

- 1.- All Lewis Gunners, Signallers, Scouts, Snipers and Observers will report to their respective Specialist Officers for the duration of the morning parade, but will take part in Recreational Training each afternoon.
- 2.- Coy. Stretcher Bearers will report to R.M.O. for Stretcher Drill and First Aid Instruction during Morning Parade on MONDAY, WEDNESDAY and FRIDAY of each week.
- J.- The Battalion B.O., M.O. and Gas N.C.O. will supervise all Bombing, Musketry and Gas Instruction.
- 4.- For the purpose of Route Marches H'Qrs. will be attached to "B" Coy.
- 5.- Raiding Party will receive special training in Bombing, Blocking, Bayonet Fighting, Physical Training, Recreational Games, Reconnaissance, Scouting, Attacking Strong Points, Co-operating with Lewis Gun.

Brigade Headquarters 6th December, 1917.

The following points were raised and discussed at the Conference at Divisional Headquarters, December 5th 1917 and are passed to you for information and guidance.-

- 1. The 2nd Aust. Divn. will probably relieve the 3rd Aust. Divn. in the line by 10 a.m. on 14th or 15th December.
- 2. DISTRIBUTION The 5th A.I.Bde. on the right will have 2 Bns. in the front line system, and 2 Bns. in support. It will be prepared to remain in the line without relief for one month.

The 7th A.I.Bde. on the left will have 2 Bns. in the front line system, and 2 Bns. in support. It may expect to be relieved before the month in the line expires - possibly after 2 or 3 weeks.

The 6th A.I.Bde. will be in Divisional Reserve.

- 3. ARTILLERY. The 2nd Aust. Div. Artillery may expect to go into the line about the 14th December.
- 4. DEFENCE POLICY. (a) An active defence policy will be carried out, and each brigade will prepare to make at least one raid during its tour in the line with the object of causing losses to the enemy and procuring identifications. The training of the raiding parties which is now being carried out should include small raid schemes drawn up by officers who have experience in raids, and which should bring out the importance of preparing for every one of the duties which raiders must carry out to make the operation a success. Apart from physical fitness and skill at arms, the following are some of the more important points to consider and prepare for.

(i) Reconnaissance - personal, scouts, aeroplane, etc.

(ii) Formation of plan. Strength of party. Subdivision of duties and number to be employed in each. Detail of tasks. Action in case of unexpected failure anywhere. Co-operation of assisting troops, e.g. Artillery, L.T.M., Vickers or Lewis guns. Duties of Intelligence men, Signallers, Engineers (if any). Method of withdrawal, and removal of prisoners, captured material, or its destruction. Checking Party. Reporting result.

(iii) Wire cutting, when to cut, where else to cut and when.?

(iv) Deception of enemy as to place of raid.

(v) Methods of effecting surprise.

(vi) Rehearsal by raiders on prepared ground, by day and night.

(b) In holding the line no defensive post will be weaker than one section, and as far as possible will be of the strength of one platoon.

(c) We must always be ready to counterattack. Schemes will be drawn up by Company and Battalion Commanders for attacking across the open and bombing along trenches.

- 5. CORPS LINE The Brigade in Divisional Reserve will provide nucleus garrisons and Vickers M.G's in the Corps Defensive Line. These M.G's will, on principle, be adaptable for anti-aircraft work.
- 6. ANTI-AIRCRAFT BATTERIES Vickers and Lewis Guns detailed for anti-aircraft duties will, as far as possible, be disposed in batteries with alternative positions, vide G26/448 dated 10th Novr. 1917 para 4 (iv). Reliefs will be in dugouts away from the M.G's.
- 7. ENGINEERS. In order to admit of splinter-proof cover being made for the front line posts, the accommodation in which will have to be increased, the C.R.E. will take steps to dump the necessary material; i.e. small elephant shelters, concrete blocks, timber props, duckboardsetc.

2. Maintenance during winter

Assistance in railways and roads will be given by Army to the utmost possible extent. To enable this to be done, Corps must:-

(a) Prevent damage to railway formations

(b) Reduce repair and maintenance work on roads to lowest limits by .-

(1) Using Railways, tramways and horsed transport instead of M.T.

(11) Strict control of M.T. that has to be used. These measures will release labour and material for the development of communications, which, again, will reduce the labour of men and animals in getting supplies of all natures up to the front line.

Well-being, Comfort and recreation

The A and Q Staff Officers of all formations should make it their business to see personally that everything possible is being done in this direction.

