			authority is given for the a stock of revolvers to be carried for this purpose.	
			During the month the work in both the Armouers Shop and Divnl Bootmakers Shop has proved most	
			efficient, it having been found possible in the case of the Armouers' Shop for many articles	
			to be made right-out there, and also for difficult repairs to be completed. The Bootmakers'	
			Shop has been well run and has resulted in a great saving of boots in the Division.	
			The question of accomodation for the Ordnance personnel was satisfactorily arranged, and the	
			work is proceeding now on the huts required by them. All stores have been prompt in arriver from Base, the only items being difficult to obtain being M.G., parts and Australian clothic	ng
