

COMPLAINTS FROM CIVILIANS.

One or two minor complaints have been received during the period under review, and are receiving attention.

CONDUCT OF TROOPS.

Fair. 382 cases of minor breaches of discipline have been dealt with for the week, as compared with 330 for the previous week.

FAILING TO SALUTE.

No cases of "Failing to Salute" have been brought to notice.

CONDUCT OF HOTELS.

Satisfactory.

TRAFFIC.

No complaints or congestions.

TRAFFICKING IN GOVT. STORES.

Arthur Pritchard, 51 Newstead Road, Westham, was fined 10/- and costs for receiving Government goods, to wit, one pair of boots, the property of the A.I.F.

TRESPASSING.

A few cases of soldiers trespassing on private property are reported from time to time, but are being promptly dealt with.

GENERAL.

POLICE OPERATIONS: - Of the total of 382 cases shown in the attached Summary, 139 members of the A.I.F. were arrested on various civil or military charges during the week under review by the London Detachment of the Australian Provost Corps. No. 4373, Pte. NAYLER, G., 48th Bn., A.I.F., and No. 3682, Pte. ARTHUR, G., 60th Bn., A.I.F.,

These two soldiers appeared at Westminster Police Court on 1st inst., charged with drunkenness and wilful damage to property. Both were found guilty. Nayler was fined 10/-, which was paid, and he was released from custody. Arthur was fined 5/- and ordered to pay £15 damages and costs. He was allowed certain time in which to complete payment.

An individual under the name of RICHARD RILEY was arrested by the Civil Police at Bootle, Lancs, on 16-9-18, and handed over to an escort from this London Detachment as an absentee from the A.I.F. According to this man's statement, he enlisted in the A.I.F. at Melbourne in May 1916, and deserted a few weeks later, since which occasion he has been working on steamships in various parts of the world in the capacity of fireman. As no official record of this man ever having been a member of the A.I.F. is held in this country, he was on the 1st inst., in accordance with the instructions of O.C. Troops, Administrative Headquarters, London, handed over

to the Civil Police Authorities for enlistmen

the Military Service Act.

During the week under review, I inspected the A.I.F. Police Detachments at Fovant, Salisbury, and Warminster, and found everything satisfactory. On Saturday and Sunday last, I made a special tour of the Warminster - Sutton Veny Area, and consulted with Civil as well as the Military Police, besides several farmers and gentlemen of standing in the district, and the whole tenor of their expressions was decidedly in favour of the conduct of Australian troops.

The complaint of poaching by Australian soldiers on Mr. Pickford's Manor House Farm, Longbridge Deverill, referred to in my previous week's report, has been investigated, and special attention is being paid to this property with a view to suppressing the alleged offence.

A complaint was received during the week from a resident of Shipton that a bicycle which he had loaned to an Australian soldier had not yet been returned. Every effort is being made to recover the missing property.
