

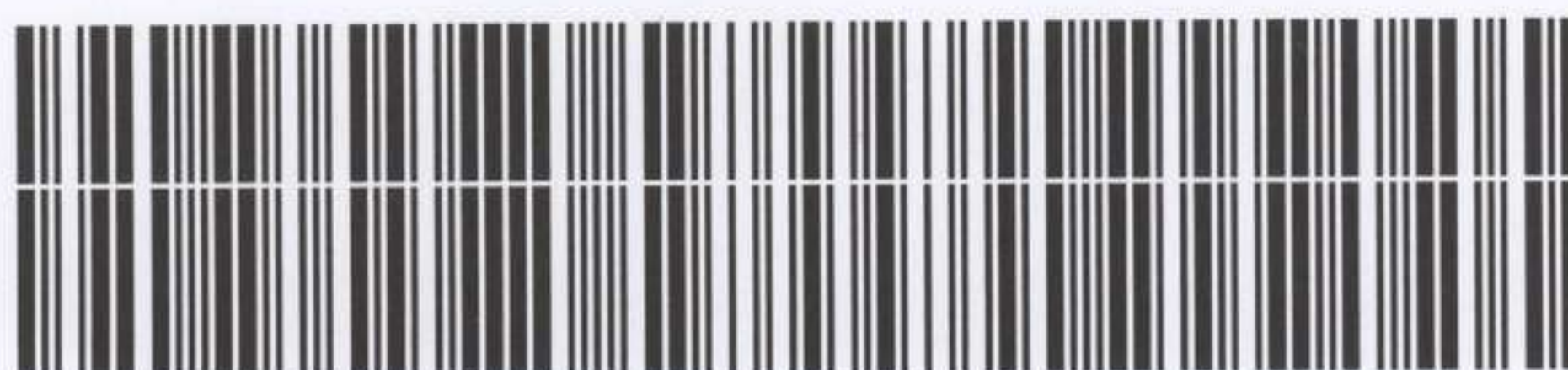

54 Victoria Street, London.	7th Dec. 1918, to 7th Jan. 1919.		<p>During this period the Department of Repatriation & Demobilisation was in process of being constituted, and only the senior appointments had been made. A short history of this period compiled by Lieut. Daunt, of Branch 3.D, is attached. The date of the first General Instructions was the 9th December, 1918; this specifically defines the objects, the powers, and the functions of the Department.</p> <p>G.I's No.2 set forth the organization of the Department, and from January 7th the Department began to take on a more concrete form, and sub-appointments to the various Branches and Sections were made from day to day as suitable officers became available. Drawing Roster for Departmental Orderly Officer and Orderly to be supplied by Branches (excluding 2.D, who are in separate building, at 20 Belgrave Square, that Branch having to supply its own Orderly Officer and Orderly). Attending on Major Plant, D.S.O., of Branch 2.D, and advising him in the matter of producing sworn documentary evidence before a Court of Enquiry, and Major Hyman stated same was not necessary; advising Major Plant to compile a written statement, which was quite sufficient, as there was no properly constituted person before whom such a document could be sworn in London. Ascertaining the progress of Reports by all Units in the Australian Corps with reference to men guaranteed employment as requested by G.I. No. 3, Para 17, and advising Director of Branch 3.D that such a return could and would be approximate only. 3rd Australian Division reported that Two Finns and One Dutchman required repatriation to their won countries in that Division, and the Director agreed that every effort should be made to meet these men in that behalf. These names were furnished in addition to those required, with special reference to Swedes and Scandinavians referred to in G.I. 9 Para 41. Finalizing Summary of Decisions and Rulings for the week ending 9th inst. And the Director ruled that in future if Branches failed to furnish their Report by 10 a.m. on the Saturday and Wednesday respectively, the Branches would be treated as furnishing a "Nil Return"; any late Returns could be then included in the following week's Summary. The matter of a Permanent Departmental Orderly Officer is still outstanding, the difficulty being to obtain the services of an Officer, as the duties are entirely "night duties." Receipt of semi-official correspondence re Fire Precautions from Major Withall, D.O.R.E., London District, which does not set out the position of the matter as agreed between Major Hyman and Major Withall. Letter to D.O.R.E. asking that the Department may be addressed officially on the matter, and asking for a specific reply to the questions raised. Perusing voluminous correspondence handed to me by the Director, with reference to the original formation of this Department prior to the Armistice on 11.11.18, these documents covered the period August 1918 to November 1918, and include original correspondence and copies passing between War Office, Commonwealth Prime Minister, Mr Hughes, General Birdwood,	Annexure 8.