The well-being and comfort of the men will depend, during

the winter, upon: -

(a) Manmastership

(b) Hot food and hot drinks, well prepared

c) Hot baths

- (d) An ample supply of clean clothing, and arrangements to ensure a change, as soon as possible, of dry service clothing whenever the men get wet through
- (e) Drying Rooms (f) Careful adherence to the Standing Orders on Trench feet.

(g) Good cookery and variation of diet

(h) Accommodation and sanitation

(i) Rest Stations

(j) Recreation and leave

As regards the points mentioned in para. 3 above 4.

(a) Manmastership. See S.O.574.

(b) Hot food and hot drinks - Soyer stoves should be used to the fullest extent. There is a regular issue of hot food containers, but additional containers can be provided if

required.

(c) Baths See S.Os. 63, 389, 401, 408, 664. Baths should be developed to the utmost extent. A blue print is attached showing the lines on which new baths should be arranged. Rose spraye sets are on R.E. supply, and demands should be submitted forthwith for all that are required.

Coffee stalls and haircutters' shops should be provided

at baths, if possible.

(d) Clean underclothing and dry service clothing .- See S.Os. 97, 401.

201

There can be no excuse for any failure to supply men with a change of underclothing whenever they require it. The principle to be followed is that every man has with him at all times the authorised change of underclothing, so that he can change when wet, and that baths keep a sufficient supply to enable every man bathes to have a complete change of underclothing.

Arrangements should exist at all times for disinfecting and drying the service clothing of men while they bathe.

There is a very good de-lousing installation at L.5.d.2.6. Sheet 27, which might well be copied in other areas.

A description of an improvised steam disinfector which costs under £30 to construct can be supplied on application to SECOND ARMY "Q"

Half the sick wastage is caused by vermin. Baths and disinfection are therefore of the greatest value.

- (e) Drying Rooms These can be operated by heat derived from incinerators.
- The preventive and curative treatment laid down in S.O.597 was tried throughout the Fourth Army on the Somme during the greater part of the severe winter of 1916-1917. In no single case, after the adoption of the treatment was amputation found necessary and the cases which occurred were cured far more rapidly than under former methods. Arrangements have been made to provide all the ingredients required and the supply of all of them is assured, with the exception of camphor. Special efforts are being made to obtain sufficient camphor and it is hoped that the supply of it will not fail.

Foot rubbing drills and making each man responsible for his comrade's feet have been found most useful in practice.

(g) Good cookery and variation in diet. - If the instructions given in Army Standing Orders 676-703 are followed monotony in diet can under most conditions be diminished.

A new pamphlet entitled "Cookery in the Field" a revised edition of "Fourth Army Catering Notes" is about to be issued by the Quartermaster General on the liberal scale of one copy to every 50 men. It is hoped that an issue will be made very soon, and that, when it is issued, all Officers concerned will see that it is issued, all Officers concerned will see that it is used by the cooks instead of being placed carefully in the Units' library.

"Q" Officers should make it their business to ensure that real advantage is taken of the suggestions given in this very valuable publication, which also describes the construction of an excellen hot food container out of a pack, a petrol tin, and 5 lbs of hay.

Hot food in the line, stock pots for soup, and refreshment stations run by Soyer Stoves should be provided and developed to the extent possible.

Kitchens and Q.M. Stores should be close to a road.

The Army School of Cookery has been established to assist units to make the most of the ration, one of the Inspectors of Catering will always be available to give any assistance or advice, if application for his services is made to D.D.S. & T.

APPENDIX. 2

Vegetables
To provide green vegetables on as liberal a scale as possible arrangements should be made now to start vegetable gardens where-ever it is possible to do so. Too many vegetables can hardly be grown.

(h) Accommodation and Sanitation .- Ventilation is a matter of great importance in Nissen Huts, Dug-outs, etc.

Sandbag mattresses stuffed with newspapers rolled into a ball, or straw whould be provided for the men as soon as possible. The issue for straw for bedding is at present restricted to billets, tents, etc., without wooden floors. (G.R.O.2840).

It is particularly desirable that the men should be made as comfortable as possible at Corps Reinforcement Camps which they reach at a time when they are very susceptible to impression.

All Officers down to Platoon Commanders should interest themselves in sanitation, and take energetic steps to obviate any danger of an epidemic when the winter gives place to spring. The experience that has been gained during the war is given in Standing Orders 600-663.

