

			Battalion busy training and re-organising. During the morning the whole Battalion with all available Transport went for a Route March of about 9 kilos. Dress marching order. During afternoon a Soccer match was played between the 15th and 16th Battalions, and we lost by five to one.	
	2		Training carried out as per Syllabus.	
	3		Training as per Syllabus. At 5.30 p.m. classes in French, Mathematics, English and Bookkeeping commenced, and are to be held nightly. A large amount of interest has been shown by the men.	
	4		The morning was spent in cleaning up and getting into shape for Brigade Parade. At 2 p.m. the whole Brigade paraded and were inspected by the G.O.C., Division, who afterwards addressed the Brigade and decorated a few Officers and N.C.O's., one of whom was C.S.M. RUSH, C.	
			who received the French CROIX de GUERRE with Star. At 4.30 p.m. the Officers of the 14th and 15th Battalions congregated at CROUY to wish General BRAND, C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O., who is going on leave to Australia "Bon Voyage."

	7		Training as per Syllabus. The debating class has proved a great success, and much interest has been shown by members of the Battalion, and there have been large attendances. The subject discussed on the evening of the 7th inst. was, "Should Australia maintain a standing Army in times of Peace." After a very lively discussion, the question was decided in the negative.

A matech against the 49th Battalion today resulted in a win for our Rugger team by 8 to 0. In addition, inter-Company matches in both Soccer and Rugby Football are being played. The series have been arranged into a competition, and the members of the finning Company's team will receive medals. Tennis still attracts its particular devotees.

Government, Opposition, Independent, and Socialist. A very large audience attended, including the A/G.O.C. Brigade. A vote taken on the principle of the Secret Ballot resulted in the election of the Independent Candidate.

	16		Murky overhead, but no rain fell. Today witnessed the opening match of the Brigade Rugby Football Competition. Our team were opposed by their old rivals the 13th Battalion. The Debating Society set themselves the task of discussing a very interesting subject "What is the best means of absorbing the Army after demobolization without unduly interfering with Social and Economic progress." APPENDIX / PRELIMINARY NOTES on SPECIAL EXERCISE to be carried out

15th BATTALION, next week.

The general idea of scheme is an attack on an enemy outpost system. 1. somewhat similar to actual attack carried out by Battalion near LE JEANCOURT.

Advance will be about 5000 yards carried out as an attack in two 2. phases, two Coys. taking one objective and two Coys. "leapfrogging"

> "C" Company will attack on Right and "B" do do Left.


Right Support in first phase "D" Company "A" Company. Left do do

- 3. On reaching their objectives, Coys. will dig in.
- The piece of ground selected for the exercise is (Sheete 62 E). 4. Sqs. C.30, D.25. J.1, 2, 3, 9.
- 5. The jumping off line will be taped out, and the Battalion will march to the position on the morning of Zero day. Zero hour will be about 5.30 a. m.
- Dress will be fighting order (without ball ammunition or bombs). 6. Plenty of smoke granades will be carried.
- Gas rattles will be provided for each Lewis Gun.
- The enemy will be represented by the 16th Battalion under the command 8. of Major PARKS, M.C.
