- MAY 1918

Entry No. 1. d/1/5/18. - Division engaged in operations, the 1st. A.L.H. Brigade and 2nd. A.L.H. Brigade in the Hills around EL SALT, the N.Z.M.R. Brigade on the Plain around SHUNIT NIMRIN, Divisional Headquarters at UMM ES SHURT. The spare parts received from Descorps Armourers Shop, also 2 improvised carriers for Thomas' Splint for experiment. A.Q.M.S. King arrived from JERUSALEM: owing to uncertainty of course of operations it was not possible to set up the Armourers Shop, A.Q.M.S. King therefore remained with the Divisional Train to move to SHUNIT NIMRIN in event of operations being successful. Repaired Binoculars and other optical instruments sent to LUDD from JAFFA. These can now be repaired at JERUSALEM where there is a P.E. Establishment. C.O.O., LUDD, advises supply of 1800 Headropes, 200 prs size 5 H. Shoes, 15 Limber Perches, 8 No. 7. Draught Poles.

Entry No. 2. d/2/5/18. - Stores advised from LUDD (Truck 6379) A.M. 568/5/18. D.A.D.O.S. A. & N.Z. MTD DIVN. CAPT.

Entry No. 3. d/3/5/18. - 6th. Mounted Brigade requires 6 Very Pistols and 600 D.I. Cartridges. These were not available and being of great importance both as Trench Stores and also for Mounted work generally, it would seem advisable that a small reserve of Pistols should be maintained at some point nearer than KANTARA. Stores advised from KANTARA (Truck 423). 18th Brigade R.H.A. (Inverness Bty) requires Splinter Bar: this was drawn and issued to Unit from Descorps W/Shops. CAPT.

Entry No. 4. d/4/5/18. - Ayrshire Battery hastening Nets Screening Guns, Telephones, D.11. Cable and Brake Blocks. All hastened and Cable and Telephones issued. CAPT.

Entry No. 5. d/5/5/18. - Division returns to original Camp Site. Dubbing and Boots hastened by 2nd. A.L.H. Brigade. A.Q.M.S. King establishes Armourers Shop at JERICHO. It was intended that this should serve as a complement to Descorps Armourers Shop with the difference that while the latter is stationary and intended to assist the whole Corps, the Divisional Armourer will be mobile. The Corps Armourers Shop would replace guns not fit for service, but all repairs, minor in themselves, yet beyond the powers of the Regimental Armourers to deal with, would be effected by the Divisional Armourer, who being in possession of Tools and a shop was not only fitted to deal with the question, but being sufficiently mobile could be moved with the Division, and established at any central point not far in rear of the fighting troops. In the present operations it was intended that the shop should be established first at SHUNIT NIMRIN, and in the event of the operations being successful, it would be moved up to EL SALT on any point fixed on as suitable for Headquarters of the Transport. Meanwhile it was decided in view of the reports from the 6th. L.H. Regt., and complaints that the Hotchkiss Guns of the Regiment were unserviceable, that all Guns of the Division should be overhauled at the Armourers Shop by A.Q.M.S. King and the Regimental Armourers. Four Guns were therefore brought in by the 5th. and 7th. L.H. Regts., and 1 from the 1st. L.H. Regt., and overhauled. Two were definitely replaced from Descorps Armourers Shop, the remainder were repaired, cleaned and put into thorough working order. Another point in this connection that led to the desire for an intermediate Armourers Shop was the serious shortage on Indent, of spare parts, especially filled spare parts for Hotchkiss Guns: it was felt that much greater economy could be effected, if the whole question of Machine Gun Indents and repairs was passed through a qualified Armourer, not Regimentally attached. All Indents were therefore passed through the Shop, checked and registered by the Armourer, and also all spare parts drawn and issued by himself personally, and not left to each Regt. to deal "on its own". Very often more harm is done by Regimental "tinkering", outstanding Indents were therefore to be cancelled and re-demanded in one Bulk demand. It was unfortunate that after a weeks experience A.Q.M.S. King had to be evacuated sick.

In regard to the complaint from the 6th. L.H. Regt. made on the day that the Brigade moved that 4 Guns were being left behind owing to their being unserviceable, it was pointed out that of the 4, 2 were replaced from Descorps Armourers Shop, the day after the Brigade moved across the River, and 2 were repaired by the Armourers. It was also pointed out that the Regimental Armourer was away from the Regt. and it was only natural to expect the guns to suffer.

