36th. Battalion A.I.F. WAR DIARY. October 1917.

- 1-10-17 Enemy Shelling country in rear of our position and along ZONNEBEKE ROAD - our Artillery replying. We advanced our right 50 yards closer to Hill 40 in the early morning. Sniping still continues and M.G. Fire along the whole front. Patrols out in "No-man's-land" accounted for a number of enemy in vicinity of LEVI Cottage at dawn. At 2 a.m. a heavy bombardment was opened by our guns and again at dawn. The enemy replied fairly vigorously. Appendix 3.

- 2-10-17 Our Artillery put down practice barrages at dawn and dusk and kept fairly heavy fire on enemy back areas - enemy artillery replying - both sides going in for heavy counter-battery work. Our patrols were out on our front. Appendix 5.
- 3-10-17 Heavy artillery fire from both sides, very little falling on our front line or supports. Aircraft very active from both sides. Our Snipers shot 3 of the enemy in vicinity of LEVI Cottage and Jacob's house. Back areas being heavily shelled. Snipers very active from Hill 40. the 10th. Brigade will attack from our Sector at 6 a.m. tomorrow.
- 4-10-17 At 5 a.m. the 10th. Brigade had taken their places on the jumping off tape, and the Battn. less Scouts who were on No Man's land, moved back and took up a shell-hole position about 600 yards behind the line. At 5-50 a.m. the Scouts under Lieut Mailer, moved back and rejoined their Companies. At 6 a.m. our barrage fell and at 6-8 a.m. the enemy had his barrage down and heavy shell falling on our L. of C. Appendix 6.
A heavy 4.2 barrage lay across BREMEN Redoubt, but just in rear of 36th. Battalion position. We suffered very few Casualties.
- 5-10-17 Enemy prisoners still continue to straggle back. Heavy enemy bombardment over our back Areas. Fairly heavy barrage (intermittent) across BREMEN Redoubt. Capt. A.C. CARMICHAEL hit and evacuated after doing good work in the line.
- 6-10-17 The Battalion under instructions moved from position East of BREMEN Redoubt and marched back through YPRES and embussed near VLAMERTINGHE and arrived at WINNEZEELE at 6-30 p.m. Men very exhausted. Appendix 12
- 7-10-17 Resting and re-organizing.
- 8-10-17 Resting and re-organizing.
- 9-10-17 Resting and re-organizing.
- 10-10-17 Left Camp at WINNEZEELE and moved in buses to Camp at CAVALRY FARM East of YPRES. Appendix 7.
- 11-10-17 Organizing for Operations and commenced Approach March (Phase "V" Battle of YPRES) Appendix 2.

Excellent work was done by Officers and men alike the most outstanding work being mentioned in my report to Brigade, mentioned above.

13-10-17 I received instructions to take Command of the front line. I issued instructions to C.Os. 34th. and 35th. Battalions to re-organize at dawn and to hold line as follows:--

35th. Battalion Right Battalion.
36th. Battalion Center Battalion.
34th. Battalion Left Battalion.

this was done and consolidation proceeded with. Shelling of our position and points immediately in rear of it was at times very heavy. 5.9, 4.2, and 77 m.m. being used. Our bombardment of enemy points appeared to be very light, and our barrages throughout the battle much lighter than any yet experienced by this Battalion. On the other hand the Boche bombardment was the heaviest I have experienced, and only for the very soft ground smothering he shell burst very few men would have got through it. This Battalion was relieved by the 44th. Battalion 11th. Bde A.I.F. relief commencing about 7 p.m. and was complete about 11 p.m. the Battalion moving back along Railway Line to BOSTON FARM. The Battalion took up a shell-hole position near JACOB'S HOUSE. All ranks very exhausted.

14-10-17 Resting

15-10-17 Moved up to front line and relieved 42nd. Battn. in support at AUGUSTUS WOOD relief being complete by 7 pm. Enemy heavily shelled our position and ABRAHAM HEIGHTS with 5.9, 4.2 and whizzbang, a few 8" being noted and much Gas Shell (Mustard)

16-10-17 Consolidation position. Heavy shelling still continued with much Gas Shell during hours of darkness. A few men led back practically blind from Gas effect.

17-10-17 Heavy shelling during early hours of morning with conditions much the same as 16th. Very few casualties considering weight of Boche shelling. New Zealand troops caught it heavy on ABRAHAM HEIGHTS.



APPROACH MARCH.

