

### Remarks on war diary attached :-



During the month we found the arrangements for drawing guns from the Gun Parks to be very satisfactory, and a great saving of time in fulfilling units' demands. A large number of vehicles and parts of vehicles have been demanded from the base to replace others rendered unserviceable, and demands from the base have been coming forward freely.

Considerable difficulty has been experienced in fulfilling units' demands for paint, but during the last few days of the month the Base was able to supply us with a fair quantity which helped somewhat to decrease our demands which are still outstanding.
