DISCIPLINE. 4. Instances have frequently come under notice where members of the A.I.F., apparently on leave from Camp, are seen walking in the public streets improperly dressed, unshaven and slovenly. It is a common practice with some soldiers to wear their head-dress on the back of their heads, others are observed with collar bands unfastened and tunics unbuttoned. It is needless to say that such men bring discredit on the uniform which they wear.
The importance of soldiers whilst on leave in public places presenting a smart and soldierly appearance cannot be overestimated. Attention is directed to Routine Order No. 5, para 3 on this subject.

DRESS. Para 46 (111) A.I.F. Orders which reads as under, is withdrawn :-
"Officers who desire to provide themselves with Jackets, instead of receiving a free issue may wear the Jacket (khaki), shirt, collar and tie, as authorised in M.O. 606/13 and M.O. 65/14"
Officers of the A.I.F. will in future wear the Jacket, Service Dress, of the same pattern as for other ranks.

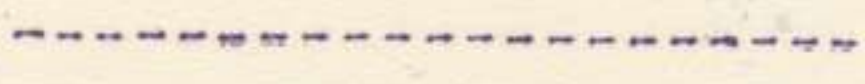

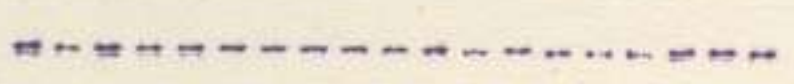
