

At 0950 strategical recommaissance saw about 2 regiments of Turkish cavalry about KURNET GHUZALEH, and a smaller force at KH. UM EL RUMAMIN, both moving N.E. Our cavalry covering right flank of 53rd Bivision and also moving N.E.

Orders issued to Yeomanry Division to place I brigade, 1 battery and 1 field troop at the disposal of G.O.C. Descorps from 1700 to-day. To be at 1 hour's notice.

> No sign of enemy in front of our troops advancing on TOWAL ABU JERWAL. No movement IRGEIG. Redoubt in W. 1.D. . (outpost position held). About 2,000 troops round SHERIA.

5 columns infantry of about 2 companies each moving north from SHERIA. Small movement in KAUWUKAH system.

At 1100 one infantry brigade 53rd Division had reached L of KHASHIM EL DUTEIYIR, with I.C.Bde. on its right. Two Infantry brigades advancing N. on the KOHLER Road about 2 miles from the Mosque.

Station K.22 (sheet 25) 14 rolling stock, one engine detached, 50 - 60 mechanical transport close by. Very little infantry movement behind RUSHDI and KAUWUKAH systems. Water plentiful between SHERIA and HAREIRA. No hostile movement east of point 2 miles east of SHERIA.

In F.18 (ref. 0.5 sheet) 4 horse transport, apparently guns, facing SHERIA. BEIT HANUM and HUJ not reconnoited owing to bad light.

captured BIR SABA, prisoners and guns.

XXth Corps 2250.

I.G. Brigade transferred to command of G.O.C. D.M. Corps. Addressed 53rd Division, repeated G.H.Q. and D.M. Corps.

advanced D.M. Corps 2030. Observation party at Pt. 1020 reports at 1800 on lst dust apparently representing column three miles long moving eastwards. End of column about 6 miles east of SHERIA.

7th Mounted Brigade will march at 0700 on 2nd to occupy the area TEL KHUWUELFEH - BIR KHUWUELFEH - BIR ABU KHUFF - AIN KOHLEH. On reaching point where track through the R of ARAB leaves HEBRON Road, brigade will come under orders of G.O.C. Anzac Mounted Divn., who will issue detailed instructions and place at least 2 armoured care at disposal of Brigadier. Special instructions are being issued to G.O.C. Anzac Mtd.Divn. on the above subject. Tactical patrols have been arranged for 1100, 1200, 1500. Addressed Australian Mv. Anzac Divn. Repeated G.H.O. XXth Corps.

owing to lack of sufficient pumps and to a portion of water area in BIR SABA being reserved for infantry, it will not be possible to move up any more mounted troops for night of 3/4th when (? until) it is hoped to be able to bring up one, or perhaps two brigades (of Yeomanry Division). Even this not certain. Hope arrange with XXth Corps on 2nd November to water fewer of XXth Corps troops in BIR SABA.

XXIst Corps telephoned 0155. UMBRELLA Hill captured. First objective rushed

14 minutes after Zero hour, and shortly before time of
this message division had reported final objective
reached. Enemt shelling front line very heavily, but
shelling now dying down. 156th Brigade apparently
quite happy.

0220 - 0315.

Salmond, who had been pressed by XXIst Corps at nime to send out a second aeroplane to stop heavy shelling of front line of 50nd Division. He seemed to think they were rather anxious. He didn't think it wise to wend a second machine, since only one had been arranged for, and the second would be taken for an enemy machine. Our machine had gone up and would be followed by another when it returned.

At 0286 he reported shelling becoming less. At 0215 the first machine reported not really very many batteries firing. Two batteries silenced by hombs.

The most active being new battery reported in G.21.

to go out had dropped bombs on batteries and silenced them all for the time.

had put heavy barrage on the front line, especially

SAMPSON'S RIDGE. 156th Frigade have not definitely

0500 .

Main Attack. At 0334 Tanks 2 and 4 reached their objectives. BEACH FOST and SEA FOST captured and the communication trench between them. Our troops have pushed beyond SEA POST. The PEBBLE (E. Of BEACH POST) is in our hands. Machine gun fire from PEBBLE had been troublesome. 2 officers and 16 men captured on SUGARLOAF. No news from RAFA REDOUBT or RAJA JUNIOR. Enemy bombarded SAMPSON'S RIDGE, HEREFORD RIDGE and BLAZED HILL heavily.

XXIst Corps,

UMBRELLA HILL occupied 2314, and 24 prisoners captured. EL ARISH Redoubt, BEACH POST and SEA POST captured and consolidated. 2 officers and 16 O.R. taken prisoner: No reports from RAFA REDOUBT, ZOWAID and EL BURJ trenches, where opposition is being met with. Enemy shelled SAMPSON's and HERRFORD Ridges, QUEENS, BLAZED and LEE'S HILLS intensely, but was quiet in ABBAS APEX.

