

Marched out at 10.45 a.m. and entrained at KILMARNOCK SIDING - near LA CLYTTE - at 12 noon, detraining at SPOIL BANK from which point Coys. moved independent- ly into the line, relieving the 45th and 46th AUSTRALIAN INFANTRY BATTALIONS. Relief completed at 7.10 p. m. Battalion boundaries - on right, line running from 0.6.d.90.35 to 0.6. central; on left, line running from J 32 d 15 to J 31 central and thence West along grid through I 36 central. Battalion Headquarters I 36 c 95. Defence system was, "A" A line of outposts divided into four groups, each group having four posts garrisoned by 8 men each. "B" Support line extending from 0.6.b.87 to J.31.c.56 garrisoned by 4 sections forming a nucleus force on which to build up in case of attack, with two platcons in Chateau Dugouts I.36.d.44. "C" Reserve Line, Railway Trench 0.6.a.54. to 0.6.a.39 and Reserve Trench I.36.c.93 to I.36.d.27 with one Company as garrison. HOLLEBEKE	1918 Jan25 26 27 28		Foggy fire and little fire from our or enemy artillery. Enemy fire quiet, ours normal. Ehemy artillery very active. OLAF AVENUE and support line shelled at intervals throughout the 24 hours. Our artillery active in reply. Enemy patrol approached one of our posts, and was fired on, one being killed. His body was searched and identification proved normal. Enemy put over 15 Gas shells at 8.15 p. m. on OLAF AVENUE and FUSILIER WALK. Our artillery showed usual activity. Our aircraft very active. Enemy artillery fairly quiet; ours very active. Throughout our occupation of the line enemy machine guns were quiet by day, but fairly accurate and consistent fire was maintained at night over the forward parts of our sector. We were relieved on the night of the 29/30 January by the 14th Battalion, A.I.F., the relief being complete at 8.15 p.m. We marched to TOURNAI CAMP N.10.b. moving independently by Companies. - the GERMANS have been driven back to the line CLERY HAUT ALLAINES DRIENCOURT LIERANONT VILLERS TEMPLEUX-le-GRERARD with a
 salient having its Apex at LIERANONT out of which his troops were
 forced on night 30th/31st December.
- The 110th Regiment (13th and 14th Battalions) after being driven out of LIERAMONT is in fighting touch with the BRITISH outposts which occupy the high ground in D.18.c. and d. and E.13.a. The BRITISH attack from SAULCOURT with LONGAVESHES as objective was repulsed at 8.a.m. on 31st December. The patrols from AIXS-COURT-LE-BAS report BRITISH concentration N.W. of that village dispersed by artillery fire but small parties still remain in BOIS-de-EPINETTS.

"B" FORCE (commanded by Lieut-Sclonel T.P. MoSHARRY,

- 1. The Fifth Army has been corating against the GERMANS on a front of About & miles and on 1st January after 48 hours spent in replanishing ammunition, stores, etc. 1st ANZAC has been ordered to resume the offensive at 10.20.a.m. on the LIELAMONT Salient. Indications point to the GERMANS evaduating that salient.
- The 4th Aust. Livision is holding the line near LIERAMONT with one Brigade 'the 4th Brigade' in, which unit succeeded in driving the enemy out of LIERAMONT on night 30th/31st and establishing its outposts on the high ground in L.18.3. 4 d. and E.13.a. enemy patrols still agressive.
- Tho 4th Aust. Division with 4th Brigade as Advanced Guard has been given the high ground between BOIS-do-TINCOURT and TEMPLOUX-LA-FOSEE as objective.
 - The 2nd Aust. Livision with Eth Erigade as Advanced Guard has been ordered to seize AIZECCURT-LE-EAS then advance on TEMPLE IX-LA-Fubile ou-operating with the 41st British Livision from the direction of ET. FIERRE FARM.
 - The 1st Aust. Livision with 1st Brigade as Advanced Guard has been allotted ECNGAVESNES as First Objective and eventually joining with 4th Aust. Livision at TINCOURT WOOL J. S.a.
- The 18th Battalion is holding the Cutpest Line and G.C.J.

 4th Brigade details 18th Battalion to form the VANGIARD with 18th
 Eattalion and 4th T.M. Battery as Mainguard, "A" and "B" Battalions
 noving in echelon on the right and left flanks respectively.
- E. The C.C. VANCTARE is ordered to cover a frontage of about 1000 yards with his centre directing on a true bearing of 138 degrees.




