

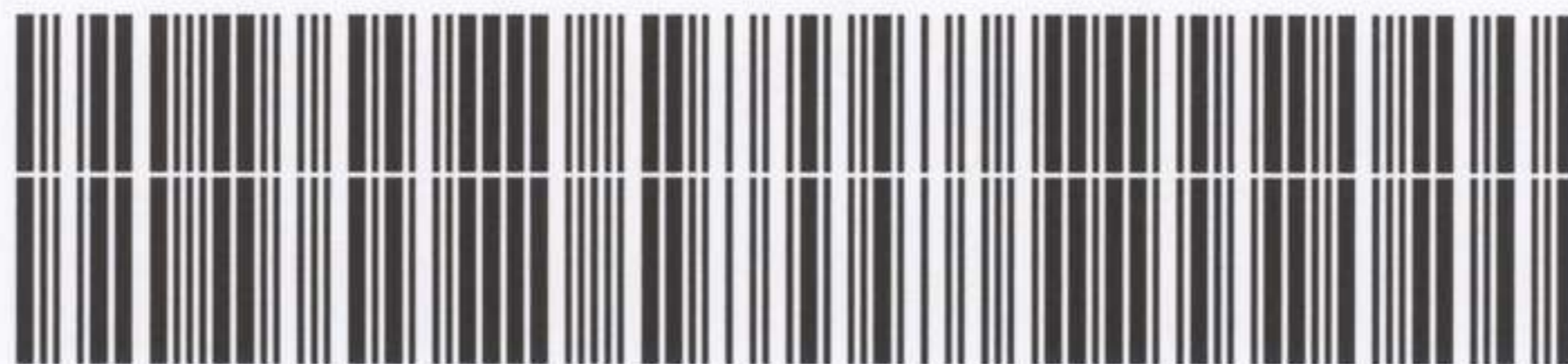

54, Victoria Street, London, S.W.	1st to 30th April, 1919.		<p>The question of personnel on Non-Military Employment was discussed with Major N.B.Ryan, Liaison Officer, Repatriation Department, Melbourne.</p> <p>A Conference was held with Major Ryan and the Chief Paymaster with reference to A.I.F. personnel proceeding to America for experience in irrigation Works, and to Denmark for experience in Dairying. A cable was sent to Mr. Braddon, Australian Representative in New York, re. the former project, and arrangements made to interview the Danish Minister in London regarding the Dairying experience in Denmark.</p> <p>An interview was subsequently granted by the Danish Minister, who expressed himself as favourable to the proposal, and the matter has been referred to the Danish Government with a view to ascertaining its attitude on the subject, the numbers that can be taken for experience, cost involved, etc., etc.</p> <p>Major-General the Hon. Sir. J.W. McCay and the Director, Branch 1.D., visited Sub-Branch 1.D.1., and discussed the rendering of returns connected with Non-Military Employment.</p> <p>Arrangements were made for a Representative of Sub-Branch 1.D.3., to visit A.I.F. Depots in U.K., with reference to personnel concentrated there for Industrial Non-Military Employment.</p> <p>A Conference was held on 16th April, 1919, at which Major-General the Hon. Sir J.W. McCay, Brigadier-General McGlenn, the Director, Branch 1.D., and Representatives of Sub-Branches 1.D.1., 1.D.2., and 1.D.3., were present. Various matters in connection with Non-Military Employment were discussed.</p> <p>Area Officers have now been appointed in connection with the N.M.E. Scheme, and, up to date, 9 have gone out to their respective provincial Areas, and 3 taken up duty in the London Area.</p>

Applications:- New applications received - 165. This is an increase of 17 over corresponding period report No.8. Applications from Director-General - 209. This is a decrease of 10.

Rolls of Approved Applicants:- Rolls 71-73 inclusive have been issued. Total approved applicants - 111. This is a decrease of 22 over corresponding period report No.8.

Rolls of applicants Not approved:- Rolls 18 and 19 have been issued. Total 60 not approved applicants. This is a decrease of 27 over corresponding period report No.8.

The increase of correspondence of all kinds has been most noticeable during the period under review. Formerly, the bulk of the work consisted of applications with small amount of correspondence; it now consists of large correspondence with very few applications.