(i) Rest Stations. - Six C.C.Ss. have been detailed to act as Corps Rest Stations, one to each Corps in the front line. Mach C.C.S. will have at an early date accommodation for a 1000 patients.

All cases of sickness likely to be fit for duty in fourteen days will be retained in the Corps Rest Stations.

It is hoped that Corps will make every effort to assist in making these institutions really comfortable for the men. A cinema at each Station might be provided and good recreation, dining rooms, and libraries established and also, if possible, a recreation ground.

Cheap suitable books, can be obtained from MUDIO's Library.

(1) Recreation and Leave. The men have been subjected to a severe strain and are now faced with the hardships inseparable from a winter in Flanders under war conditions. They have also to contend with pessimists; the thoughtless chatter of nespapers which reproduce the senseless speechess and bickerings of stupid and unpatriotic people; the accounts spread broadcast by newspapers about the state of Russia and enemy successes in other parts of the world; and with other influences which tend to depress them. When moreover, they do go home on leave, they find that high prices and scarcity of some of the necessities are causing difficulties among their relations and friends.

It is therefore, clear an that special efforts must be made to provide recreation and relaxation for the men, and to cheer them up. Every successful effort in this direction will be repaid a thousand fold by results.

What is required is an energetic and immediate mobilization of all the resources upon which we can draw. Among these may be put.

(i) The appointment of a suitable officer, as "master of the ceremonies", in every formation and unit. His duties would be to organise football messages matches, boxing competitions etc.

(ii) A liberal supply of cinemas. Films are obtainable from the Expeditionary Force Canteen, and the machines pay for themselves in a very short time.

(iii) The use of bands and all kinds to full advantage.
Tattoos, etc., in billets, have a very good influence.



(iv) The development of troupes and concert parties and the occasional exchange of performances with those of other formations, to obtain variety.

(v) An increase in the numbers of Y.M.C.A's and Church Huts. Application for the additional numbers required

should be made by Corps to A.H.Q.

(vi) Music in Estaminets

(vii) The detailing of professional entertainers, of whom there are considerable scattered throughout the troops, to certain important centres, such as POPERINGHE, to work under the Town Major, as entertainers. They would enter Estaminets, billets, etc. as visitors, and start the ball rolling, by singing or other methods at which they are adept.

(viii) Tours by good speakers etc., etc.

The French and Belgian Authorities have now given permission for music in Estaminets, and everything possible should be done to induce estaminet keepers to provide musical instruments and contrivances where these do not already exist. Every Officer should make a point of talking to men who appear weary and dejected, to find out where the trouble lies, to help them at any rate with their sympathy and do their best to put straight anything wrong which can be remedied.

The feelings of the men towards their Officers are excellent; and They realise that their Officers have given their lives even more freely than they have, if that were possible; and they are consequently ready to be shown the road to cheeriness by their Officers. The latter must, however, be careful what they say, especially in their messes, because the gist of their conversation is communicated at once through their servants to the whole unit.

"The general state and efficiency of a regiment can be quickly gained by the tone and bearing of its Officers when in their mess. It is the duty of the Commanding Officer to first set the standard of life and then to insist on his Officers living up to that standard. The Commanding Officer who does so is correctly interpreting one of the many responsibilities that are his and his alone". ("Hints for Commanding Officers" - issued to students at the Senior Officers School, ALDERSHOT, 1917).

(k) LEAVE Leave comes to a man after, perhaps, 18 months of hard campaigning under conditions which it is not necessary again to describe. It should be a holiday in every senseof the word, a period of rest, pleasure, and recuperation.

What often actually happens is, however, nothing short of a scandal. When going on leave, the man arrives at a station where there is no shelter or refreshments, and has to wait in the pouring rain, with a crowd of others, before the train comes in. When the train does arrive, it is probably windowless, unlit, unwarmed, and soon overcrowded. On arrival at a Base Port the conditions may be little better. On the return from leave, the same depressing process is repeated, and the soldier finds that the glorious event to which he has been looking forward for many months has been marred by discomforts which engender in him a feeling of bitter resent-ment.

Men returning from leave have been seen lying on cobbles or under hedges in pouring rain in the winter - nobody to meet them, no thing to convey them to their unit, no refreshment to be had.