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February 10th 1919

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 On reporting for duty with the Department on 6th ^{December 1918} ~~January~~, the only rooms occupied at 54 Victoria Street were as follows:- On the ground floor, General Monash, General Foott, Major Sherrington, Capt. Simonson, on the 1st floor, Lieut. Col. Durrant, and on the 4th floor, General Coxon, Colonel Leane, ^{Major Speckman} and Lieut. F.K. Murphey.

The Transport Section ^{ICH} who had been taken over on the formation of the Department were still located in their old quarters at Horseferry Road. The clerical staff consisted of Warrant Officer Neal, who was brought from France by General Foott, two Stenographers, and a small section of the Central Registry from A.I.F. Headquarters. The problem at this time, was the getting together of Officers and staff to carry out the various matters with which the Department was to deal, and the initial work in connection with the framing of a policy for the repatriation of the members of the A.I.F.

The first step in the matter of collecting information, was the issue to all units of A.I.F., Demobilisation Form 534. This form was drawn up to assist the Repatriation Department both in Australia & England, the educational portion of course, being held on this side for the use of the Educational Department. These forms were issued to units on 11th December in accordance with strength; later further supplies were despatched to those units who reported not having received their supplies. The reason for the non-delivery was afterwards found to be that the transport at Havre was insufficient to cope with the large amount of material to be carried forward to the troops in the forward area, the rule being that only rations and important material were to be sent forward until such time as the traffic increased.

In order to check any mis-leading questions on the form, and to ascertain any difficulties which might arise in its compilation, an Officer was selected and stationed in the furlough section A.I.F. Headquarters for the purpose of completing the form in the case of men coming from France. Minor difficulties were encountered, and a Circular Memo was issued ^{to units} to clear up any misunderstanding which might arise on account of them. The completed forms began to arrive at the Department about 20 - 23 December, and a staff was formed under Capt. Terrant to sort them out, the educational portion being detached and sent to Educational Department.

On the 9th December, General Instruction 1. was issued. This instruction set out the various matters with which the Department was to deal.

At this time the Department was inundated with enquiries from all sources regarding demobilisation, and from these, an idea of the many questions which would have to be allowed for when framing instructions was obtained. Many of these applications were sent to the Prime Minister both from soldiers and from men who had been discharged in this country. These were also passed to this Department for attention and it was necessary to establish a section temporarily to sort and answer all enquiries. This section later formed part of Branch "1" D. dealing with discharge in other countries than Australia, and early repatriation to Australia. As the policy of the Department was laid down and issued in General Instructions, the Commanding Officer of a unit was able to answer many of the questions which had been previously submitted to this Department. In consequence of this, the number of applications to the Department gradually diminished.

As the general instructions were issued, and the work of the Department was defined, it became necessary for a clerical staff to be obtained for work in the different sections. This was done gradually by applications being called for in France, and suitable applicants being brought to this country for duty. In selecting staff in the beginning, it was necessary owing to the urgent need of staff, to take men who could only remain for a short period, as they desired to return to their civil employment in Australia as soon as possible. As the

Department grew however, only those men who were prepared to remain with the Department until the work of demobilisation was complete, were selected.

The Department was sub-divided into H.O. and Branches, these were each given the cypher, the Headquarters comprising the Director General, and Deputy Director General, and their staffs being cyphered "D". Branches were cyphered "1.D." to "5.D." respectively. Branch "1.D." was allotted work in connection with the non-military employment of personnel. This Branch also dealt with the applications for discharge in a country other than Australia, and early or late repatriation to Australia. Branch "2.D." was allotted the work of transport of troops both by rail and sea. Branch "3.D." administration, Branch "4.D." Ordnance & Equipment, Branch "5.D." Finance.

