

  - (c) The use of Very Lights and Flash Lamps with a pre-arranged Signal.
- 5. The Company in MALT TRENCH to be held in readiness to move forward and occupy line of posts at present held.
- 6. Artillery and Machine Gun Company will lift their normal barrage until reports are received.
- 7. Programme for the Trench Mortars is being prepared and will be communicated direct to you by Trench Mortar Officer.
- It is essential that reports be received at Brigade Headquarter from time to time regarding progress made by patrols.



- Small parties of the enemy have been seen near BOIS de VAUX -1. VRAUCOURT COPSE, and on the ridge between MORY and NOREUIL. Our troops are holding the hollow road in B.18.d. and also BEUGNY.
- The Advanced Guard will take over outpost duties from to-night on 2. the general line:-B.18.c. central - SUGAR FACTORY - VRAUCOURT - VAULX - I.4.d. central.
- 21st Battalion will take over by 5.30 p.m. the Left Sector from B.18.c. central to C.20.c. central, inclusive. Reserve half Bn. at 3. C.25. central with H.Q's in C.25.b.1.9. 23rd Battalion will take the Right Sector from 1 Company 21st Bn. from C.20.c. via CRUCIFIX SPUR to I.4. central. Reserve Half Bn. near SUNK ROAD in I.1.d. H.Q's at S. entrance to VAULK in I.2.d.1.9. by 6.30 p.m. 25th Battalion on arrival will move to BEUGNATRE in readiness to support the outpost line. 26th Battalion occupies H.26.d.2.7. in relief of 22nd Bn. as Reserve.
- "B" Squadron Light Horse will furnish patrols to reconneitre LAGNICOURT - NOREUIL - LONGATTE at 4.45 a.m. tomorrow, 20th, and on 4. return will bivouac at FAVREUIL - 1 N.C.O. & 4 Orderlies to be placed at disposal of each Battalion on outpost duty.

SIXTH AUSTRALIAN INFANTRY BRIGADE.

Brigade Headquarters, 22nd March 1917.

Headquarters, 2nd Australian Division.

The following report on the operations of the Advanced Guard on 20th March, 1917, near NOREUIL, is submitted:-

- 1. In accordance with general instructions from Divisional Headquarters Advanced Guard Order No. 4 was issued at 9.30 p.m. on 19th March, the details being dealt with verbally with 0.0., Light Horse, and Battalions.
- 2. Telephonic instructions reached me shortly after 11 p.m. 19th from General Staff of Division that the Corps Commander desired the line LONGATTE NOREUIL LAGNICOURT to be occupied, and that the general instructions from Divisional Headquarters would be modified in accordance with a memo. to be received by me during the night of the 19/20th.
- 3. I issued Advanced Guard Order No. 5. between 18.50 a.m. and 1.20 a.m. in order to give effect to the change of views by occupying the village of NOREUIL if only small numbers were encountered, or to force the enemys to disclose his dispositions if his line was held in strength. My first intention was to start the Infantry off ahead of the mounted patrols at 3 a.m. on 20th so as to bring them into action in support of the Light Horse as near as possible to the villages. Time however did not permit of the necessary concentration being made before 4 a.m.

The general situation and the method of carrying out the reconnaissance in force and occupation were fully discussed with Battalion and Squadron Commanders on the lines laid down by G.1/380. Definite instructions were given by me to both Battalion Commanders as to the method of breaking off any action and of ensuring the cooperation of the two wings in so

doing.

4. Movements on the 20th were delayed by heavy rain and snow, and the troops were not clear of the original Outpost line till approximately 4.30 a.m.

A more serious delay took place in the movement of the Light Horse patrols. On my way forward to VAULX at 5.25 a.m. I met a party of the 15th Light Horse thism side of BEUGNATRE, and had to order the Officer in command to move forward at a trot.

As already reported to Div. H.Q. no reports were received and the Squadron took no part in the reconnaissance.

5. The method of advance on our right was affected by the necessaty of clearing the BOIS DE VAULX, where considerable enemy activity had been noticed during the 19th. This wood was cleared by 2 Companies of the 23rd Bn. who completed their task by about 3.45 a.m.

The leading Company of the 23rd advanced at this time in line of platoons in file, protected by patrols, and moved direct on the NOREUIL, the far side of which was reached about

4.45 a.m., no opposition was encountered.

The second Company of the 23rd lost it s way and did not arrive in support to the leading Company, which in the meantime had fallen back being unsupported, till towards 6 a.m. when the first of the Companies from the BOIS DE VAULX also reinforced the front line. The second of the BOIS companies after furnishing

wand before



after furnishing two posts to the N. and E. of the BOIS de VAULX came up about the same time and formed a right flank guard against the village of LAGNICOURT.