The Army Commander is determined that such a state of affairs shall not exist in any part of the Army under his command, and directs that steps be taken immediately where they have not been taken to provide:-

- (i) A proper staff, at each station at which men entrain or detrain for and from leave, to provide hot drinks, sleeping accommodation, and meals for leave men.
- (ii) Conveyance, by bus, or lorry, if possible, for the men to their unit, or as far as they can be carried towards their unit.
- (iii) Covered and warmed waiting accommodation at each entraining and detraining station.
- (iv) Additional entraining and detraining stations.
- (v) Comfortable leave trains.
- (i)-(iii) are matters for Corps.
- (iv) and (v) are being taken up with Transportation. Corps have already been instructed to detail a Staff Officer to investigate conditions en route to and from the Bases, and at the Bases themselves.
- The measures to be taken to make returning leave men comfortable apply equally to reinforcements.
- The comfort of Officers must not be overlooked. Measures are being taken to make the rules about Officers' restaurants and hotels more elastic, in order to obtain more reasonable hours, etc. If there is a demand for an Officers' Club in any town or locality application should be made to A.H.Q. Every effort will then be made to induce the E.F.C. to open a club.

MEDICAL

7. A mechanical dental centre for the repair of dentures and the provision of Artifical dentures is being established at No. 50 C.C.S. MONT-des-CATS.

This centre will deal with all mechanical dentistry of the British Units in the Second Army. The Australian and Canadian units are already provided for. It is hoped to save a considerable amount of wastage by this means.

8. Two C.C.Ss. are being detailed as centres for suspected dysentery and severe cases of diarrhoea.

A skilled bacteriologist will be attached to each centre for of early diagnoses.

- An Ophthalmic Centre at No.50 C.C.S. is established for dealing 9. with all defects of vision in the Army. This is inadequate at present, but the Staff and accommodation are being increased.
- Scabies will be looked after at a Section of the Corps Rest 10. Stations. The wastage in skin diseases have been heavy. In no circumstances will scabies cases be evacuated to the Base.
- . All Corps have been informed to which C.C.S. their wounded will 11. be evacuated. To facilitate evacuation of sick and walking wounded from the front line, arrangements have been made to evacuate these cases by rail from the II, VIII, XIX, and II Anzac Corps.

HORSES.

- A heavy strain is always placed on horses during the winter 12. months. Moreover, the remount situation demands that everything possible be done to reduce wastage. This can be achieved by .-
 - (a) Organization, i.e.,

00

- (i) Pooling horses. All divisions should adopt the plan of giving brigade transport officers full powers to arrange the equal distribution of work amongst animals of the brigade.

 At present it is not uncommon for a wagon to be sent from each of several units to an Ordnance or other dump to bring back stores which could easily have been carried in one wagon.
- (ii) Arranging for reliefs by withdrawing weekly horses to rearward places where they can get a rest, after which they can be employed again when they have picked up sufficiently to relieve other tired animals.
- (iii) Avoiding the working of weak horses with sound ones.

 This practice throws extra work on the latter and soon weakens them also.
 - (iv) Supervision by Officers of watering and of work in wagon lines. The standings at horse watering places require attention. They should be well policed.
- (b) Chaffing the fodder and mixing the corn food with the chaff. Chaff cutters should be used to the fullest extent.
- (c) Saving hay by using hay nets.
- (d) Throwing open the best roads for the use of loaded horses, instead of confining them to the worst.
- (e) Reducing the danger of picked up nails by rigorously enforcing Army Standing Orders 746.
- (f) Providing standings and overhead cover for animals wherever this is not already provided. Wagon Lines should be as near as possible to metalled roads.
- (g) The erection of mud walls around horse lines as a protection against bombs.
- (h) The prompt evacuation of debility cases. These is sometimes a tendency to himit the number of evacuations to the small-estpossible number, so that wastage may not appear unduly high in the statistical return. This is bad economy and results in excessive wastage when the strain comes. The border line between animals in poor condition and those suffering from debility is often difficult to define.
- (i) All horses may be clipped trace high.
- Immediate steps should be taken that frost cogs are available, and that units demand from the Ordnance Officers concerned the taps and wrenches required to bring the numbers in possession up to the proper scale.
- Remounts should always be put into light work to start with and gradually brought on. It is impossible to send up horses, especially draught horses, in bad condition.
- Lectures to Officers and other ranks should be arranged by Corps horsemasters.
- The attention of all concerned should be drawn to S.Os. 704 -

MECHANICAL TRANSPORT

17. Advantage must be taken of the winter months to overhaul lorries and to get them ready to meet heavy demands next year. Both for this reason and for the sake of the roads, the use of M.T. must be rigidly limited.