Liaison XXIst Corps, 0715.

- 1. Contact plane message reports flares just north of GUB HILL, all along RAFA Trench and between EL BURJ and ZOWAID tranches.
- 2. Following received from 54th Division by telephone, not yet confirmeds- We have taken EL ARISE redoubt and ZOWAID. At 0604 we were reported to be held up between EL BURJ and ZOWAID (probably just south of ZOWAID).
- 3. At 0640 Tank reported moving about at CRESTED ROCK; infantry in EL BURJ, and ZOWAID trenches and on RAFA = BRLAH Ridge; and as having taken GUN HILL.
- 6710. Junction has been established between 156th and 163rd Infantry Brigades at ROOK trench

(behind EL ARISH Redoubt), and our troops are in EVE Trench, north-west of GIBRALTAR.

R.F.C. Tactical Reconnaissance, telephone message received 0700. Large bodies of troops moving from HAREIRA to SHERIA; unable to estimate numbers owing to dust. 500 infantry at BEIT HANUN moving into GAZA.

Reports large bodies of troops moving from HAREIRA towards SHERIA.

Smaller parties all along line moving out towards SHARRA.

Reports no movement west of BEIT LAHI. Machine flew low over area and machine gurned likely cover. Scattered scrapings of trenches lining sand dunes seen.

About 500 infantry moving towards GAZA from direction of hospital at BEIT HANUN.

G.21 and G.28 appear, occupied.

Corps Commander has ordered back I.S.Cavalry Brigade and Corps Cav. Regt. to bivouse, where they are to be ready to move at 1 hour's notice.

162nd Brigade occupied LION TRENCH (G.22, 28) with 1 company of Northamptonshire Regt. Pigeon message received saying that this company was being heavily counter-attacked. Second message reported that the company had withdrawn.

Tactical landed 0810. Clouds of dust caused by numerous bedies of troops moving as follows. (It is impossible to estimate numbers concerned owing to the moving light and dust raised):-

- (1) Movement eastwards from HARRIRA to SHERIA and continuing eastward towards KHUWEILFER.
- (2) Movement along GAZA SHERIA road towards SHERIA and continuing eastwards.
- (8) Movement from RESM area towards UM DARKAL.
- (4) Movement between KAUWUKAH and RUSHDI system eastwards
- (5) Dust rising in JEMAMEH area, but direction could not be ascertained.







The 25,000 infantry which the enemy has available in addition to the above are, therefore, widely extended, even if he has entirely demuded his line from ATAWINEH to HARRIRA; for the distance from HARRIRA to BIR KHUWEILPEH. is 16 miles.

We have placed a force of 40,000 rifles and two divisions of mounted troops in position to attack the enemy at the vital point of his extended left flank, that is, about SHERIA, the possession of which will secure for us and deny to him essential water supplies.

- 2. The Commander-in-Chief intends to attack the enemy with the XX Corps on the line KH. BUTEINAH SHERIA KH. HAUWUKAH on the 6th inst. The Desert Mounted will co-operate on the north-of the XX Corps Corps, seizing the NEJILE and the JEMMANA water supplies, and thereafter acting in accordance with instructions (No. Z/77/29 dated 23/10/17) issued with Force Order No.54. The orders given in telegram No. C.A.710 of yesterday therefore hold good, except that the date of the attack is deferred until November 6th.
- upon all Divisional and subordinate commanders that rapidity and determination will be the essence of the success of the operations above ordered. SHERMA and NEJILE must be taken on the first day of this phase of the

/operations,

operations, and the troops must understand that they will be called upon to continue fighting in order to give the enemy no respite until his resistence is broken down and any success gained can be confirmed and exploited. The right flank guard division of the XX Corps at present appears to be opposed by one, or at the most two weak enemy regiments (19th Division), whose combined strength is not one fifth that of one of our divisions, though some three enemy cavalry regiments are co-operating with the weak infantry force referred to. G.O.C. XX Corps will realise that as soon as the main operation begins, his flank will be best protested by the success of his attack in front, and that his flank guard should not exceed what is necessary to hold off comparatively weak enemy forces until a spocess has been gained. This is more especially true in view of the strong force of mounted troops which will be operating on the right of the XX Corps. The Commander-in-Chief does not consider it necessary to leave any considerable force in BEERSHEBA, but that, on the other hand, it will be wital to produce the maximum pressure of all available troops at once to break down the enemy's defence of the main objective. A small mounted force up the HEBRON road supported by a battalion and a half, which is being sent to BEERSHERA for that purpose, should be fully sufficient for the protection of BEERSHEDA until the objective is gained. 
