

The Brigade Commander desires Unit Commanders to explain to their men that the public, as well as the Government of Australia, are bound to form an opinion of the efficiency of the 8th Infantry Brigade bywhat they see on Friday. The men should be reminded that during the march through the streets of the city and whilst forming up they are "at attention" and should march or stand steadily and correctly in their places without talking.

This march is a test of, and practice in, March Discipline. There must be no opening out. Correct distances and correct positions must be maintained.

Orders must be passed as necessary.

Every man, as well as each of the Section, Platoon, and Company and other Officers should remember that the good name of the Brigade rests in his hands.

HQUIPMENT

- (18) Every effort must be made to ensure that all stores, equipment, clothing etc. is complete and ready for embarkation in good time, and that everything is correctly marked. If you cannot obtain the stores etc. which you should receive, you should report the main deficiences at once to Brigade Headquarters in order that the matter may be brought before the Military Board immediately.

KITS AND BAGGAGE. )This Company's Kit and Baggage will remain with including Officers) the balance of Company for transport by road.

The whole baggage should be properly stacked at road end of lines with a baggage party in charge.

Care must be taken that the N.C.O. or man in charge of baggage party has a list giving number of kits and packages which will be checked on arrival at Wharf.

XXXX

BAGGAGE GUARD. Each Company will furnish a baggage Guard of 7 men
The whole under the Command of the Armourer Sergeant.

COMMIND. The Advance Fart, will be under the command of Major Eckersley, who will make all necessary arrangements for early breakfast, and move. Raxxx Every man must have his water bottle full of water and rations for the day in case of emergency.

SEA KIT BAGS. The advance Party willttake their own Sea Kit bags with them and accommodation will be arranged on board ship by 0/C

REPORTING The O/C will report on arrival at Wharf to the Embarkation Staff Officer, and will make all dispositions necessary as requested by that Officer.

TEMPORARY ROLL The O/C of the Advance Party will have a roll of all rank under his Command, and will be responsible that no mamber of his party leaves his duty unless under very exceptional circumstances.

The roll will be called as usual and on arrival of the main body a report will be furnished the Commanding Officer, that every member is present or otherwise.

FATIGUES Each Company will detail sufficient men to assist in loading the baggage at the Camp end.

TPANSPORT

Motor transport will be available at the lines at 10 a.m. when baggage will be loaded without delay. The Orderly Officer will supervise the loading and report any Unit not complying with these orders and instructions.

UNLOADING AT WHARF. The O/C Advance Party will arrange mecessary

REPORT

The O/C Advance Party will communicate with the C/O by special messenger if necessary, on any matters of urgency or special reasons for any alterations in Embarkation Orders, by which the efficient carrying out of embarkation might be assisted.

Sympathetic, but firm measures must be taken to prevent the public from interfering with duty of the men.

Sanitary arrangements must be enforced. This should have personal attention of Officers.

- (i) All clothing and necessaries required by the men for use on the voyage must be packed in the sea kit-bags previous to leaving concentration camps. All the remainder of the men's kit shuld be packed in the valise (if in possession) and kit-bags.
- (11) Sea kit-bags will be taken in the Railway carriages with the men and not in the luggage van.
  - (v) On arrival at the trooping shed, perfect silence is to be observed, and the Commanding Officer, with his Adjutant, sergeant-major, and bugler will get out first. A marker from each Company is to be ready to step out of the train when the bugle sounds. Company Officers to stand by their company carriages; no men to leave the carriages until ordered to do so.

The embarkation will proceed under instructions from the embarkation Staff Officer.

MESSES V111. The men will be told off to messes under the supervision of the Embarking Staff Officer. A subaltern officer will proceed, on board with the first mess of his company,

#### Embarkation Orders No. 4 (Contd)

- MESSES (Contd) and see that the men stow away their sea-kits in the proper place, the Captain following with the last mess of his Company, and no Officer will leave the troop deck until everything is in order.
  - (ix) The orders of railway and embarkation staff Officers are paramount; and are to be considered as emanating from the Military Board.
  - (x) Instructions for non-commissioned officers in charge of troop decks are posted up on the bulk-head of each troop deck, and company Officers are to instruct their non-commissioned officers to carry out the routine.
  - (x1) Names of all persons failing to embark should be notified to the embarkation staff officer, for communication to the Secretary, Defence Department.
  - (x11) Units can help the work materially by strict compliance with the directions of the Embarking Staff, bo the avoiding of any straggling, and the maintenance of silence.
- EMBARKING (c) As each mess is told off, they will be led by a guide from the Advance Party to stow their sea kit bags.

  Note. Nothing is to be hung on the hammock hooks.
  - (d) On the stowage of kits etc. the men will sit down in their messes and keep silence until the final inspection of the ship has been completed.
  - (f) O.C Companies will see that their men are divided into messes, allotted to brths, and instructed in the proper method of rolling bedding and slinging hammocks; that their packs, kit bags and sea kit bags, arms, accourrements, and ammunition (if any) are properly disposed of, and that their necessaries, hammocks, and bedding, when served out, are marked.
  - (h) No smoking is allowed in the docks or on board until orders have been issued to regulate places and times for smoking.
  - (i) Hammocks will be issued immediately after the ship has sailed.
  - (j) The captain of the day (or in his absence the subaltern of the day) as well as the acting quartermaster, will attend all issues of rations and forage.
- SPECIAL NOTICE: After embarkation no member of the A.I.F. is to be allowed to leave the ship without special permission KKKK from O/C Troops.

All Officers are required to be conversant with Kings Regs. governing Embarkation of Troops.
