Sausage Valley	4.8.16	5.30 p.m.	<p>During afternoon orders received from 6th Bde to attack, objective being 91, 60, 12, 47. Orders communicated verbally to all officers.</p> <p>Bn moved forward by platoons at two minute intervals. Some considerable delay was caused by the 26th Bn cutting right through us at CENTREWAY. After they had passed the movement forward was continued via K trench to the assembly trenches. K trench was continuously under shell fire and considerable casualties were caused. This did not interfere with the movement the Bn continuing forward. The two leading waves arrived in the assembly trenches on time and moved forward to the attack.</p> <p>Word was received at Bn. H. Q. that there was no sign of the two Coys forming the last two waves and it was feared that they had been lost. They arrived however and moved forward to the attack gaining the 2nd objective. Thinking these two Coys lost and knowing A Coy 24th Bn was in position I ordered them forward to take the place of the two rear 22nd Coys. For some reason or another which I have not been able to discover they did not move forward until 11.35 p.m., although move orders were sent out at 9.30 p.m. and acknowledgment received 10.5 p.m. The trenches had been fully manned judging by the prisoners sent back and the German dead left in the trenches, (estimated about 200) In addition an enemy party strength unknown were seen to retire & were pursued with fire.</p> <p>Patrols were sent out from right and left flanks in accordance with orders and reported "all clear in front." Three (3) German machine guns were captured in O.S.I., two in working order and one damaged. The two sound guns were manned by 6th Bde M. & Coy and used during following day.</p>

POZIERES Ridge	5.8.16	<p>2.40am</p> <p>4.40am</p> <p>5.30am</p>	<p>The position was consolidated and the trenches were defensible by dawn. When it was seen that the 24th Coy would not be required they were ordered to withdraw to relieve the congestion of the trenches. This was completed 4 am.</p> <p>Patrol of 1 (one) officer Lt CONDON and (20) twenty others reconnoitred towards 65 and finding there a strong bombing post were bombed back.</p> <p>Enemy approx 200 strong counterattacked on our front and obtained a footing in O.S.II. They were immediately driven out. It is estimated that at least 75% of enemy became casualties. Reinforcements were sent forward from the 24th Bn (straight one (1) platoon) to reinforce left flank of O.S.I, which was very thinly held and appeared to be the weakest point of the position. The enemy were making continual small bombing attacks against this point and point 12. All attacks were successfully repulsed. When dawn arrived the position on the left was fairly strongly held with Vickers and Lewis guns with the exception of trench 12-90 which was untenable owing to exploded shell fire. At point 12 Three (3) Lewis guns, at 90 one (1) German M.G. and one (1) V.L.M gun.</p> <p>The position was successfully held during the day although the casualties were heavy owing to artillery fire. No further counterattacks developed. It is suggested that in future more complete arrangements between Brigades moving simultaneously be made both as to time and routes. Otherwise all arrangements appeared to be workable and were easily carried out. By midnight the Batts had been completely relieved by the 24th Bn and returned to trenches in SAUSAGE VALLEY.</p>