Changes of location in the interval between submission and promulgation of approval of applications continue to cause difficulties. Many applications are being received from members of quotas, both written and personal. Numerous cases have arisen in which men have reported here, stating that they are members of a quota and have submitted applications through O.C. Quota, per Headquarters A.I.F. Depots in U.K. Enquiry elicits that no such applications have been received. It would appear that Headquarters A.I.F. Depots in U.K. consider that these men are on a quota, Early Repatriation is unnecessary.

SUB-BRANCH I.D.I.b. DISCHARGES.

A summarised statement of the work done by this sub-branch during the period under review is attached (Annexure "A") also a statement showing the number of files held by this sub-branch pending the receipt of supporting evidence. This latter shows little decrease of the last return submitted. Many of these files however are new ones.

It must be noted that Tidworth are forwarding A.I.F. Form 535 which has been recommended by the O.C. of the applicants depot and not recommended by the G.O.C. A.I.F. Depots in U.K. These applications are being proceeded with except where applications is not recommended "because the applicant's services cannot be spared".

It is again pointed out that Headquarters, Tidworth are submitting a second application for men whose applications have been "not approved". It is requested that Tidworth be communicated with reference this letter, as it leads to much confusion besides being totally unnecessary.

All that is required when men want their applications reconsidered is, that the Officer Commanding Depots, forwards a memorandum requesting that such applications be reconsidered, attaching thereto further evidence in support of the case.

Rolls of Approved Applicants:- Rolls 74 - 76 inclusive have been issued. Total approved applicants 152. This is an increase of 41 over corresponding period Report No.9.

Rolls of Applicants Not Approved:- Roll No.20 has been issued. Total 68 Not approved applicants. This is an increase of 8 over corresponding period Report No.9.

General:- An idea appears to exist in France that if personnel are included on a Quota, there is no need to complete applications for Early Repatriation. This, of course, is not so as it may be months before one of the quotas in this country leave for Australia. This applies particularly to personnel demanded by Defence Department for Family or other reasons. May this be pointed out to Divisions or other Formations, please.

SUB-BRANCH I.D.I.b. DISCHARGES.

A summarised statements of the work done by this sub-branch during the period abovementioned is attached (Annexure "A")

This shews 396 applications for discharge as having passed through the hands of this section during the period, of which, 80 are new applications.

It has been remarked that men whose applications have been returned as "not approved" by the Director-General are in practically in all cases asking that their applications should be re-considered. In submitting further evidence for re-consideration they advance practically the same reasons as those contained in their first applications. It is recommended that Tidworth - from whom nearly all these applications for consideration come - should be advised that a much stronger case must be forwarded the second time in order that application may be finally approved.

It is suggested that as 4a Records cannot discharge a man immediately after his application has been approved, for the reason that, there are many others awaiting their turn for same according to 4 a's Discharge Precedence Roll, that in all cases these men should be returned to a Depot to wait until such time as their turn arrives, even though they come from France. This of course need not apply particularly urgent cases.

