



Weather: Fine and dull. 9 a.m. Battalion route marched to Brigade Training Ground at (V.21 4 27. ) for a Brigade tactical exercise vide Battalion Order No.01 (appendice 0/F/18) 6/F/18 The scheme was carried out by 17th and 18th . Battalions . General Idea: The Second Aust.Division is holding the high ground running from D.4.central to V.22.central facing West, and has assumed the offensive. The enemy line extends from D.10.central to WESTRECOURT. He is still in occupation of the western portion of BOIS DE BAYENGHEM and strong points in V.27.b. Special Idea: In the initial attack the "X" Aust. Inf. Bde. has reached the road through BOIS DE BAYENGHEM in V.27.d. but has been unable to proceed owing to the failure of the "Y" Aust. Inf. Bde. on its right to advance farther because of the Machine guns and strong points in V.27.b. Each Battalion will have attached to it one section of Machine guns as forward guns. The strong points in V.27.b. will be masked by a smoke barrage from L.T.M.Bty. from Zero to Zero plus 12 minutes. A British Brigade on our right is advancing at the same hour and the "X" Aust. Inf. 



### OPERATION MEMO. No.2.

Reference Map: HAZEBROUCK 5A 1/100,000

- 1. In the event of the necessity arising for a rapid move of troops Forward, the 5th.Brigade may be called upon to embus at short notice.
- The warning message "Stand by to embus" (followed by zero hour) Will be sent from Battalion H.Q.. Half and hour before zero hour, all arrangements outlined hereunder will be completed and the Battalion will be disposed as defined in para.8.
- 3. Embusment will probably take place on the BAYENGHEM-COULOMBY Road with the head of the column at BAYENGHEM.
- Capt. W. J. Graham, M.C. will be Battalion Embussing Officer and will hold himself in readiness to report when required, to the Brigade Embussing Officer.
- 5. Ammunition in pouches and L.G.magazines will be maintained and will not be touched for training purposes.
- 6. The following will be held in readiness by the Q.M. for distribution:-

50 rounds S.A.A. per man from Mobile Echelon. 64 boxes Mills Grenades

24 hours rations.

A party of 2 Officers and 60 men from "A" Coy. will be held in readiness one hour before zero, to be used for the loading and distribution of the above.

- Men will move in marching order and will earry one blanket. The remaining blankets will be rolled, and, with the officers gear, will be stacked at each Company H.Q.
- The battalion will be drawn up for embusment (vide para.2) as follows: -

(a) "A" Coy. and Battn.H.Q. on the road leading S.W. from the church

at SENINGHEM (Sheet 36D. N.E. - D.7.c.5.8.)

(b) "B", "C", "D" Coys. on the SENINGHEM-AFFRINGUES Road.

The head of each column will be 50 yards S.W. and S.E. from the

cross roads at (Sheet 36D. N.E.) D.7.c.5.8.

Half an hour before zero, the two columns will be divided under the command of Capt.J.B.Lane and Major W.R.C.Robertson, M.C. respectively into parties of 1 Officer (or senior N.C.O.) and 23 O.R. - Upon completion of this division and not later than a quarter of an hour known before zero, the above officers will report to Battalion H.Q. that the two columns are ready to move.

- 1. The enemy is holding the line extending from D.10.central to WESTBECOURT. He is still in occupation of the western portion of BOIS DE BAYENGHEM and strong points in V.27.b.
- 2. The 5th.A.I.Brigade will attack on a two Coy. front on "X" day, in conjunction with "Z" Brigade on the N. and "X" A.I.Brigade on the S. 18th. ("A") Battalion will be the left battalion.
  "B" Battalion will be on the right.

The objective will be the capture and consolidation of the line V.27.c.70,50. - V.20.d.50.30.

- 3. There will be no artillery preparation.
- 4. A tape line will be laid by Engineers on the approximate line V.28.c.60.80. V.22.c.20.50., marking the jumping off line. Tapes will be laid along Coy.boundaries & will be produced 50x forward of point j/o line.

  5. The Battalion will move to a point of assembly at V.28.a.7.3. and will be formed up there in formation as in para.7, by zero 30.
  - 6. The 5th.A.L.T.M.Bty. will put up a smoke barrage to mask the Strong Points in V.27.b. from Zero to Zero plus 12 minutes. -Fifty rounds will be fired.

7. Action of infantry -

(a) The attack will be made on a four Coy.front. Coys. will be disposed from right to left in the following order:- "A", "B", "C", "D".

(b) The Battalion will be drawn up at assembly point in the following formation:-

1st.platoon.

2 platoon.

3rd.platoon.

(Moppers up)

4 platoon

(Carriers)

(c) At zero - 30 the Battalion will move forward to the jumping off line and will be in position by zero - 15.

(d) At zero the advance will begin from the jumping off line.

/(e) The 4th.

- (e) The 4th.platoon of "C" Company will be detailed to maintain contact with "X" Brigade on the left. They will meet a party from "X"BHe at V.28.c.10.80. Their action will be to at once to fill any gaps which may occur on the left flank. During the advance they will move in rear of "C" Company and if not otherwise disposed, they will, on the capture of the final objective, be at the disposal of Q.C. "C" Coy.
- 8. Battalion boundaries willbe -North Boundary - V.28.a.10.80. - V.27.a.70.65. - V.27.a.00.60.

Southern Boundary - V.28.c.20.70. - V.27.d.00.50. - V.27.c.70.50.

Inter company boundaries are marked on attached sketch.