The 36th. Battalion left CAVALRY CAMP at 7 p.m. on 11-10 1917. the Battalion marched in single file and the going up to the vicinity of POTSDAM was fair, at this point the enemy commenced shelling the route (Railway Line) from direction of BROOCKENBROODHOEK with whiz-bang 4.2 and Gas Shell. At point D.26.b.90.40 this Battalion met with its first casualties of the battle. Going then became slower, but as we had lots of time in hand it caused no anxiety. Owing to Gas, Respirators had to be frequently used causing occasional breaks in the line, as the route was badly cut up by shell, positions being very boggy - so much so that many men had to be pulled out who could not get out unaided. The tapes had been all blown away or mostly so, making caution as to direction necessary. From ZONNEBEKE Railway Station the shelling became heavier and at point D.16.d.60.25 it became a regular barrage aimed at route, and continued right up to tape. During the Approach March this Battalion had sustained over 100 casualties including one Officer

THE ASSEMBLY.

The Assembly was slow owing to the fact that the ground on left of Railway, and in rear of tape was impassable even in daylight, causing the whole Brigade to move in single file; this added to the Boche barrage, which was particularly heavy about point D.17.c.23.86 was no doubt accountable for slowness. At 4-48 my leading Company commenced to file in. At this time a portion of 43rd. Battalion (11th. Brigade) together with some troops of the 4th. Division began to move back along Railway line, making matters very difficult. I remained at Road Crossing D.17.c.23-86 keeping the men closed up and the other troops clear of them - this resulted in getting "B" "C" & "D" Companies in quickly. "A" Company, which was reserve, got badly entangled with troops moving back, and at ZERO hour half of them only being in position - this portion I sent in rear of frontage. The remainder got up and into position during the wait at the RED line.

THE BATTLE.

At ZERO the assaulting troops were quickly off the tapes at first lift of barrage; at ZERO plus 8 minutes the boche 5.9 barrage fell across the Cemetery and center of AUGUSTUS WOOD, his lighter stuff remaining on a line D.17.c.23.86 and the "T" in DAB. TRENCH, falling back over SEINE and along the Railway Line very heavily. The Boche 5.9 barrage was very heavy, the soft ground however limiting very much the effective zone of burst, but even then casualties were very heavy, and the number of direct hits from shell was remarkable. The 34th. Battalion moved on with the barrage, but the 35th. and 36th. Battalions had their hands full mopping up the dugouts which in all cases coming under my own personal observation were undamaged by our barrage. The first stick-up we had and the most serious was at a dugout (Pill-box) at point D.17.b.12.83, which held up portion of the 35th. and 36th. Battalions for an hour, and which resulted in many casualties. The portion of both Battalions engaged, doing excellent work, worked round the objective, which was proof against grenades; the stronghold surrendered on being surrounded resulting in capture of 6 machine Guns and 80 Boche, besides a good number killed in the fight. The RED line was reached to time, no other serious stick-up being experienced. On barrage lifting the 35th. Battalion pressed on towards the BLUE Line but had not gone far before they encountered a very heavy machine Gun barrage from direction of CREST FARM AND PASSCHENDAELE. The left Company of 35th. Battalion was practically wiped out and my left Company filled the breach. There was no sign of 10th. Brigade on our left.

Narrative YPRES Battle Phase 5.THE BATTLE (Continued).

The BLUE Line was reached on our extreme left only, and by the time that point had been reached my Left Company had been very much reduced in numbers. I sent all available men forward from RED Line together with what remained of Reserve Company to attempt capture of GREEN Line. Casualties were so heavy and our Reserve Companies all used up that a further advance was impossible. I ordered the line then held to be consolidated and to be held pending reinforcements. Major Carr, the Senior Officer in the line decided that this was impossible in face of the terrific Machine Gun fire and the heavy barrage which the Boche put down on the line from points just beyond the Green Line. After capture of RED Line a few snipers gave trouble from AUGUSTUS WOOD until a party was detailed to go over and mup them up. They shot several of our stretcher-bearers. Major BUCHANAN was killed soon after leaving the RED Line during the fighting round TIBER COPSE where remnants of my Battalion had to assist 35th. Battalion. Very little of "D" Company escaped the Machine Gun and Artillery Barrage at this point where it was particularly heavy. Captain GOLDRICK reported at 9-30 that he was on BLUE Line at left of Brigade Sector and in a very tight corner and unable to proceed further, the Reserve Company having by this time been absorbed in attack on BLUE line; soon after writing above GOLDRICK was wounded and handed over to Captain GADD. Reports continued to come in from front line troops that consolidation in face of heavy machine Gun fire Snipers and 5.9 barrage was impossible and that casualties were piling up at an alarming rate. During the afternoon Boche were seen in force on PASSCHENDAELE Road advancing on our flank and from the front ENLIST FARM & ECHO COPSE. At dusk, Major CARR decided that it was impossible to hold on and a new line was formed from AUGUSTUS WOOD to intersection of PASSCHENDAELE ROAD and Railway in D.17.b. At dawn I ordered re-organization of the three Battalions in the line which was done and 33rd. Battalion moved back to reserve position. Consolidation was carried on with all despatch until relief.