- Entry No. 5. d/5/5/18. (continued). - Stores advised from LUDD (Trucks 9660 and 423). Descorps advise that 8 Lorries available to bring stores to JERICHO, wired Dump (All consolidated stores possible, principally Ropes Head, Picketing, and S/Mule". *J.A. Thibault* CAPT. D. A. D. O. S. A. & N. Z. MTD DIVN.
- Entry No. 6. d/6/5/18. - N.Z.M.R. Brigade apply for issue of Turkish Machine Gun Belt Boxes : application refused by G.H.Q. *J.A. Thibault* CAPT. D. A. D. O. S. A. & N. Z. MTD DIVN.
- Entry No. 7. d/7/5/18. - Visited A.D.O.S., D.M.C., re question of Motor Transport for Ordnance Stores. Two points were suggested (1).- That it would be impossible to fix any definite number of Lorries that the requirements of Division for Ordnance Stores, but that five weekly ~~xxxx~~ would be a basis to work on. (2).- That lorries should be forthcoming without undue delay after requisition submitted. After being referred to A.D.S.T. the general principle seemed accepted that 5 Lorries should be allotted for Ordnance Stores to be utilised in turn by each of the 3 Divisions, special arrangements being made when extra issues were involved e.g., Tentage. This system if carried out will probably meet the various situations that arise. It is however essential that delay should not be experienced in obtaining lorries, 1st. A.L.H. Brigade send to collect Water Cart, Maltese Cart, Limber and Harness from LUDD. The Limber and Harness to replace those lost at BIREH in February. 8 Lorries arrived with Ordnance Stores from JERUSALEM. *J.A. Thibault* CAPT. D. A. D. O. S. A. & N. Z. MTD DIVN.
- Entry No. 8. d/8/5/18. - Issue of Fringes Browband to the Division, a total of 8700 being issued. Hand Sprayers for Sanitary Section issued for Malarial Work and 8 miles of Cable to 18th. Brigade R.H.A. Hastener forwarded to LUDD for Soap and Dubbing due from ~~xxxx~~ middle of April. Boot Return sent to A.D.O.S., D.M.C., Issued NIL. (Returned. 236 pr *J.A. Thibault* CAPT. D. A. D. O. S. A. & N. Z. MTD DIVN.
- Entry No. 9. d/9/5/18. - Issue of Bulk Stores to Brigades. ~~Application xxx~~ 2nd. A.L.H. Brigade.- 397 prs Boots, 54 prs Breeches, 360 Ropes Head, 300 Bags Nose, also Towels Tunics, Combs, H/Shoes and Oil. 1st. A.L.H. Brigade.- 86 prs Boots, 358 Shirts, 268 prs Socks, 54 Tunics, 300 Bags Nose, 250 Headropes, Soap Oil and H/Shdes. N.Z.M.R. Brigade.- 172 prs Boots, 42 Tunics, 200 Shirts, 200 Socks, 450 Ropes Head, 150 Bags Nose, Soap Oil and H/Shoes. Application made for 8 G.S. Wagons to move the Dump to TALAT ED DUMM : it was finally decided however to employ Motor Lorries, 8 of which were requested ; these were however totally inadequate to deal with the removal of the whole Dump and the return of unserviceable material at the same time, and eventually 20 lorries were employed. Labour being provided by 40 natives from the C.T.C. Steel Helmets issued to 2nd. A.L.H. Brigade. Corps Order No. 37 issued, para 118 to 120. Paras.- 118. Indent for 1914 Star Riband to be submitted. G.R.O., 3855. 119.- Notes for guidance in deciding what clothing, Blankets, H/Rugs, are worth repairing, G.R.O. 3866. The 128. General garments which are so worn that the substance has gone out of the material should be regarded as U/S, Greatcoats, Breeches, should in general be repaired. Jackets, Shirts and Underclothing present more difficulty. 120.- All 59 round Cotton Bandoliers to be returned to A.O.D. G.R.O., 3875. *J.A. Thibault* CAPT. D. A. D. O. S. A. & N. Z. MTD DIVN.
- Entry No. 10. d/10/5/18. - Division moves to TALAT ED DUMM, less N.Z.M.R. Brigade, 2nd. A.L.H. Brigade, and 18th. Bde, R.H.A., remaining. Advice received of the arrival of Soap, Dubbing, and Greatcoats at JERUSALEM. In view of the difficulty in obtaining lorries it was decided to ask the Divisional Train to send 10 G.S. Wagons to JERUSALEM to collect these (as all other sources of transport have failed). This was done and the stores received and issued to Brigades at TALAT ED DUMM. *J.A. Thibault* CAPT. D. A. D. O. S. A. & N. Z. MTD DIVN.
- Entry No. 11. d/11/5/18. - 2nd. A.L.H. Brigade require 12 Fanatis to replace U/S, these were drawn from Descorps Dump at JERICHO. Visited JERUSALEM and arranged with I.O.M. to exchange any number up to 25 Limbers. Those of Auckland Mtd Rifle Regt, being in the worst condition a wire was sent to the Unit to exchange any number up to 12, and to inform action taken. At the same time instructions were sent to the Divisional Train that any U/S No. 200 Wheels could be exchanged

