

Relief carried out without incident. Strong patrols sent out but failed to locate enemy. Ground very boggy. Casualties - 4 O.R's Killed, 11 O.R's Wounded. Capt. L Lenay evacuated owing to eyes being affected by Mustard Gas.	
ONNEBEKE .23a 29.)	2/11/		At 1220 a.m. Post in DECOY WOOD blown in. 2/Lt. W IRVING & 4 O.R's killed, 5 O.R's wounded. Post re-established immediately. Weather - Slight drizzlingh rain & cold. Our Transport was heavily shelled near ZONNEBEKE but finished their job. 5 O.R's wounded, 2 horses killed & 3 wounded. The 9th & 12th Battalions took over our Front Line supports. Relief carried out without incident. Casualties for 24 hours - 5 6 killed 10 wounded.

From one to two francs a day per room is suggested as a suitable bases for settlement, in addition to whatever is due for fuel or light provided by the inhabitant.

Expenses under this head cannot be borne by the public,

and must not be included in a Billeting Certificate.
Officers Commanding Units will satisfy themselves.

Officers Commanding Units will satisfy themselves, prio r to departure from a locality, that the amounts due to the inhabitants for messes have been discharged from private funds.

Cases still occur in which premises are occupied as messes without any agreement being made with the owner, and without payment being made before leaving.

Commanding Officers will be held personally responsible that all expenses incurred with the Owners of houses which are so occupied are settled before their Units leave."

In future Company Commanders will render a certificate to Bn. Hqrs. that the above order has been complied with before leaving Billeting Areas.

DISCIPLINE. (5). Extract from Brigade R. O. dated 26/11/1917.
