(d) Available from an outside source after departure from Unit. In these cases the soldier must make a written statement showing from whom the money will be obtained, how much is available; and must produce evidence to the satisfaction of his C.O. in support of his statement. He should be warned that an overdraft will not be granted him by the Chief Paymaster and the statement endorsed by C.O., "Satisfactory evidence of availability of funds from an outside source submitted to me and N.C.O. or man (as case may be) warned that an overdraft will not be granted" sent to Staff Paymaster Australian Corps immediately the man proceeds on leave.

"Sufficient funds" when used above means at least seven pounds.
