

			Spicer Goggles. All troops should be in possession of these appliances but many men handed	4-1
			in their goggles at the time the P.H.G. Helmets were called in at Bac St Maur last year.	
			During this month the Corps Armourers Whrkshop was organised and an officer appointed	
			to superintend the repairs of all Units in the Corps. The opening of this Shop necessitated	
			the closing down of the Divisional Armourers Shop which was much regretted as the men forming	g
			it had done much excellent work and their services had been recognised as having been of	
			an extremely high and efficient character by the A.D.O.S. 1st. Anzac. The efficiency was	
			so high that the Shop was allowed to work on for some time on its own as a part of the	
			Corps Workshop, but it was felt that the necessity had arisen for all the men to be under	
			one roof. This necessitated the disbandment of the Shop and the return to of the armourers	
			to their Units.
