

- 1. The 11th. Australian In fantry Brigade has received orders to hold themsel itself in read iness to move an four nours notice to reinforce the 57th. Division which holds the following areas: - FLEUR BAIX -BOIS GRENIER - ARMENTI ERES.
- In case of a call the 41st. Battalion may be used to -(a) Occupy the ARMENTI ERES defences taking the northern group in which case: -"A" Coy will become "P" Coy. and will occupy strong point at C.20.b.7.5

- In case of occupation of ARMENTIERES defences guides will meet parties at Railway Crossing at N.6.a.0.9. O.C. Parties will carry with them a guide card, stating name of Unit and distinguishing No. of guide as per Appendix issued nerewith.
- 5. On receipt of warning, "stand by for 57th. Division" all Coys will turn out at once, plus 1st. L ine Transport, and Major SHERIDAN will immediately report to Brigade Weadquarters for orders.
- Rations, ammunition etc will be carried as per S.S.135 but no bombs or Rifle Grenades will be carried. These will be drawn from the following places: -


Usual personnel will be left benind as per S.S.135 and will report to 42nd. Battalion Camp wi thin 24 nours.

The Corps Commander na s awarded the MILITARY MEDAL to the following: -

On the night 31st.July/1st.August 1917 east of MESSINES, this N.C.O. snowed great courage and devotion to duty during the assault. Upon his platoon Comander (Lieut.JACKSON) becoming a casualty, he took charge and guided the men out of shelled areas, notwithstanding the fact that he was twice blown over by shell fire. He was eventually evacuated 24 hours later suffering from shell shock and exosure, but had refused to leave the line until he had to be actually carried out.

His determin ation and devotion to duty had an exellent

His determin ation and devotion to duty had an exellent effect upon his men.

No.1869 Sergeant John Joseph MORIARTY.

On the morning of August 3rd. east of MESSINES, this N.C.O. snowed great bravery and devotion to duty. Inam the front line his platoon commander (Lieut.ROGERS) and Corporal MOTT, were completely burried by a snell during a neavy bombard ment. He at once set to work and dug them both out, although the place was being neavily snelled at the time. By his prompt action he probably sa ved the limes of both the aforementioned who were evacuated suffering from snell snock.

From the 31 st.July to 5th.August 1917, in the MESSINES
Sector acted as Battalion Ru nner between forward posts and his Company.
On repeated occasions succes sfully carrying messages through enemy barrages and under the worst possible weather conditions necessating his travelling most of the way overland owing to the impassable nature of the trenches.
When observed that he was be coming exhausted he was advised to take a rest, this he stoutly refused, con tinuing his duties until he completely collapsed and had to be taken away. His tenacity and devotion to duty was responsible for successfully keeping tou on between posts and his Company, and set a splendid example to those whi th whom he was associated.

No.230 Private John McCULLUCN.

From 31st. July to 5th. August 1917, in MESSINES Sector Private McCULLOCN was Battalion operator during the abovementioned period, operating on an O.L.Lamp, under most arduous and trying conditions. This man was in charge of the lamp at a forward post, and almost continuously for 60 nours remained in a very exosed condition under very neavy enemy Machine Gun and Artillery fire. Keeping his lamp correctly adjusted thereby successfully maintaining com munication through that period with his Battalion Meadquarters.

From 31st. July to 5th. August 1917, in MESSINES Sector Private SNEA was engaged on ration carrying between his Coy and forward Posts. Under abnormally adverse weather conditions being compelled to travel overland owing to the impassable nature of the trenches, and through neavy enemy shell fire, he kept up an adequate supply of rations to his comrades, earning the highest tappreciation from all the Post Commanders for his bravery and his unsw erving devotion to duty.

No.2678 Private John RUSSELL .


From the 3 lst. July to 5th. August 1917, in the MESSINES Sector, Private RUSSELL was engaged on ration carrying between his Coy and forward Posts. Under abn ormally adverse weather conditions being compelled to travel overland owing to the impassable nature of the trenches and through neavy enemy shell fire he kept up an adequate supply of rations to his comrades
