

COPY Appendix L FJM/HIS SENIOR CHAPLAIN, O.P.D. TOTELLIAN IN PROPERTY OF THE 1st March, My Dear Mr. Freedman, On the eve of your departure for Egypt and Palestine en route to Australia, I feel constrained to write you these lines of most hearty appreciation of the very fine service that you have rendered to the men of your own faith and order in the A.I.F. Your unremitting attention to their spiritual needs, your unflagging energy in visiting them, your care of detail and your personal regard/ for eth individual have endeared you to all the Jewish members of this E orce. The letters you have written to the relatives of the boys, while they have no doubt been a heavy burden to you, have carried great blessing in their train. Your work has necessarily been more arduous than that of a Christian Chaplain residing with one unit because you have had to cover the whole of the five Divisions in the Field, with the Hospitals, Pase Depots and Training Camps. The Americans have a quaint saying to the effect that "The man who spreads himself out too thin doesn't make much of a dent in any one place." This however, has been falsified in your casem for, though you have had to spread your efforts over the whole Force, your impact has been deeply felt upon every unit and on each individual life. I pray that journeying mercies may be granted unto you, that you may be greatly bledsed in ministering to the men of your faith in Egypt and Palestine and that yours may be a very happy reunion indeed with your loved ones in the Sunny South land. I count it one of the greatest privileges of this campaign to have been able to renew my old-time friendship and fellowship with you, and I trust that in God's good time and way, I may again be privileged to associate with you in His service in Australia.