Splendid and Gallany Service was rendered by the following:

Lieutenant. W.J. GORDON 36th. Battalion. When his senior Officers had been killed and wounded, he displayed splendid leadership, collecting men of all Battalions and re-organizing fresh attacks. His splendid example did much to keep the Troops he came in contact with in good fighting spirit.

- GENERAL. 1. On a day and at an hour to be communicated later the 9th. Australian Infantry Brigade will attack a portion of enemy trenches running North East. The right of advance will be the Railway Line, and the left a line running South of PASSCHENDAELE, as per Maps in the hands of Company Commanders. The 10th. Australian Infantry Brigade will be on our left, and an Australian Division will be operating on our Right.
- OBJECTIVES. 2. Three (3) in number.
The RED Line.
The BLUE Line.
The GREEN DOTTED Line.
the GREEN and GREEN DOTTED Lines only entering the left of our Frontage (a distance of about 200 yards) as far as ENLIST FARM.
- ALLOTMENT OF OBJECTIVES. 3. 34th. Battalion ("A" Battalion) will capture the RED Line, the 35th. Battalion ("B" Battalion) the BLUE Line, 36th. Battalion ("C" Battalion) the GREEN and GREEN DOTTED Line, 33rd. Battalion ("D" Battalion) Brigade Reserve.
- PROTECTIVE BARRAGE. 4. The protective barrage will rest on line approximately 200 yards beyond jumping off tape for a period of eight (8) minutes, advancing at the rate of 100 yds. in eight (8) minutes, and will lift from the protective barrage line, 200 yards East of objectives at the following times.
The RED Line. Lifts at ZERO plus 3 hours.
The BLUE Line. Lifts at ZERO plus 5 hours.
The GREEN DOTTED Line - Lifts at ZERO plus 6 hrs. 30 minutes.
A Machine Gun barrage will precede the Artillery barrage by 200 yards.
- DISTRIBUTION 5. Three Companies will form assaulting lines, one Company Reserve. "D" Company will be right Company, "C" Company Center Company, "B" Company left Company "A" Company Reserve.
- FORMATION. 6. Assault Companies will have two (2) Platoons in a line of skirmishes covering allotted frontage. One Platoon in lines of Sections, moving in file 30 yds. in rear of skirmishes. One Platoon with Sections in diamond formation approximately 50 yards in rear of line of Sections. Reserve Company will move with its Platoons in diamond formation, at a distance to suit the tactical situation.
- ACTION. 7. When the BLUE Line has been seized by "B" Battalion the 36th. Battalion will leap-frog through them and take up position directly under barrage, ready to move as soon as the lift takes place. the 35th. Bn. will detail one Company to follow in rear of our
left/

7. left Company for the purpose of attacking PASSCHENDAELE from the South, thus rendering assistance to the 10th. Brigade (37th. Battalion) When the GREEN DOTTED Line has been reached, the Reserve Company Commander will confer with the left Company Commander regarding progress of the 37th. Battalion, and if this Battalion has been unable to fight its way through PASSCHENDAELE and secure the GREEN DOTTED Line, the Reserve Company will side-slip to the North and gain touch with the NEW ZEALANDERS who will side-slip South, thus pocketing PASSCHENDAELE.
- When the protective barrage lifts from the GREEN DOTTED Line, the Reserve Company will move forward, together with the left of our Left Company and occupy the GREEN Line: if on the other hand the 37th. Battalion have occupied the GREEN DOTTED Line in time to move forward with the barrage on to the GREEN Line, the Reserve Company will move on in rear of our own assaulting line. When the GREEN Line has been reached, the leading wave of assaulting line will mop up the country as close to the protective barrage as possible, and when this has been accomplished two platoons of Reserve Company will leap-frog through the assaulting line and will occupy STRONG POINTS to be selected 100 Yards in front of the geographical situation of the GREEN Line. The line which has done the Mopping Up will then move back on to the GREEN Line and commence consolidation.
- CONSOLIDATION WILL BE DONE WITH A VIEW TO FIELD OF FIRE AND NEED NOT BE QUITE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE GREEN LINE AS LAID DOWN ON THE MAP.

MARCH.

1. The Order of march in the APPROACH MARCH will be:-

"B" Company.
 "C" Company.
 "D" Company.
 2 Sections 9th. Machine Gun Company.
 "A" Company.
 2 Sections 9th. Light Trench Mortar Battery.
 Headquarters.