Dead mileage should be reduced to a minimum by locating

lorries near their work and by combining duties.

It is essential that loads should be reduced on bad roads and that M.T. personnel should, whenever possible, be given time each day to clean and inspect their vehicles and to carry out any adjustments which may be necessary. Neglect of those ordinary precautions have in the past led to very serious results.

ROADS AND ROAD TRAFFIC

18. The general policy regarding the use of roads will be .-

- (a) Traffic on roads which must be used for ammunition, supplies R.E.Stores and road material will be cut down to essential requirements.
- (b) Wherever possible, horsed transport will be used in place of mechanical transport.
- (c) The greatest possible care will be taken to ensure that orders regarding speed limits are generally known and strictly enforced. Cases of exceeding the speed limit should be dealt with severely. If more than one case against one mechanical transport unit in a week, that unit should be made to furnish an officers patrol for a week.
- (d) The supply of road metal is insufficient to meet demands and the rigid enforcement of the above instructions is necessary in order to assist the road situation, which is one of difficulty.
- Q is responsible for indicating the roads which are required for traffic and for regulating the traffic in such a way that it will be possible to repair them.
- 20. Mud is the worst enemy of the roads and must be tackled effectively by .-
 - (a) Preventing vehicles of all natures from coming on to the roads from fields, except across corduroyed approaches which must be swept clean by parties told off for this purpose. These corduroyed portions will act as "doormats" and will prevent mud from being brought on to the road.

 Muddy side tracks leading into the main road must be dealt with in a similar manner.
 - (b) Removing mud from roads.

Endeavours will be made to obtain carts suitable for removing liquid mud from villages, and Corps will state the number they require.

Return of Salved Ammunition and Empties.

- The collection and examination of salved ammunition is an urgent matter, especially in the Northern Areas. The policy proposed is the formation in Corps Areas of ammunition Salvage Depots, at which ammunition will be thoroughly examined, and, if found serviceable, reissued to batteries, refilling point. If defective, it will be returned to the Base.
- 36. These Depots will be organised under Corps arrangement.

- Ammunition Officers and a Staff of A.O.O. are being obtained for all Corps to assist the A.D.C.Z. in this work. D.A.D.O.S. ammunition, Army, is always available for technical service advice and every assistance should be given him when visiting Corps Ammunition Dumps and Salvage Depots. The examination of gun and howitzer ammunition only will be undertaken at Corps Salvage Depots. Salved Trench Mortar Bombs, Grenades, S.A.A., etc., will be dealt with at Army Depots, where facilities for laboratory operations exist.
 - 37. Salved ammunition will be taken to the Salvage Depots by Light Railway it will then be examined and .-

(a) Returned to the Base by broad guage or,

(b) Sent by railway to Group Stations or to Refilling Points for re-issue, or

(c) Sent to Army Depots for re-issue.

Winter Salvage Policy

there is at present a very large amount of ammunition on Corps charge in front of railhead. This ammunition is for the most part contained in scattered dumps covering a large area. It is important that all dumps not authorised under the new scheme should be abolished as soon as possible by the issue of the ammunition to the batteries. Transportation will offer every facility for clearing these dumps forward by a light railway. The Army Depots are also full (to over-flowing) of ammunition of all natures, some of which has been stored in them for several months.

In order to ensure that this Ammunition is turned over during the winter, current expenditure will, as far as possible, be met by issue from Army Depots by light railway, the Depots being refilled periodically, to the extent of their authorised establishment from the Base.

SUPPLIES AND TRANSPORT

52. RUM

A Reserve of not less than 30,000 gallons will be maintained in the Army Area. This will be in addition to the quantities received on the pack trains as demanded by Divisions.

Rum will be issued to Battalions on application while out of

the line and daily while in trenches.

For each Division in the Army 7500 ozs. are received weekly.

Issue is only to those Divisions which are in the line. This means that, under existing conditions, each Division in the line would receive about 12,000 ozs per week. In addition, there is a stock in the Army Area at the present time of about 650,000 ozs to meet any extra or sudden requirements.

PROVOST WORK

- Discipline

 A.P.Ms. must give special attention to this and to the enforcing of Army Standing Orders. Each week they should concentrate on one or more S.Os., and report to their formation the names of offenders. The slackness in saluting of junior officers needs constant attention, not only in regard to their quaint method of saluting their seniors but even more for their carelessness in returning the salutes of their subordinates. The smartness of junior officers must also be improved.
- A.P.Ms. should have frequently personal conversations on the subject of discipline, roads, salvage and sanitation, etc. with the heads of departments concerned. They can contribute a great deal towards efficiency in this way by bringing to notice points of interest which come to their knowledge in the execution of their duty.

