





DESCRIPTION OF COUNTRY ON MARCH ROUTE FROM PRISCHES TO WALCOURT.

The thoroughness with which the retreating Hun had wrecked the Railway line and blown up bridges, culverts and dumps impressed one throughout the march. No one who saw the exploded dump and munition train at AVESNELLES Siding is ever likely to forget it. But apart from these, the evidences of war were few; the land was undevastated, a shell hole a rarity, while the few gutted houses in each village, burnt it was learned by the Hun in his '14 advance, might have been the result of a mere civilian fire.

The country itself was of the most picturesque: a very large proportion is pasture land and so, despite the season did not present the usual barren appearance, undulating, dotted with farms and crossed with hedges and tree lined roads its aspect made amends for the inclement

weather.

On 3rd.October 1918 he took part as a Platoon Commander in an attack on the BEAUREVOIF J.FONSOMME Line, hear ESTREES, North of ST.QUENTIN.  His Company Commander was severely wounded soon after the jump off and Lieut.MAXWELL at once took charge of the Company.  When the enemy wire was reached, they were met by a hail of machine gun fire and suffered considerable casualties including all other officers of the company. The wire at this point was six belts thick, each belt being 25 to 30 feet wide. Lieut.MAXWELL pushed forward single handed through the wire and attacked the most dangerous machine gun. He personally killed three of the crew and the remaining four men in the post surrendered to him with a machine gun. His company followed him through the wire and captured the trenches forming their objective.  Later, but was noticed that the Company on his left was held up in the wire by a very strong force on the left flank of the Battalion. He at once organised a party and moved to the left to endeavour to attack the enemy from the rear. Heavy machine gun fire met them. Lieut.MAXWELL again dashed forward single handed at the foremost machine gun, and with his revolver shot five of its crew, so silencing the gun. Owing to the work of this party, the left Company was then able to work a small force through the wire and eventually to occupy the objective and mop up the trenches. Lieut.MAXWELL and two men with this prisoner, walked to a post, containing more than twenty Germans. The latter at once seized them and disarmed them. Lieut. MAXWELL waited his chance and then with an automatic pistol which he had concealed in his box respirator, shot two of the enemy and with the two men escaped. They were pursued by rifle fire, and one man wounded. However, Lieut. MAXWELL organised a party at once, attacked and captured the post.  Throughout the day, this young officer set a most remarkable example of personal bravery, tempered with excellent judgment and aggressive decision. There is no doubt that, had it not been for his personal dash, the operation could not have succeeded as quickly as it did. He handled a most involved situation with very fine leadership. 

Education classes, under the A.I.F. Educational Scheme, were commenced in this unit whilst at PRISCHES but wowing to unsuitable accommodation little was accomplished. Subjects of general education such as Reading, Writing, Spelling and Arithmetic were carried on by companies whilst for a number of evenings a miniature debating society afforded entertainment to a proportionate number of men.

The village of WALCOURT, near CHARLEROI (BELGIUM) to which the Battalion is moving shortly and of which village we have heard so many encouraging statements, promises to afford adequate propertunities for ideal education classes and lectures and so plans have been made for the carrying out of the scheme when the Battalion arrived

there.

AT WALCOURT. Quite a big village and pleasantly situated and will come up to the promised expectations. The Boche however have removed a vast quantity of seating accommodation and this will need to be replaced before classes can properly begin. After a week however a truck load of timber which the Huns failed to remove has been converted by the Bn. Pioneers into forms and tables and quite a number of big classes are established. For example conversed and quite a number of big classes are of 55 was instituted at the Technical School WALCOURT and this will increase by the next lesson. Eight other well attended classes are in operation.

The Battalion Parliament, which owes its origin to the Bn. Education Scheme enterprise also promises to be a real success.

The early part of December, as far as the personnel of the Transport Section is concerned was one of the most disastrous periods of the war. No less than 25% of the section, mostly drivers of long experience - having been evacuated, suffering from the then very prevalent disease 'Spanish Influenza'. Of the men evacuated, 1323.Dvr.W.C.FELLEW who was one of the 'oldest' drivers and one of the most respected and popular lads in the Battalion - died. He was buried in the British Military Cemetery LE CATEAU. A regimental cross was made and placed over his grave by comrades of his old section.

From the beginning until the middle of December we were billetted at PRISCHES. During our stay there, there was much difficulty in getting rations and fodder up to the Battalion - owing to our lines of communication the railway having been disorganised by the destructive work of 'delayed action' Hun mines. However Motor Transport was substituted and with the untiring energies of our 15th.Coy.A.A.S.C. the difficulties were overcome.

The men were billeted in comparative comfort considering the desolation and the destitution of the inhabitants of the village, which

had been occupied by the Huns s ince September 1914.

The animals - horses and mules - benefited greatly by having splendid stables which had previously been occupied by horses and cows -

these having been commandeered by the "uns.

The work at PRISCHES consisted chiefly of drawing rations from the Refilling Point, trips to Ordnance, and Canteen, also a daily job for the benefit of the civil population - that of drawing coal from a dump which the Huns had established eleven kilometres from PRISCHES. The coal was greatly appreciated by the destitute civilians as the cold weather was just about due.

As frosts were anticipated it was necessary to shoe the animals with the special shoe which allows of the screwing in of cogs to prevent the

animals slipping.

Just prior to our departure from PRISCHES Major General ROSENTHAL our Divisional Commander, held an inspection of vehicles - one or two from each section of Transport in the Division. This inspection was for the purpose of ensuring uniformity throughout the Division. Re-adjustment in the fitting of harness and the wearing of some parts of the harness. which in some cases was considered as lumber was ordered. Also the polishing of all moving parts of the limber and harness as well as chains, together with the polishing of practically all the metal work on the vehicles. This gives the outfit a very smart appearance and may be alright in Peace time but under the present service conditions the polishing entails much work which is very much against the grain of those who do it and have to see it is done. Winter, with its mud, cold and rain does not improve matters particularly when the necessary oil etc. is at a premium.

After leaving PRISCHES we marched to AVESNELLES - a distance of about 15 kilos (roughly 10 miles) There we staged for the night. In about the most convenient place one could choose, men, horses, harness, vehicles

all being under cover and water handy.

The following day (18/12/18) we continued our march towards COLOGNE - GERMANY) staging the night at a small village called SIVRY. From there we marched about eight miles to BARBENCON crossing the FRANCO-BELGIAN border and passing by the house where (according to rumour) the German plenipotentiaries signed the terms of the Armistice. Close by here was a German gun said to have been captured by the Manchester Regiment at the 'Eleventh' hour of the war.

After staging the night at BARBENCON we continued and completed another series of marches on arriving at WALCOURT.

From the time we left PRISCHES nothing eventful happened and the marches were very normal.

Here in WALCOURT, men, animals and harness are under cover, men and animals being particularly comfortable.

The men's food is equal to that which they were getting when the battalion was first line troops. The animals fodder stands at about the same ration has hitherto..

During the march from PRISCHES we had the assistance of six men from our Divisional S.A.A.Section along with their 12 mules and three vehicles. These were of great assistance as Christmas Comforts and the number of analysis officers above establishment whose valises had to be carried was more than a First Line Transport could cope with.




