Sir,

I have made a full enquiry into the question of patrolling the coast westward to SOLLUM.

I find that horses are unsuitable for the work and owing to a shortage of camels I regret to say that I am at present unable to undertake this duty.

I intend, however, as soon as camels are available, to arrange for the patrolling of the coast 25 miles to the East and West of both MERSAH MATRUH and SOLLUM. These patrols will stop gun and supply running but the assistance of Naval patrols will still be required to prevent submarines shelling our posts along the coast, and to protect supply ships proceeding to MERSAH MATRUH and SOLLUM.

I will inform you as soon as the camel patrols at these two places have been organized.

I understand that Sir John Maxwell agreed with you to despatch a brigade of British infantry to KHARTOUM, and if you wish me to send it, I will of course do my best to comply with your wishes. At the same time I earnestly hope that the necessity for sending more British troops to KHARTOUM may not arise, as owing to the number of troops withdrawn from EGYPT to FRANCE, the force under my command is at present only just large enough to carry out its functions.

- (2) With regard to the administration of martial law, Field Service Regulations Part II, Chapter III, Section 10 gives a clear interpretation of your duties.
- (3) The primary responsibility for the safety of the O.C.DEC.
 Sultan rests with the Egyptian Army at CAIRO or wherever he may be residing, in co-operation with the Civil Police authorities, but any Defence Scheme would, of course, deal with action to be taken to safeguard the Sultan's person in the event of any disaffection among his bodyguard.
- (4) There is no reason why the military police should HARVEY not co-operate with the Civil Police under Repkinson

 Pasha. My instructions G.S. 146/1 show that an Assistant

 Provost Marshal is allowed for your staff. These instructions also show the staff allotted to you.







In the Eastern Theatre two Companies seem essential for the QATIA District. In Nos. 1 and 2 Sections of the Canal Defences, the two existing Bikanir Camel Companies will be by no means sufficient if any threat should be made by the enemy against the Canal. One more Company has therefore been allowed for for each of these sections. They will form a most valuable part of the section Mobile Columns, a duty for which the Bikanir Camel Companies are not available owing to their dispersion on patrol duty along the whole front.

No provision has been made for a Company in the FAYUM or for a Reserve Company at present, since I understand you wish to keep our immediate requirements down to a minimum.

I had a long consultation with Major Smith, at present in command of the Camel Corps School at ABBASSIA. This officer has great experience in training and command of Camel Corps and also of their organisation and equipment. He also has great knowledge of the camel itself and has selected the riding camels for the existing Imperial Camel Corps Companies.

The Camel Corps School under his command can turn out, with its present staff, two trained Companies per month,

counting from the date on which the necessary personnel, animal and equipment are collected at the School.

6. As regards the provision of the necessary personnel for the six new companies which it is proposed to form, about 30 officers and 840 men will be required. I suggest that the officers could readily be found from the dismounted Yeomanry units which at present contain a disproportionately large number of officers in view of their strength. These officers would, mossover, be of excellent class and most suitable.

As regards the other ranks, the number required, distributed over the whole Egyptian Expeditionary Force, is not large enough to be likely to present any difficulty.

As regards the provision of camels, you will notice that practically no expense will be involved beyond what has already been incurred.

I beg to report that I have inspected the camels in draught now in training at the School of Instruction, ZEITOUN, and have taken them out about 9 miles into the desert to the them over rough ground.

The team consisted of six camels - ride lead and ride centre ridden by drivers.

They were hooked into an 18-pdr. limbered empty wagon, 2 gunners on the limber, and 2 on the body.

The harness is not yet satisfactory. I understand the weight of the pole supporting bar should not come on the neck of the animal which it does at present. Also camels will not take breaching, there is therefore nothing to hold back the vehicle going down a slope or pulling up. I think this could be done by a strap attached to the pole supporting bar and passing round the back of the camel's hump.

The camels appeared to be fairly handy but very slow. They do not like going up a steep rise and are inclined to lie down; drivers must be handy with their whips and be constantly at them.

Teams will work much better when the drivers understand their animals- also the drivers should be taught how to encourage them by voice.

I consider the pedrail is far the best sand tyre I have seen. We have experimented with several different kinds, both on the Canal and in Arabia. It is very handy to put on or take off, and in my opinion very satisfactory. Some of the links were faulty and broke, but this can be remedied. Owing to the pedrail the brake has to be removed from the vehicle, therefore there is nothing to prevent the carriage from running on top of the wheelers when going down a steep gradient. The gunners could be dismounted and hold back with drag ropes but this is a slow

process.

I consider a battery with camels would march at about of miles an hour. Coming into action and going out of action would be slow.

It takes some time for the men to get accustomed to camels; they find no difficulty in riding them, but they are nervous at handling them at first

I do not consider that four camels would be sufficient for the draught in heavy sand. In my opinion camel draught has no advantage over horse draught, except over a waterless desert in which case I would strongly recommend it.