Entry No. 11. d/11/5/18. (continued) - at the Ordnance W/Shops, JERICHO. These are native shops controlled by the Ordnance W/Shops at JERUSALEM, and serve a very useful purpose as an advanced Expense Store. Vehicles advised from LUDD (Truck 1045). *J. P. Thibault* CAPT. D. A. D. O. S. A. & N. Z. LTD DIVA

Entry No. 12. d/12/5/18. - Vehicles advised from KANTARA, (Truck 5854). 18th. Brigade R.H.A. instructed to submit by wire to Brigade Ordnance concerned, a list of Bulk requirements. Sgt. Bracefield reports that 18 G.S. Wagons required to remove all stores from JERUSALEM. Issue of Bulk Stores to Brigades. 1st. A.L.H. Brigade. - 105 prs. Boots, 136 Muzzles Horse, Shirts, Socks, Headropes, and other Clothing, 187 Saddle Blankets, 300 Ropes Picketing, 490 lbs. Dubbing, 258 Bars Soap, 120 Bottles Water. 2nd. A.L.H. Brigade. - 204 Greatcoats, 56 Hats Felt, 350 Ropes Picketing, 540 lbs. Dubbing, 100 Bars Soap, 131 Muzzles Horse. N.Z.M.R. Brigade. - 300 Bars Soap, 540 lbs. Dubbing, 300 Ropes Picketing, 68 Bottles Water, 68 Hats Felt. *J. P. Thibault* CAPT. D. A. D. O. S. A. & N. Z. LTD DIVA

Entry No. 13. d/13/5/18. - Stores advised from LUDD (Truck 1140). 2nd. A.L.H. Brigade hastening Pioneering Equip as urgently required in defence work. Owing to the nature of the ground the Axe Heads were unable to stand the work, becoming bent and unfit for use while the Helves were very easily broken. Ferruled Helves would be better for this work. 18th. Brigade R.H.A., wires to ascertain from where Ordnance Stores were to be drawn, it was decided that all stores for the Batteries should be sent to 2nd. A.L.H. Brigade Ordnance. *J. P. Thibault* CAPT. D. A. D. O. S. A. & N. Z. LTD DIVA

Entry No. 14. d/14/5/18. - 10 Fanatis issued to replace Water Cart 7th. L.H. Regt., while undergoing repairs. ~~Issue~~ Issue of Stores to Brigades. Bulk demand submitted to LUDD includes 850 prs Pants Cotton Drill, and 7000 Trousers K.D., authorised to Mounted Troops in lieu of Shorts K.D., under authority D.Q.M.G., Q.M. 1360/2, dated 24/4/18., 1600 Bags Nose, 1800 Ropes Picketing, 1550 Bars Soap, 2000 lbs. Dubbing, 800 sets size 4 H/Shoes, 600 Sets size 5, 240 sets size 6, and 500 lbs No. 6 Nails H/Shoe. 2 Water Carts wired for, for 7th. L.H. Regt, and Divisional Headquarters to replace Colonial Pattern Boot Return submitted to A.D.O.S., D.M.C., Issued 745. Returned 654. *J. P. Thibault* CAPT. D. A. D. O. S. A. & N. Z. LTD DIVA