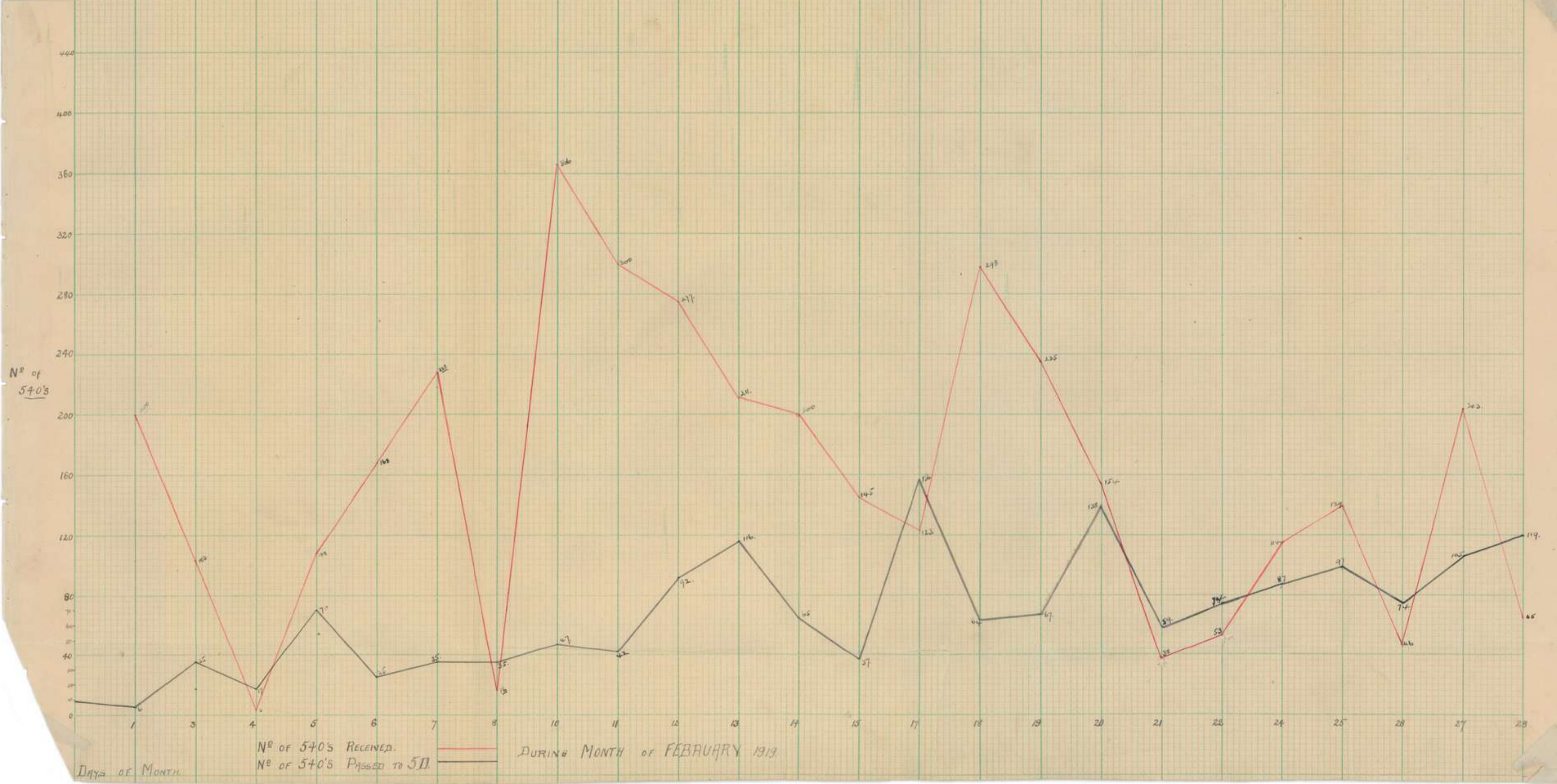

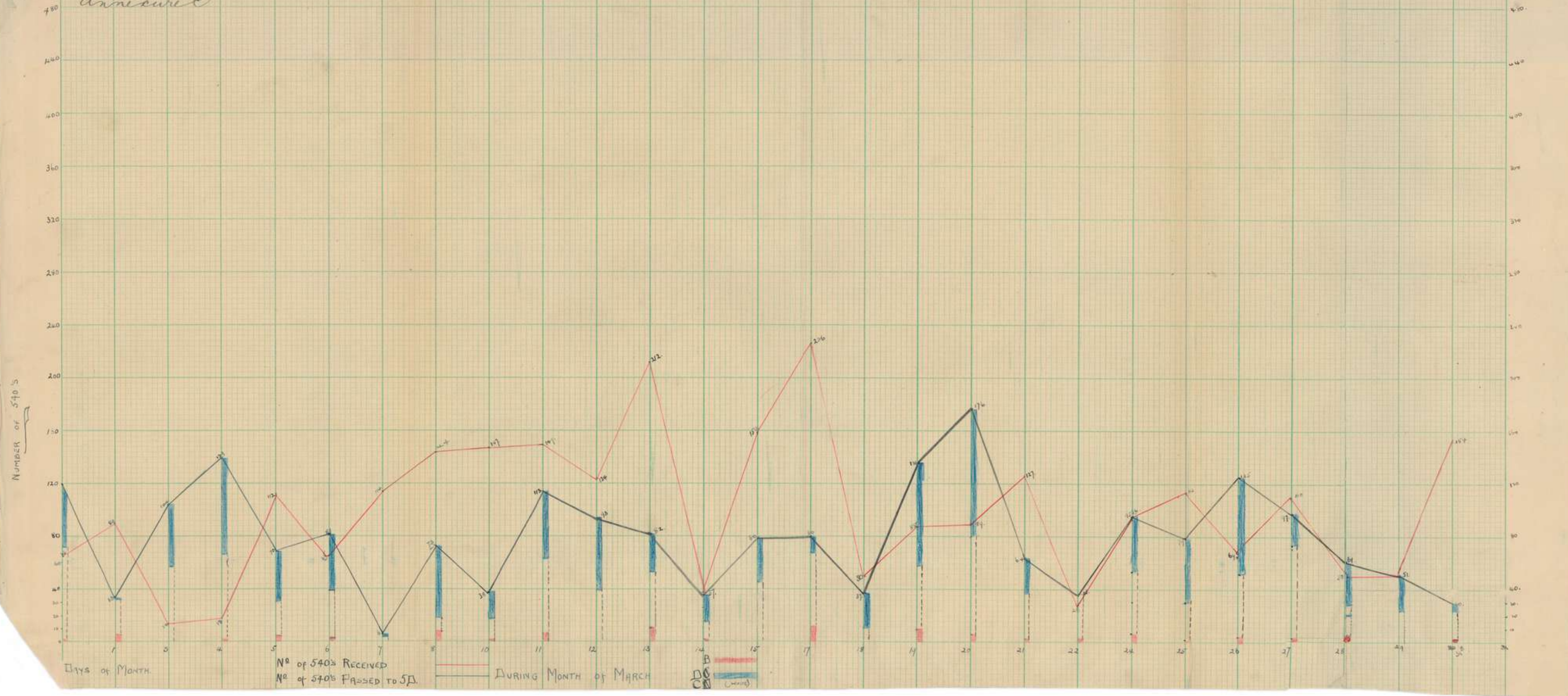

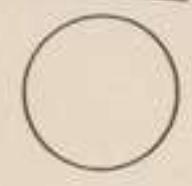

During the month under review, however, acting with the help, and through the Railway Executive Committee, it has been possible to recommend 72 men with different Railway Companies in England under the direction of the Executive Committee. This is perfectly reasonable, and is in accordance with Australian practice. Therefore all applications of this nature are being submitted "for experience in Loco. Running Sheds", where, it is hoped, useful knowledge may be gained.</p> <p>To some extent the above remarks apply to applications for Electric Train Driving experience. A few men only will be taken by the Electric Surface Railways for this purpose, and only then without guaranteeing that the men will get any practice in driving. In these cases, the employing Companies will place the men in their running sheds where a smart man can get a good knowledge of the types of power Units etc. It is not likely however, that more than about 20% of the applications for Electrical Train Driving will be placed.</p> <p><u>General:-</u> A large number of 540's are still held as the class of employment applied for is very hard to obtain. In these cases Units are being advised to inform men of the positions of their 540's, and to ascertain if men are desirous of taking up other work.</p> <p>The work done by this section has been very satisfactory.</p> <p><u>1.D.3.F. INDUSTRIAL.</u> During the present month negotiations have been carried out with 21 societies and Trade Unions, which govern the trades entered by our men on non-military employment, and in all cases where industrial conditions would permit the Trade Unions promised to give every possible assistance, but owing, however, to the growth of unemployment in England the question of finding