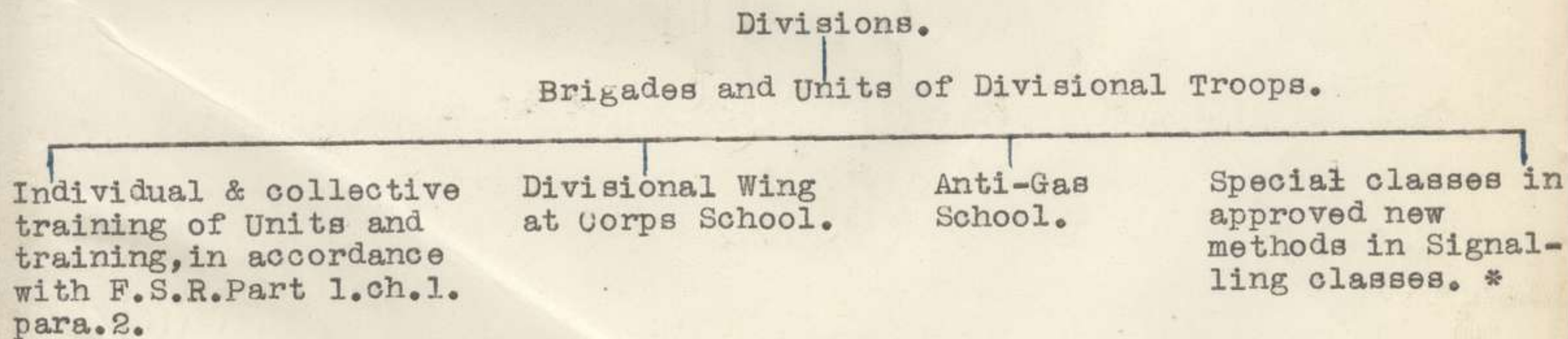

- (i) First Anzac Corps Bombing & Stokes Mortar School.
- (ii) Lewis Gun & anti-aircraft machine gun defence school.
- (iii) Intelligence, scouting and observation school.
- (iv) Signalling School.

The establishment of each of the above Schools is given in App. II. The personnel will be found from A.I.F. resources & will be seconded or transferred from their units.

3. The present divisional infantry schools will be closed, and the whole of the instructional personnel and material will be transferred temporarily to the new corps school.

Personnel not required by the corps school Commandant to complete new establishment will be returned to their units the corps school commandant making the necessary communications direct to Divisional Commanders.

4. This cancels A.I.F. Orders 360 of 11-11-16, 473 of 24-1-17 and 572 of 13-4-17.
