



AREA HOLLEBEKE 1/10,000	1918 reb 25 25 27 28		and at cenclusion of bombardment an enemy party of 18 other ranks rushed one of our posts (4.P.1) It was driven offby the garrison leaving two prisoners in our hands. Our casualties 2 slightly wounded. Prisoners informed us that some of the enemy raiding party were wounded. Artillery and machine gun fire were normal on both sides. Our bombing planes were active during the day. Artillery and a.o. fire normal. D. Coy. were relieved by A. Coy. in outpost line and moved into meserve line. Helief passed off quietly.  Innemy and our artillery showed normal activity and aircraft were normally active.  Enemy artillery fire was above the usual, Potsdam group and support line being shelled fairly heavily. M. G. fire lively on both sides at night.	
			General remarks on tour in line up to date:-  ENEMY. Enemy's attitude is alert and his artillery and m.G. fire is active and accurate. He registered quietly, all over the sector - mostly with field guns and mortars. His aircraft flew low nearly every morning over our front and reserve lines. His patrols were not aggressive and not many were seen. Ours easily kept command of so man's land.	
			OURSELVES. A rigorous system of patrols was carried out. Each outpost had its listening post out in front and at frequent intervals liason patrols kept touch with flanking posts and units. In addition each group covered the ground out to their immediate front with local protective patrols, whilst so man's Land as a whole was covered by investigating and fat fighting patrols, from dusk to dawn. Defences were improved - every available man being put on to the work we concentrated on wiring the outpost and support lines and improving and strengthening the support trench, this being the most urgent work to be done. Our raiding party was out each night reconneitring the places they proposed to raid, but Division decided that the raid would not take place as the identification required was obtained from the two prisoners captured by us when enemy raided on 25th reb. The weather was fine and the health of the troops good. Food arrangements worked very satisfactorily, and men were supplied with two hot meals daily. Casualties during our tour, 2 Other manks died of wounds, 25 Other manks wounded. Strength of Battalien 41 Officers and 707 Other ranks, excluding detached.

- All Lewis Guns and 12 magazines per gun will be loaded on limber at 2.30 9. p, m. at Q. M. Store and taken under guard of Lewis Gunners from "B" Coy. to SPOIL BANK from whence they will be carried to line. Eight extra magazines per gun will be dumped at Q. M. Store by midday and sent by Q. M. to MOLEN DUMP, with rations, to be held in reserve.

- 1. A party of 2 Officers and 40 other ranks will raid enemy post at P.1.c.10.40. on night 27/28 February 1918 at about 7.30 p.m.
- 2. Object of raid is to secure identification and live prisoners if possible.
- 3. This party will be supplied by C. Coy and be under command of Lieut. W. Goninon.
- 4. Composition of party 2 Officers and 40 O/R of this 1 Officer and 15 O/R will rush post.

  Remainder 1 Officer and 25 O/R will protect both flanks and cover withdrawal to our lines.
- 5. This operation will be in the form of a silent raid.
- 6. Party will move out from HESSIAN WOOD Group along a taped route.
- 7. The raid will be carried out without Artillery, Trench Mortar or Machine Gun co-operation.
- 8. It is desired that Artillery adhere to present normal shooting.
- 9. It is desired that Artillery do not shoot on P.1.c.10.40. or PIN HOUSE until after night of raid.

- 2. From information received, the post consists of five Pill Boxes with a garrison of thirty and two Machine Guns.
- 3. The object of the raid is to secure live prisoners.