The action of the leading company had followed the instructions given and a position had been taken up guarding the approaches from the N.E. and E. in readiness to join up with the 21st Bn. on the left

and the supporting company's of the 25rd on the right.

As there were no signs of either flank being reinforced the leading Company was withdrawn about 5.15 a.m. to South of Village and formed up in a fire position about 400 yards from the edge of the village. On being reinforced towards 6 a.m. an advance was made to occupy NOREUIL but the enemy now brought heavy Machine Gun fire to bear from LONGATTE and NOREUIL, as well as a warm fire by 77's and 4.2" Howitzers and the advance was cancelled.

The 23rd Battalion maintained their fire position until ordered by me to withdraw to the newly selected outposts position at 9.30 a.m.

6. The advance of the 21st Battalion on our left was made in column of route covered by patrols until point C.13.c.1.1. was reached. From this point 1 Company moved against LONGATTE whilst the remainder of the Battalion deployed against NOREUIL; 2 Companies moved via. the cross roads at C.13.b.7.2. whilst the 4th Company moved in reserve via 14 central and 15 central. This advance, however, was carried out with the left too far from the North, and losses were incurred from Machine Gun fire from LONGATTE as well as from Machine Gun posted between that village and NOREUIL (the contours on the 57c Map are reported to be incorrect).

The left Company established itself in a line through 8 central and maintained a severe sniping fight with the garrison and M.G. of LONGATTE. One party rushed an advanced hostile M.G., bombed the dugout in SUNK ROAD (G.8.a.3.O.) whilst the Lewis Guns succeeded in

silencing an enemy M.G. in the village.

The Company on the left practically formed a left flank against LONGATTE for the 2 companies moving to co-operate with the 23rd against NOREUIL. This Company as well as the one next on the right suffered considerably from the shelling which came from both flanks.

By 7 a.m. the 3rd Company established itself about 700 yds from the NOREUIL Road with its right about 15 central the 4th Company being in support in schelon to the right rear with orders to link up with the 23rd. The forward movement of these 2 companies was stopped by heavy H.G. fire from a trench in front of the S.E. face of NOREUIL.

7. The strength displayed by the enemy, whom I estimate at

1 Battalion 4 M.G. in LAGNICOURT

1 Company 4 " in NOREUIL

2 Companies 4 " in LONGATTE no less than the Artillery brought into action i.e.

4 to 8 .. 77 guns ) on our front line

proved in my opinion that the occupation of any position on the line of the MOREUIL Road was not desirable until effective co-operation was available on both flanks I therefore ordered the 2 Battalions to withdraw at 9.30 a.m. and hold an advanced outpost line about 1000 yds. South of the enemy line.

This was carried out in good order by 1.15 p.m. the only attempt at interference being an advance of about 50 men with M.G. from LAGNICOURT to C.17 central which was severely punished by our Artillery

The advanced outpost positions were dug in during the afternoon under intermittent shell fire.

- 8. The work of the 3 Vickers M.G. attached to each of the Battalions was hampered by the absence of cover for their advance as well as by the paucity of targets. Good work was however done in smothering the hostile M.G.
- 9. My orders for the artillery placed the 12th Battery to fire on the S. & S.E. exits from LONGATTE whilst the 13th Battery was allotted the village of NOREUIL and the approaches from LAGNICOURT.

Observation was favourable and a number of objectives were engaged by our guns without direct orders from me. The initiative displayed by both batteries was admirable and their fire was extremely useful especially during the retirement of the 23rd Bn.

10. Both Battalions ran telephone lines forward to report centres from which communication with Companies was effected by means of visual and runners.

The line from the 25rd was cut early by shell fire and was not repaired until shortly before the withdrawal.

11. So far as the results of the recommaissance are concerned I have no doubt that he was forced to disclose a considerably greater strength than the Intelligence summariesinfer - further that he was prepared to evacuate the villages of NOREUIL and part of LIGNACOURT which were set on fire shortly after the action commenced - and lastly that his casualties in dead were considerably greater than ours (probably not less than 30).

Our casualty list augmented by the retaliation by 5.9" which continued throughout the afternoon as well as by the opportunity given to the hostile M.G. and Artillery of enfilading portions of our line.

Considering that the greater part of the action was fought at close range and that our troops broke off the action on receipt of orders the total casualties, though I deplore the number, is not so high as I expected. A number of cases are slight arm and leg wounds.