As the Department extended, the work of the Administrative Branch increased, and the selection of an experienced Officer to supervise the work of the Branch, became necessary. Pending the arrival of this Officer the Branch was supervised by Major Sherrington, who previously had been in charge of a small repatriation section at A.I.F. Headquarters. The work of the Branch at this time, comprised mainly the compilation and issue of General Instructions, and the obtaining of staff for the whole Department. In connection with the issue of General Instructions, it was found that the length of time taken in the printing was too great, and the Contract-section was therefore asked to arrange with the Printers for a rate per page to be charged, the same firm to print all general instructions. This was done, and it enabled a proof copy to be obtained very quickly and thus expedite the issue to units. On the 20th December Lieut. Colonel Ridley reported and took up duties as Director of the Branch. During Christmas, owing to the pressure of work, most of the Officers remained on duty, except on Christmas Day, when one Officer remained on duty to attend to any urgent matters which might occur.

Towards the end of December, the Directors of the different Branches had arrived, and the work of the Department was gradually straightened out. The Administrative Branch was sub-divided into sections to deal with the many matters delegated to it.

Reference Fire Precautions.

Colonel Commelin, the President of the Central Fire Committee London District, made his half-yearly inspection at these Headquarters on the 5th inst and whilst with him I mentioned the fact that you were in occupation of 54 Victoria Street, 32 Grosvenor Place, 20 Belgrave Square, 6 Eaton Place, and asked whether he would like to inspect the same.

He stated in reply that where premises occupied by us were private residences and no large congregation of Staff working en masse, he would not inspect, but leave it to the Officer in Charge of each Building to use ordinary precautions. In his opinion Fire Buckets would be all that was needed (2 on each landing) and that if I would indent for same he would certify for their free issue from Ordnance.

This I have done and expect the supply at any moment when I will send the buckets round to the respective premises. The keeping of the buckets full of water and the necessary issue of General Instructions for behaviour and action of staff in case of Fire must be left to the Officers concerned, as they will somewhat necessarily vary to meet the requirements of each particular building.

The condensed form of Fire Alarm Instructions which I attach were duly read by the President, and he expressed himself as satisfied with them.

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1. In Case of Fire.

The alarm will be given by whistle (alternative short and long blasts) by Senior Warrant or Non-Commissioned Officer, who will then notify switch-board by telephone.

Lady Clerks.

2. All lady clerks will leave the Building at once after placing chairs on table.

Appliances. 3. All available appliances are to be used for extinguishing the fire, windows are to be closed to prevent the draughts assisting the conflagration.

Removals. 4. Typewriters and important documents are to be removed from danger zone.

5. Immediately the alarm is given, clerks will stand up, place their chairs on the tables and turn in the direction of the exit allocated to them. They will then file out as quickly as possible without noise.

6. Soldiers not detailed for duty will stand fast near centre of room, until instructions are received from O.C.

7. Telephone orderlies are to stand by all telephones if possible, until instructed otherwise.

8. The O.C. Section will immediately determine whether the services of the London County Council Fire Brigade are necessary and if so will despatch a runner to nearest Fire Station, to call them to the scene. This man should return with the Engine.

9. The person nominated in each Section, or Group where so arranged, will detail necessary men for the following duties:

(a) Men for the stairway and exits they are to use who will regulate the traffic, prevent overcrowding and unauthorised persons from using same, and particularly stop people coming upstairs until the whole of the Staff are clear of the building. Care will be taken that a man is posted to prevent staff running into unused wings or blind passages.

(b) Any other available men to assist where necessary and especially to warn adjoining Sections or Departments.

The whole staff will carry out their instructions quickly and quietly. Disorder and noise is to be suppressed immediately by those in authority.

Reference your's 10.2.19 relative to Fire Precautions. Our conversation was on the lines as stated by you. However, on the President of the Central Fire Committee making his inspection at these Headquarters, I asked if he would inspect 54 Victoria Street, 32 Grosvenor Place, 20 Belgrave Square, and 6 Eaton Place.

He stated in reply that where premises occupied by us were private residences and no large congregation of staff working en masse, he would not inspect, but leave it to the Officers in charge of each Building to use ordinary precautions. He stated that he was of opinion that fire buckets were all that was needed(two to each landing) and that if I would indent for same he would certify for their free issue from Ordnance.

This I have done and expect the supply at any moment, when I will send the buckets round to the respective premises and place in position. The keeping of these buckets full of water and the necessary issue of General Instructions for behaviour and action of staff in case of Fire must be left to the Officers concerned, as they will somewhat necessarily vary to meet the requirements of each particular Building.

The condensed form of Fire Alarm Instructions which I sent you was read over by the President and he considers them quite satisfactory.
