



Lt. Col. W.R. Watson C.B. V.D. returned to duty from Hospital England. (Wounded 7/8/16)

Lt. Col. Fitzgerald ceases to command 24th Battn.

Major Nicholas on command 2nd Aust. Div. Hqrs.

41 O/Ranks from Companies taken on strength of Hqrs.

as Bombing platoon.

14th Lt. Col. Fitzgerald returned to 6th Brigade. 2/Lieut. J.L. Fawcett evacuated to hospital.

Left Winnepag Camp for trenches Ypres at 6.30 p.m.

Capt. G.M. Carr. Furlought England.

Capt. Williams returned from furlough.

18th 1 N.C.O. "B" Coy. to attend School of Musketry, To-morrow.

Left trenches, Ypres, at midnight. Destination Steenvoorde. Entrained Ypres about 2 a.m.

20th Arrived Steenvoorde 5.30 a.m. Transport arrived 12.30 p.m. Men allotted to billets and blankets issued.

21st Battalion marched to Steenvoorde for lecture.

Left Steenvoorde and marched to Noordpeene, 13 kilometres
Weather beautiful and roads good. Passed through Cassel.
"C" Coys. billets at Les Paradis. "D" Coy. and Hqrs.
billetted in abandoned Chateau.

Rendezvous 9.15 a.m. Marched in rear of Brigade to
Eperlecques - 18 kilometres - a long and hard march.

Saved 4 miles by marching via Watten, Men much exhausted.

Rain falking.

24th 1 Officer 5 O/Ranks to attend Lewis Gun Course to-day.

Course lasts until 1st Novr.

Marched to St. Omer and entrained there at 2,30 a.m.

October 25th for Longpre - a 10 kilometre march in the dak

from Eperlecques to St. Omer.

Disentrained at Longpre and marched to Brucamps - a distance of 10 kilometres. Billeted there. Men much exhausted.

26th Transport and M.G. detachment moved to Mouflers.

27th Marched to Mouflers and took motor buses to Ribemont thence marched to Buire and billeted.

28th Capt. Godfrey reported off leave. Work. Organisation for attack.

29th Church Parade (Protestant) at Buire, R.C. at 2nd A. Div.

30th

31st. 40 Reinforcements reported for duty.
3 men tried by F.G.C.M.