Entry No. 15. d/15/5/18. - Fortnightly Equipment Return and Machine Gun Reports submitted to A.D.O.S., D.M.C.? Machine Gun Report :- Vickers. - All good condition. Hotchkiss. - All serviceable and good condition, few spare required on Indent by 2nd. A.L.H. Brigade. Fortnightly Equipment Return, principal shortages. - Compasses Prismatic, 9 Sets P/Saddlery, 3 sets Hotchkiss Gun P.Saddlery, 3 sets Officers Saddlery, 6 Sets Wheeled Harness, 2 Telescopes Signalling, 330 prs Boots, 600 Pants Cotton Drill, 495 prs Spurs Jack. Stores advised from LUDD (Truck E.54). 2nd. A.L.H. Brigade again hasten Pioneering Equipment and wire "Where are U/S stores to be returned". Ausdiv Dump refuse to accept any more" It was pointed out that detached Brigades must make their own arrangements and there should be no difficulty as returning Lorries (empties) could be utilised for returning U/S stores to JERUSALEM. Regarding the Picks and Shovels, these were at JERUSALEM and would be sent down as soon as possible. Corps Order No 38, paras 121 to 125, issued. Paras. - 121. - O.M.W. Opened at JERICHO. 122. - Trousers K.D. approved for issue to Mounted Troops in lieu of Shorts K.D. - D.Q.M.G. 1360/2 d/24/4/18. 123. - Salvage of Hides and Skins. P/Saddle and Canvas Clothing to be issued Mobile Vet. Sections G.R.O., 3898. 124. - Tentage Return. 125. - Re new pattern cartridge Dummy Drill Mk.V1., *J. P. Thibault* CAPT. D. A. D. O. S. A. & N. Z. LTD DIVA

Entry No. 16. d/16/5/18. - Fanatis Return. The difficulty in regard to this Return solved by the pointing out of the fact that the Fanatis left at RICHON had never been included in any Return, and that the shortage was one which did not exist in fact. In the Return submitted March 12th. 200 Fanatis were shewn in possession, on the 13th March, the Division left RICHON, and 107 Fanatis were left with the Details. On the way through 300 were drawn from JUNCTION, but the 107 left at RICHON were, not being included in following Fanatis Returns : hence the apparent discrepancy. Division moves *J. P. Brigade, including E.P.I.P. Tent for Malarial Diagnosis Station. 18th. Brigade R.H.A., wired for 2,000 yards of Rabbit Wire Netting for Gun Emplacements, this being an R.E. supply the question was referred to 1st Field Squadron and C.R.E., Corps. Arrangements made for all men proceeding on leave to EGYPT to be equipped as far as possible with Clothing and Necessaries as far as available at Divisional Ordnance Dump, JERUSALEM. (Q.O. 1482 to all Brigades.) Indents for all Sections to be submitted in Bulk in view of the closing down of the Depot and the reduction of Stores. Corps Orders No. 39, paras 126 to 130, Issued. Paras.- 126.- Returns To be rendered promptly. 127.- Clothing, repeated Corps Order 102. 128.- Motor Lorries, to be taken over from the Supply Dump. 129.- Tentage, Damage to Tentage to be prevented G.R.O. 3937. 130.- Casings Vickers Barrels. The use of Puttees or similar cover to be forbidden. G.R.O., 3938.

Entry No. 19. d/19/5/18. - Wire sent to C.D.O., LUDD, for 3862 Yards Mosquito Netting. Scale of issue being one curtain per officer and 1 per two O/Ranks. Distribution however taken over by Descorps. Nose Bags specially hastened, Q.O. 1497. Complaint received through A.D.O.S., D.M.C. from 1st. Signal Troop of deficiency and delay in the supply of Cable. It was pointed out the Indent in question was passed to A.D.A.S., D.M.C., and not to this office "It however should be added that if Units were permitted to submit Indents both to A.D.A.S. and to this Office, duplications of issues must arise. In view of the fact that Regimental Signalling Equipment is a regular supply of this department and that there has been no single instance of delay in provision, such Indents should be passed to A.D.A.S. for supply, with whom there are large stocks of this material". Such Indents should be passed through the Brigade Signal Officer. A.D.O.S., D.M.C., in reply referred to para 47 "Instructions to Ordnance Officers In The Field" that Signalling Equipment was to be obtained through Army Signals. No further responsibility therefore will be accepted for the supply of this equipment. It is to be remarked that both at ABASAN in September 1917 and again at RICHON in December 1917, very strong complaints were made by Regiments that they could neither obtain Cable or Cells through the Signals, and in both cases supply was made by A.O.D.

