

### APPENDIX

FIFTH AUSTRALIAN INFANTRY BRIGADE SECRET

STAFF RIDE - 3rd August 1917 - (Reference Training Memo 24)

#### PHASE I

#### To commence at 10 a.m.

SITUATION. "A" Battalion is on the right from road junction U.21.a.6.7. inclusive to road junction U.15.a.90.25. exclusive, with "C" Battalion in support.

"B" Battalion is on the left from U.15.a.90.25. inclusive to northern boundary of "W" area, with "D" Battalion in support.

Battalion sectors are bounded by parallel lines on true bearings of 1130 from points-marking their flanks on HARLETTES - LE BUISSON ROAD

Required at Brigade H.Q. (Road junction U.15.a.90.25.) at 11.30 a.m. :-

- (a) From battalions. Outpost Order with sketch shewing positions of piquets and groups, supports#
- (b) From M.G. Coy. Sketch shawing positions of M.G's. in outpost line, with arcs of fire.
- (c) From Fld. Amb. Position of Advanced Dressing Station.

# NOTE: 1. For 1st and 2nd Phases 17th and 18th Bns will each represent "A" Bn. and 19th and 20th Bns " " " "B" Bn

2. For 3rd Phase:
17th and 18th Bns each become "O" Bn.
th and th Bns " " "D" Bn.

#### PHASE II

#### To commence at 12 noon.

SITUATION. The enemy (estimated strength 1 Battalion) have attacked the outpost line and failed. The Brigade is ordered to advance on a two battalion frontage ("A" and "B" battalions in front with "C" and "D" in support) and make good the high ground between the BOIS de BOUVELINGHEM and BOIS de 1'EGLISE.

Required at Brigade Headquarters (centre of ridge between BOIS de BOUVELINGHEM and BOIS de l'EGLISE) by 1.30 p.m:-

Battalions 1. Battalion order for the advance.

Battalions to attack on a 2 coy. frontage in 4 waves.

Bn. Commanders are to provide for the advance of the M.G's in their sectors.

2. Sketch shewing position taken

up and dispositions of troops on the high ground between the BOIS de BOUVELINGHEM and the BOIS de L'EGLISE.

From M.G. Cov. Sketch showing positions of 8 machine gune covering the Brigade frontage.

·From T.M.Bty:-

Sketch showing route to be used by the battery (which is made mobile in limbers) in closely. following the advance, and the position of readiness to enable it, or part of it, to become available early in the new position.

#### PHASE III

#### SITUATION:

Imemy has been severdy handled and his strength is now setimated at about 100. He is in-a demoralised condition and retreating rapidly.

A further advance is ordered, "O" and "D" Battalions, which have moved up into valley in BOIS de BOUVELINGHEM, passing through "A" and "B" Battalions. "C" and "D" Battalions are instructed. to make good the spur running through V. 25.c., b. and d., and V.26.c. and d., and to take up an outpost position on that line.

#### TRAINING MEMO. No. 25.

#### ORGANISED BOMBING.

#### A. General Principles.

- Recent operations have emphasised the necessity for systematic training and organisation for bombing fights. There is no doubt that man for man our trained bombers are superior to those of the enemy. The reason for the success of an enemy bombing attack are therefore due to:-
  - (a) exhaustion of our bombers (which entails the use of untrained men, who are speedily outranged).

(b) failure in supply of bombs.

- (c) neglect to make full use of all arms, in co-operation to stem an attack.
- 2. Only by careful organisation and training will the above difficulties be overcome.
  - 3. The following organisation (as applied to a company) aims at (a) The maintenance of a constant supply of bombs from the point of entry to point of contact with the enemy.

(b) Constant and frequent reliefs of the bombers at the point of

contact with the enemy.

(c) Co-operation of all arms to assist the bombing attack.

(d) The maintenance of the position by a block in a suitable position when the objective has been gained. (It may be necessary to bomb beyond the objective to obtain a suitable position to establish a block.

#### B. Distribution and Disposition of Units.

Diagram I below shows the disposition of the leading platoon,

(i.e. platoon nearest point of contact). Other platoons are distributed along the trench in similar order at the rate of 1 man to 3 yards between point of entry and leading platoon.

Remaining platoon and companies are distributed according to the situation, but in case the units between the point of entry and point of contact become thinned to less than 1 man to 3 yards, other units must block up towards the enemy to maintain this distribution. The force between the point of entry forms a chain of passers for supplies as well as being the garrison of the trench.

#### C. Action of various weapons.

- 1. Bayonet men. Clean up the trench under cover of bombing and prevent the enemy from rushing the bomb throwers, and coming to close quarters.
- 2. Bombers. Dislodge or destroy the enemy in the trench by means of bombs, so that the portion of trench gained may be occupied by our troops.
- 3. Rifle Grenadiers. Co-operate with the bombers in driving back hostile bombers beyond hand grenade range, destroying enemy supports, and disorganising his bomb supply.