openings for skilled men, especially in the Engineering trades is becoming more difficult, e.g., the Amalgamated Society of Engineers have advised that they have at present 7000 of their members unemployed; the bulk of these being in Scotland area, although other districts are to a less degree, as bad, and it is in these districts that our efforts are restricted.</p>

This having occurred in the Carpentry and Joinery trade at Vickers Limited, Barrow-in-Furness; a man having started work whilst the dispute existed, and the matter was investigated and it was at once decided that the man should be withdrawn, but the Company objected, but it was decided to abide by our agreement with the Trade Unions and the man was withdrawn.</p> <p>A complaint was also received from the Blacksmiths and Ironworkers Union at Glasgow complaining that as they had men unemployed in that city no further men should be placed in these trades in that district, and a reply was immediately sent, promising them, that we would respect their wishes.</p> <p>As the result of negotiations with the Bricklayers Union at Barrow-in-Furness openings were found for a limited number of skilled Bricklayers, pay being at the rate of 1/7 per hour for 46 hours per week.</p> <p>The Painters &amp; Decorators Union (London Branch) advised that they could place a large number of skilled men at once.</p> <p>The Pottery Moulders Union also offered assistance in placing men in their trade. The Unions governing the Shipbuilding trades still provides openings for skilled men, and at present we have more applications from firms than can be supplied.</p> <p>The position as far as Industrial Disputes are concerned remain satisfactory, and there does not appear any reason for concern in that direction. The only difficulty that now has to be contended with is the increasing unemployment in the United Kingdom.</p>