Entry No. 21. d/21/5/18. - Visited 2nd. A.L.H. Brigade at JERICHO. The only complaints made were in regard to Pioneering Equipment the supply of which was not sufficient to meet the demands, and Clothing, especially Breeches, Brigade Commander being especially insistent in the supply of Trousers K.D. as the men having nothing to change into, the clothing naturally wore out much more quickly, and owing to the heat, sweat, and conditions under which the men were working, i.e., Trench digging, the health of the Troops was likely to be affected. 2nd. A.L.H. Brigade hastening the supply of size 10 Boots not available at LUDD. Tentage Return submitted to A.D.O.S., D.M.C., shewing actually in possession, 150 C.D.L., 11 C.S.L., 9 E.P.I.P. & S.S., 57 Shelter Tents, 3461 Bivouac Tents, also Operating and Telegraph Tents. Corps Order No. 40, paras 131 to 133, issued. Paras.- 131.- Return of all Latrine Equipment in possession to be rendered on the 24th. 132.- Indents. 133.- Travelling on Lorries, Passes to be in possession. (D.M.C., R.O., 346.) Corps Order No. 41, paras 134 to 136, issued. Paras.- 134.- Additional Returns to be submitted Monthly, shewing.- (1). Total quant.

Entry No. 21. d/21/5/18. (continued). - quantities of unserviceable stores returned for month. (2).-Total number of Vouchers received. 135.- Returned stores. Serviceable stores to be vouchered on a separate Issue Voucher. 136.- Corps Orders. The information contained in Corps Orders is to be notified to each Unit by B.W.O's. Following ~~wire~~ wire sent all Brigades and Units: "Notify number of Australian Pattern or Mk.V1 Water Carts on charge to Units and number requiring repair or exchange" Q.O.1498.) Indents submitted for 210 additional pairs of Boots, also for 150 Ferraled Axe Helves. Following wire sent to C.O.O., LUDD, "May following stores be specially hastened, Nose Bags, Dubbing, Soap, Trousers K.D., and Pantaloon Cotton Drill" In regard to this, Trousers K.D. were not available. In this respect it would appear that the authority for issue had been given before the supply of the stores was available. As the delay in specially authorised stores leads always to some recrimination, Units naturally holding that the delay is caused by the Department, it would tend to remove such feeling if a note could be added to the authority that issue would be made as soon as the stores become available. A similar instance is in the supply of Electric Torches, specially authorised in April for Mounted Units, but still not procurable, and again with Pistols. Indents for Hand Spikes to be checked carefully in view of great shortage of supply. Boot Return submitted to A.D.O.S., D.M.C., Issued.-169. Received.- 382.

Entry No. 22. d/22/5/18. - C.O.O., LUDD, reports one Ambulance Wagon and one G.S. Wagon awaiting collection at LUDD for 2nd. A.L.H. Brigade.

Entry No. 23. d/23/5/18. - Stores advised from LUDD. Indent submitted for 858 Sets Letter "A" to Australian Headquarters, CAIRO. Badges, Titles, Armlets, etc., are no longer to be included in Fortnightly Bulk Demand, A.D.O.S., D.M.C., O.M./513/7. Regarding receipt for stores, the question of responsibility having been raised in respect to the return of Signalling Panels, by Brigades, contrary to instructions, the question was raised as to the point or value of receipts ^{since} signed only "Unexamined". Receipts ^{are} given by the A.O.D., such a receipt being of no validity and open to question by both sides. Further there was no point in detailing ~~this~~ if such labour was entailed in so doing was not to be met by an equal return on the part of the receiving Depot. It was suggested as a way out, that receipts should only be given for serviceable stores: unserviceable and bulk stores being submitted with convoy note detailing number of sacks and packages. This will of course obviate the necessity of keeping a record of Returned Stores. Re Air craft Signalling Apparatus. G.R.O., 3796 authorises the issue of one $\frac{3}{4}$ Circular Disc to each Mtd. Brigade Headquarters, and one Semi-circular Disc to each Regimental Headquarters, also one Panel and six Ground Strips to each D.H.Q., and B.H.Q. Indent for these submitted in April.