During the APPROACH MARCH Units will move in single file, and if in darkness will keep in close touch with the Unit in front of them. Each Unit in rear of "B" Company will detail an N.C.O. and 1 runner to attach themselves to the rear of the preceding Unit to maintain touch and liaison throughout the APPROACH MARCH. It is imperative that Company Officers and Section Commanders press forward along the route marked, irrespective of difficulties met with.

When the right of the tape has been reached, the leading Company will wheel to the left and move along the tape to their position, the two platoons of the front line in all cases leading. When the last man of the second platoon has reached the right of the Company frontage he will halt and the platoon forming the line of Sections in the rear of the skirmishing line will file along and take up position in rear of the platoons for whom they are to "mop up".

The Reserve Platoon will file along in rear of the 2nd. Line, both platoons remaining in line until ZERO, picking up their distance and formation after our present front line has been well passed, to clear if possible, enemy barrage.

VICKERS GUNS 2.

One Gun directly in rear of right of "B" Company.
 One gun directly in rear of center of "D" Company.

TRENCH MORTARS
AND CARRYING 3.
PARTIES.

One gun approximately in rear of the left of center Company.
 One gun approximately in rear of right of center Coy. both with Vickers guns and Trench Mortars well closed up to Units they are supporting to reduce depth and to quickly clear our own front line.
 Reserve Company will file immediately in rear of Trench Mortars and for the purpose of assembly will be in line, gaining formation and position after our own front line has been passed.
 At ZERO the assaulting wave of 36th. Battalion will clear our front line as closely to 35th. Battalion as possible, gaining distance as the attack proceeds.
 "A" Company will detail 20 men (10 men to accompany each Stokes' Mortar) for carrying party. Should they be required to fight en route the ammunition will be dumped and brought up later.

MOPPERS UP

4. The line of Sections in rear of assaulting line are MOPPERS UP and it is of the utmost importance that this be done as quickly and as effectively as possible ensuring that no armed Boche are left in dugouts or shell-holes.

The following copy of 3rd. Australian Division letter No. S.G. 7/75 is forwarded for your information:-

" The attention of Unit Commanders is drawn to the great importance of providing a sufficient number of flares for contact patrols work not only on day of attack, but on subsequent days.

Officers in the line must not understand that it is essential that the position of our advanced troops must be known in order ~~to~~ that artillery assistance may be arranged and that they must not consider the possibility of the enemy obtaining information through the lights of flares.

On several occasions in recent operations, our troops have suffered through the failure to use flares."

36TH. BATTALION A.I.F. OPERATION CIRCULAR.In the Field
2-10-1917.

1. On "R/S" night, Battalions of the 10th. and 11th. Australian Infantry Brigades will go forward and the 35th. and 36th. Battalions will move back to a reserve position (location of reserve position will be notified later) and the 33rd. and 34th. Battalions will move back to YPRES SOUTH.
2. The 10th. and 11th. Australian Infantry Brigades will be responsible for taking their own positions of assembly on "Q/R" and routes.
3. (a) The front line of the assembly for 10th. and 11th. Infantry Brigades i.e. the line to be taped, will be from point D.21.d.2.1. to road intersection at D.20.b.80.95.
(b) If any part of the above line is found to be considerably forward of our leading troops, the taping of that part may be done on our side of, but parallel to, that line.
(c) The 35th. and 36th. Battalions will arrange that none of our troops are left out forward of this assembly line after ZERO minus 30 minutes, even if this involves temporarily relinquishing any forward points or trenches.
4. The barrage will open 150 yards in front of this Assembly line will stand in that position for three minutes, and then lift. The point of junction with the 7th. Brigade 2nd. Division will be at D.21.d.2.1.
5. The C.Os. 35th. and 36th. Battalions will arrange for active patrolling of the front, throughout the hours of darkness, but not later than ZERO minus 30 minutes (vide para 4(c)).
6. Note special instructions re disposal of this order.

Arrangements for "S.O.S."

1. When an S.O.S. signal is received, all barrages will go down on their protective lines as indicated in Appendix 3.
2. "A" Barrage will fire on their protective line at two rounds per gun per minute for fifteen minutes, and then cease fire.
3. B, C, D, E Barrages will fire for two minutes on their protective lines, and then creep forward for 500 yards by lifts of 100 yards every two minutes, jumping back to their protective lines for two minutes before ceasing fire.
18-pdrs will fire two rounds per gun per minute, other natures in proportion.
4. If no further message is then received, the Artillery Barrage will cease but "C" Barrage will continue for a further three minutes.
5. If the "S.O.S." signal or message is repeated within five minutes of the end of the above periods, the procedure will be repeated.
6. The above instructions are issued to avoid, as far as possible any unnecessary expenditure of ammunition.
