FRANCE ROUGE DE BOUT	1916 MAY 19	2000	<p>At 2000 the enemy suddenly opened up a heavy shell attack on our billets in the vicinity of ROUGE DE BOUT - at that hour several working parties from our Battalion were marching along road between ROUGE DE BOUT &amp; TWO TREE farm, several shells exploded quite close to HQ &amp; INTELLIGENCE BILLET - also BOMBERS BILLET - all within a few hundred yards of ROUGE DE BOUT Two officers viz. Capt Charles Joseph BATES and Lieut Harold Baxter SHAW. also 3570<sup>B</sup> Priv T. C. O'MALLEY - were killed &amp; 7 other ranks wounded. All ranks at once vacated billets &amp; took cover in dug out &amp; slit. Shelling ceased at 2100 but @ 2300 a second bombardment commenced but was of short duration - During the 1<sup>st</sup> shelling MR MINAGALLI - horse which he had ridden up to ROUGE DE BOUT - was killed by shell fire - the QM. having a very lucky escape. During the first bombardment - when seven men were wounded on the road No 1583 Sgt INWOOD &amp; 168 Cpl HAMILTON - at great personal risk ran to the assistance of the wounded men &amp; carried them to shelter - their brave action no doubt saved the lives of the wounded men -</p>	
	20		<p>At about 1815 a sharp heavy shelling in the vicinity of Weathercock house but no damage done to any of our billets - altho some fell very close to billets occupied by C. Coy near STONY LANE</p>	
	24		<p>During the morning a number of heavy shells fell along road RUEO-BIACHE - between ROUGE DE BOUT &amp; MARE'S NEST - (ie 3 Bgn HQ) doing considerable damage to road -</p>

BOUGE DE BOUT	1916 MAY 30	2030	<p>At about 2030 enemy commenced a heavy bombardment, our Artillery responding most vigorously replying - by 2100 the noise was terrific at we were ordered by Bgd H Q to stand to - at 9.45 (2145) we were ordered to proceed to our Alarm post which we did - C Coy proceeded to C assembly trenches - A. D. H Q + LEWIS MG - BOMBERS + INTELLIGENCE proceeded to and occupied J assembly trenches whilst B Coy manned CHARRIED + WINDY POST - being in position by 2245 at 2315 Recd message from Bgd to resume normal conditions leaving one Coy (I detailed D Coy) - as Intlying quiet - Having advised OC. 9<sup>th</sup> B<sup>n</sup> that D Coy was occupying J trenches I ordered return of B<sup>n</sup> to billets + shortly after 0100 we were settled down again - It was a very dark night cold + the roads were very sloppy - The enemy's shell fire broke our phone line to Bgd H.Q. + we consequently had to keep in touch by messengers. - A raid by Germans was made that night on 11<sup>th</sup> Path -</p>