Entry No. 24. d/24/5/18. - 2nd. A.L.H. Brigade hastening Tentage, Wheels, Poles and six Brake Bars. Stores advised from KANTARA (Truck 128). Hastener submitted by wire for Overseas Chevrons, now three months overdue. Indents dated from 8/2/18 to March 3rd/1918. Latrine Equipment submitted to A.D.O.S., D.M.C., shewing following in possession. 1st. A.L.H. Brigade.- Seats 33, Buckets 35, Deficiency.- Seats 46, Buckets 45. 2nd. A.L.H. Brigade.- Seats 46, Buckets 51, deficient.- Seats 35, Buckets 15. N.Z.M.R. Brigade.- Seats 42, Buckets 49. Deficient.- Seats 24, Buckets 17. 18th. Bde R.H.A., Seats 17, Buckets 23, Deficient.- Seats 15, Buckets 13. Divisional Units.- Seats 41, Buckets 45, Deficient Seats 10, Buckets 6. The demand submitted to LUDD for 136 Seats and 100 Buckets therefore covered their requirements, and have since been received. The Brigades are therefore complete up to 3% standard, whilst 1st. A.L.H. Brigade and Divisional Units up to 5% standard.

Entry No. 25. d/25/5/18. - Stores demanded 7.500 Fly Veils. 150 Tents C.D.L. received but appropriated by Descorps. Hastener sent to R.T.O., ARTUE, to expedite despatch of stores delayed in transit. Inverness Battery hastening Frocks K.D., 36, Trousers, Breeches, Dubbing, Soap and Nails: last 4 items since supplied.

SUMMARY.

The following report submitted to A.D.O.S., covers the period of the month.

The following general report on Ordnance work is submitted with reference to your O.M./13/49. the report is of a brief nature owing to the fact that the detailed information is not at the present moment available, e.g., in regard to vehicles repaired, stores returned etc.

The work covered by the period falls into two distinct parts. (1).- From May 5th. to May 12th. (2).- May 12th. to May 28th.

During the first few days of the month Division was engaged in operations, the 1st. and 2nd. A.L.H. Brigades in the Hills around EL SALT, N.Z.M.R. Brigade being on the Plain. It was due to this fact that the consequent requirements of the 1st. and 2nd. A.L.H. Brigades were particularly heavy. On May 11th. Division moved to TALAT ED DUMM and on the 15th to BETHLEHEM. During the last Fortnight very few stores have been sent to the Brigades at the Front, all demands having been met and large issues being made on the 14th. from TALAT ED DUMM. The question of Transport has not therefore arisen, though four lorries with Bulk stores left JERUSALEM and TALAT ED DUMM on the 18th.

Operations having ceased for the moment, Units are taking the opportunity to refit, and subsequently the number of Indents has increased, a total of 542 being passed at the date in period (1).- 132 - and period (2), 210, an increase of 155 on the previous month. The supplies of stores however, has not been as constant, and there have been delays, and the supply of Dubbing, Soap, H/Shoes : the former has now been supplied but H/Shoes are still urgently required.

Vehicles having only being employed on metalled roads and not on broken ground, there has not been as many repairs affected as in previous month. The chief problem in this connection is in the supply of Wheels, No. 200a, 198a, 159a. Wheels are now practically unobtainable, yet with the increasing heat, the constant use on hard metalled surfaces, and the hilly nature of the country, the wheels are fast becoming unserviceable, the felloes and spokes wearing loose, and the pipe Boxes being worn down, unless the problem is solved in the near future a very serious situation must arise, and the Divisional Transport will be immobile.

The creation of an Expense Store at JERUSALEM will undoubtedly meet the needs of the case, provided that the demands made by the W/Shops are maintained and supplied to their fullest extent and without delay. It is, I think, to be regretted that no Tyre Press exists nearer than LUDD. Regarding ~~xxxxxx~~ point 4 in your memo, (Return of unserviceable stores) information is not available as the list has not been ~~xxxxxx~~ compiled, but over 12 Lorry loads of unserviceable material has been returned to JERUSALEM. Apart from labour there has been no difficulty in dealing with the return of Stores.

The rough country as has been remarked in previous reports, inflicts very heavy wear and tear on Boots and Clothing, and 75% new issues of every article are required. The present shortage of Pantaloon Cotton Drill, and the failure to supply Trousers K.D. in lieu of Shorts K.D., is responsible for ~~xxx~~ a much heavier demand for Pantaloon Cotton Drill, as with the heat, the perspiration, and the work and absence of change, the men's Breeches has a very short life "

Re remarks Tyre Press. I understand that this, now under consideration. Re Transport, difficulty was experienced at the end of the month owing to the refusal of Descorps to supply the Lorries as requested. Attached Appendix "B" shows Vehicles repaired and Wheels issued at the W/Shops, JERUSALEM.