Lectures should be given by Corps A.P.Ms. on Provost Duties at Corps Schools, so that young officers of different branches of the service may require knowledge of, and sympathy with, the duties of the Provost Branch.

Winter Courses of Instruction

- Courses, lasting about 14 days, will be held at Army H.Q..

 It is hoped that all Divisional M.M.Ps., will be able to attend a course during the winter months. At the same time A.P.Ms. will be expected to carry out lectures and short refresher courses, on the same lines, for their own M.M.Ps.
- Gages, of a mederate size, should be formed at Corps H.Q. on uniform lines. The principle that prisoners should receive a thorough training in discipline will be strictly adhered to so that they may, at the end of their time, in addition to having been punished, be in every way better soldiers. Work of an arduous but useful nature can be carried out by arrangement with the G.R.E. Corps Troops, A.D.Signals, and Corps Roads Officer.
- An Army Cage will be established to deal with offenders belonging to Army Troops.
- Traffic Personnel

 The Traffic Personnel, particularly in the forward area,
 must be relieved frequently. During the time they are in rest
 they should be comfortably housed and should be given.
 (a) A short refresher course in traffic duties.
 - (b) Employment on useful and healthy work, so as to keep them fit and cheery.
 - The reliefs will be arranged by Corps A.P.Ms. by:-
 - (a) Pooling the traffic personnel
 (b) Training fresh men, in order to build up a reserve of at least, 40 men per Division.
- The shelters and dug-outs in which the traffic men live in the forward area must be improved and maintained in good condition.
- TRAFFIC CONTROL

 The orders on traffic are contained in S.Os. 254-283.
- 69. Each Control Post will be furnished with cards (copy attached which may prevent in the future the serious consequences which have resulted in the past of refusal of Officers to obey the orders of Control Post.
- The staff officers may have more time to get about and look into things on the spot.
- 78. Correspondence will be reduced and much trouble saved if all concerned will read Standing Orders & "A" Notes".
- REST FOR OFFICERS AND CLERKS

 The Army Commander desires that the efficiency of Officers and Clerks shall not be impared by late hours and by continuous hard work unrelieved by recreation. Their full working power and capacity will be fully taxed when active operations are resumed, and it is necessary that they should not start the strain in a tired condition.

The following are suggestions for the attainment of the object in view.

- (a) That telephone calls (unless urgent) should not be made after 10 p.m.
- (b) That telegrams (unless urgent) should not be sent to Signals for transmission after 8.30 p.m.





Strong Posts were sited and Machine Gun Positions selected, details of which are embodied in Bde. Memo's 688 of 19th Decr., and 824/17 of 24th December.



SALVAGE

Attention is drawn to the necessity for greater efforts in collecting salvage, especially in the area between the present Camps and the Corps Line.

It is of the most vital importance at the present time to economise by salving every article of equipment, clothing, ammunition otc. and special attention is drawn to A.I.F. Order No.1021.

The following scheme will come into operation on 30th Docember, 1917.

- 1. 2 men from Salvage Coy. will be attached to each Battalion and will assist units in every way and will be in charge of Bn. dumps - Every assistance will be rendered to them by O.C's units.
- Each Battalion and tho M.G. Company will form a Salvage Dump and from thore it will be carted by First Line Transport to the Brigade Dump situated at Brigade Transport Lines at T.20.c.5.3. where 1 N.C.O. & 2 men will be in charge.
- 3. Every man possible must be detailed for this work and Brass Bands will be detailed for this duty at least several days weekly.

The T.M.Battery will detail 1 Officer, 2 N.C.O's and 25 mon daily and will dump all salvago on the nearest Battalion Dump .

4. Weekly salvage returns will continue to be sent to this office by noon Wednesdays. This will also include all salved material used for defence and improvement purposes.

The value of salvage collected will be published from time to time in Brigade Routine Orders and it is hoped that a spirit of rivalry and competition will be created within the Brigade units.

5. Forward Working parties will make every offort to collect salvage and the Officers in charge will see that all such men do not return to camp empty handed.

Rifles, unserviceable ammunition, otc. must not be left lying in small dumps but returned to Battalion dumps.
