



- 2. His Majesty the King will visit the Australian Corps Area on 1st Dec. The King will arrive at WESSES at 1230 entering the Town by MAUBERGE AVESNES ROAD.
- 3. The 2nd and 3rd A.I.Bdes with their Field Ambulances will represent the 1st Aust. Division in lining the Road North of CENSE-a-LONGE with a single rank on either side of the Road.
- 4. The 5th Battalion will move as under: -Battalian will form up in column of Route with Head of Column at Cross Roads opposite B.H.Q. at 0915 in the following order: -Hdqrs, Details; Sigs.; and Intell.; Band; "C", "D" and "B" Coys. Company Commanders will be mounted. Transport Officer will arrange for Officers' Chargers to be at starting point by 0915.

Commanding Officer's Report -

In the period, under review, the health of all ranks of the Battalion has been excellent, notwithstanding that the weather, almost throughout, has been wet, cold and rainy.

The Route Marching, under bad conditions of weather, was very

good and no men fell out.

A successful start was made at SARS POTERIES with the Educational Classes, which are still going ahead as far as possible. The elementary stages now being got over, the want of text books, note paper etc. is causing serious delay in getting ahead, more so as no Education Officer has; as yet, been alloted to this Unit; the work being temporarily carried out by the Battalion Padre, who has not altogether the organising or instructing powers necessary. The Class Rooms are good and sufficient and a hall is obtainable every evening from 7 to 9. Organised visits to Coal Mines, Marble Works, Steel Works etc., are now being carried out and are found to be instructive to those going.

On Kmas Day all the men had a good dinner, on tables with, in most cases, crockery to eat and drink out of, which was much appreciated.

The goods supplied by the Comforts Funds had been, as usual, generously distributed, and were also much appreciated. Also each man wasgiven a Kmas Box from the 2nd Brigade Comforts Fund A Kmas Mail also arrived in time.

H.R.H. the Prince of Wales visited the Battalion unofficially and saw one of the Companies at Recreation. His visit was greatly

appreciated.b

The Battalion has settled down comfortably, two Companies being in empty Pottery Factories, and the remaining Company in empty houses, and have tables and forms, and, in some cases, beds have been made for the men. All Billets are well ventilated, are sanitary, are electrically lit, and have stove heaters. All ranks are in good spirits.

Parades, owing to inclement weather, have of necessity been curtailed, but every opportunity has been taken to carry out the

Syllabus as laid down.

There are good hot shower baths alongside of the recreation ground, which belong to a Coal Mine, and these are well made use of by all.

There is a Cinema Hall near the billets at which performances are given every afternoon and evening.

Food has been good and sufficient.

Leave is granted to 10% daily to visit CHARLEROI; and also a certain number to visit BRUSSELS, which are being well taken advantage of.

Leave to U.K. is also coming forward more frequently.