4. Lewis Guns. (i) Deal with enemy attacks above ground.

(ii) Prevent enemy bombers from observing, by keeping their heads below ground.

(iii) Cover advance of our bomb team.

· (iv) Cover and assist in consolidation when objective is gained.

5. Stokes Mortars.

(i) Fire on hostile approaches towards point of contact to disorganise or destroy hostile reinforcements and supplies.

(ii) Deal with strong points.

6. Riflemen.

(i) Provide snipers who will select suitable positions outside trench and pick off any of enemy who may expose themselves.

(ii) Take advantage of any opportunities (such as darkness or mist) to get out of trench and attack enemy

overland from a flank or in rear.

D. Reliefs.

(i) Platoon Commander of the leading platoon (or a specially selected N.C.O.) will be stationed in rear of the section of rifle grenadiers. He will control the internal reliefs of his platoon, and will satisfy himself that every man going to the rear exhausted or a casualty is a genuine case, and will see that his place is immediately filled from

the rear. Exhausted bomb throwers will be replaced from the half section in rear of the rifle grenadiers. The exhausted men will rest in rear of the rifle grenadiers, until they are required for the next relief. As many reliefs as possible will be carried out within the platoon before

the platoon itself is relieved.

platoon has its last turn of bombing.

(ii) The Company Commander will be responsible for the relief of platoons and will himself judge when it is necessary to carry out a relie the platoon reliefs will be carried out by sections commencing with the bombing section. The Lewis Gun section will be the last relieved if it is considered desirable to relieve it with the rest of the platoon.

On a platoon relief taking place, each section on relief will pass to the rear of the company until it is considered that, in spite of the rest obtained there, they will be useless for further bombing in this attack. In the latter case, the company when exhausted will be withfrawn (a platoon at a time) under battalion arrangements, as each

(iii) Every forward movement of the bomb throwers will necessitate a forward movement on the part of every man (except possibly Lewis gunners of the two leading platoons) between the point of entry and the point of contact, and also the entry of new men from the point of entry towards the enemy to lengthen the chain of carriers.

An officer or N.C.O. should be stationed at the point of entry to control the supply of new men into the trench to maintain 1 man per

3 yards.

## E. Supplies of bombs and ammunition.

1. Brigade will be responsible for the supply of bombs and ammunition from the Brigade dump to the Battalion Dumps, and the Brigade Bomb Office will be responsible that all bombs are detonated, and that rods and sufficient blank ammunition for rifle grenades are sent forward.

2. From the Battalion dump bombs will be taken forward in buckets or

boxes. Sand bags should not be used in place of buckets.

3. At the point of entry a dump will be formed, and the officer or N.C.O. stationed there is responsible that ammunition goes forward as required.

4. From the point of entry bombs and other ammunition are passed by a chain of passers up the trench.

5. Relieving bombers take the bombs from the boxes or buckets and

hand them to the throwers or rifle grenadiers as the case may be.

6. All empty bomb buckets should be passed back to the point of entry.

#### F. Method of advance.

1. The advance will be carried out by a succession of quick determined rushes of one or two traverses at a time.

2. Rifle grenadiers will cover the rush of bombers by a volley

of grenades.

3. Bombers will cover the advance of the rifle grenadiers by an intense shower of bombs. .

#### G. Command.

1. The Command of the attack (under the general direction of the battalion commander) rests with the Company Commander to which the leading platoon belongs (subject to para.G.2.)

2. Command passes only on relief of the leading Company's last

platoon.

#### H. Communications.


1. The position of the platoon commander will be at the rear of his rifle grenadiers.

2. The Company Commander is at the rear of his leading platoon.

3. The platoon commander is responsible for keeping his Company Commander informed of the situation, and the latter for distributing this information by runners to the Stokes Mortars and Battalion Headquarters,.

#### I. Blocks.

On gaining the objective a block of the type shown below should be constructed if it is not intended to continue the attack further.




Barricade with Lewis Gun.

Traverse to be dug away or blown in.

The sides of the trench and the traverse are broken down so that the Lewis Gun at the barricade can sweep the trench for a distance of 60 yards (about), thus forcing the enemy to attack overland, in which case rifle and machine gun fire would be sufficient to cope with it. The slits in each side of the barricade enable a greater concentration of fire to be directed on any overland attack.

The work of constructing the block will normally be done under cover of the advanced bombers, who on completion of the work, will fall back to the prepared position.

If the situation permits a belt of wire (about 12 on either side of the trench) should be placed at right angles to the trench about 30 or 40 yards in front of the barricade.

- l. The ground at Chateau de BATAVIA(north, south and east of the hedge surrounding the Chateau grounds) S.27., S.21.d., and S.28.c., has been allotted to the Brigade for training, as well as the FORET de CLAIRMARAIS and the flat near the 18th Bn camp.






