

			aerodrome. Cadet WARREN was killed. The instructor, although badly shaken,	-
			suffered no injury. The Court of Enquiry on the accident found that the pupil got	
			the machine into the spin the instructor not being able to get the machine out	
			owing to insufficient height. Cadet WARREN was buried in NEWPORT Cemetery, LINCOLN.
