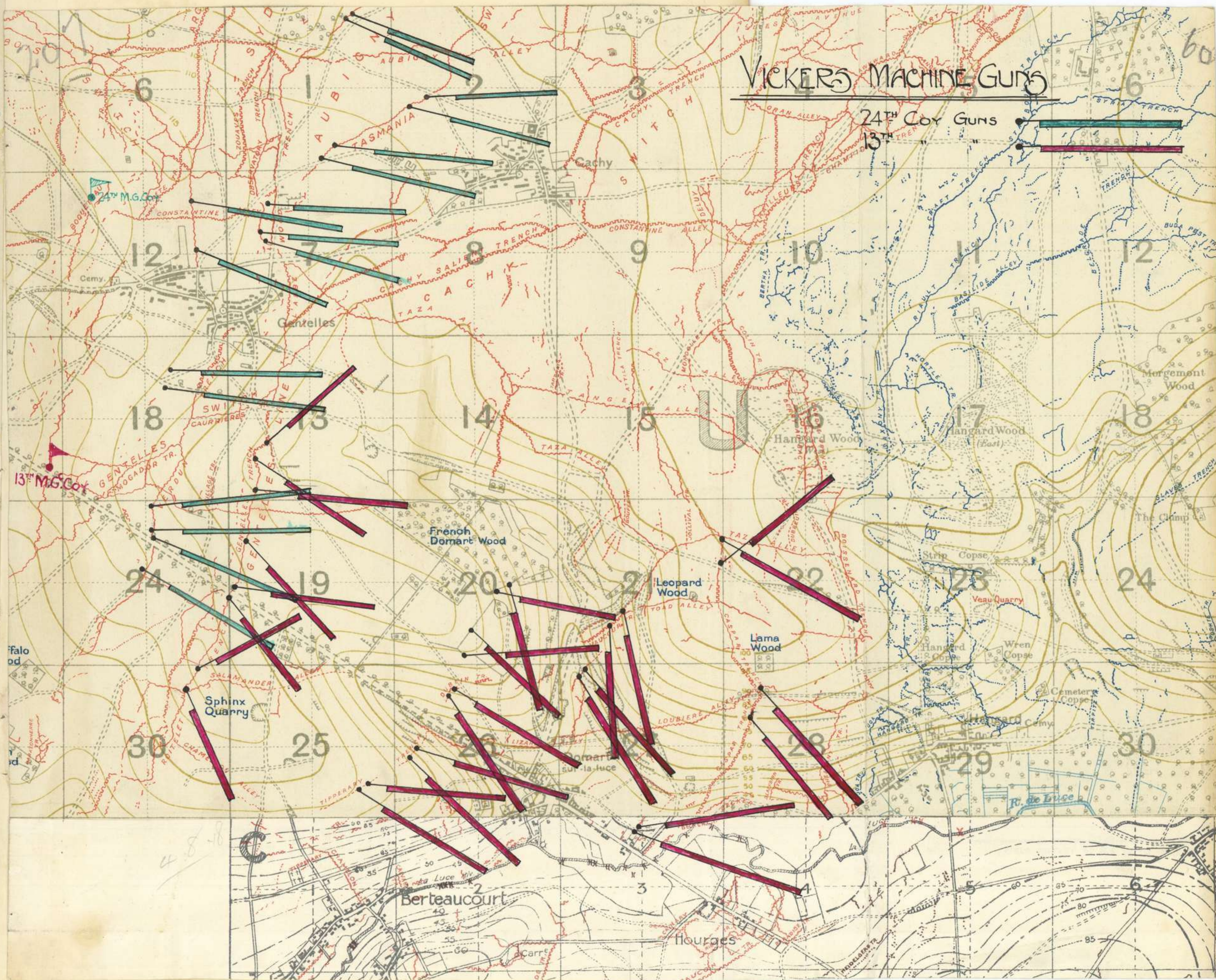
(1). These traces are intended to facilitate the communication of information as to the position of targets, which have been located on a squared map.
 (2). The squares on this trace are 500 yards in length on the 1/10,000 scale, 1,000 yards in length on the 1/20,000 scale, and 2,000 yards in length on the 1/40,000 scale.
 (3). The squares on the trace are fitted to the squares of the map showing the targets, which are then drawn on the trace. Sufficient letters and numbers must also be added to enable the recipient to place the trace in the correct position on his own map. A little detail may also be traced, but this is not essential. The name and scale of the map to which the trace refers must be always given. The trace can be used for the 1/10,000, 1/20,000, or 1/40,000 scale.

SUMMARY OF INTELLIGENCE.

From 6 a.m. 5th. August to 6 a.m. 6th August. 1918.

OPERATIONS.

Artillery- Right Sector. Quiet throughout period. At 1.55 p.m. C.10.b.5.6 to C.10.d.5.7. was shelled for 10 minutes and at 2.25 p.m. C.10.b.4.0. for five minutes by 18 pounders. ELIDELBERG

TRENCH at C.4.d.3.1. was shelled by our heavies during night. Shooting apparently good as a marked decrease in M.G. fire from this point was noticed.

Left Sector. Fairly active. Enemy positions in U.23.b. & d. were shelled with H.E. and Shrapnel. 18 lb pounders shelled STRIP COPSE in U.23.a. & b. at 3.30 a.m. Heavies were active on enemy rear area.

Machine Guns. Left and Right Sectors active.

Trench Mortars. Left Sector. At 9.45 p.m. 3.15 a.m. and at 4.10 a.m. enemy trench at V.1.d.40.35. was fired on. At midnight 10 rounds on H.G. position at U.5.d.70.25. At 1 a.m. 10 rounds on M.G. at U.6.c.35.45.

Aircraft. Right and Left Sectors. Between 11.45 a.m. and 2 p.m. our planes active patrolling the front. At 3 p.m. one of our planes flew very low over enemy front line, but was not engaged by enemy M.G. fire.

Patrols. Liaison was maintained with flanking units. Protective and reconnaissance patrols as under :-

HOSTILE ARTILLERY ACTIVITY. Right Sector. DOMART and DOMART-AMIENS Road throughout the day with 77mm and 105mm H.E. At 1.35 a.m. DOMART for 10 minutes with 105mm.

Left Sector. From 10 p.m. to dawn active over whole sector. Cross Roads at C.34.c.5.2. CACHY and vicinity, railway cutting at C.36.c.3.3. were particularly shelled. At 4.30 a.m. 40 105mm shells fell on eastern edge of MONUMENT WOOD. Area U.10.c. lightly shelled with gas at 11 p.m. Railway line from V.1.a.50.75. to V.1.b.3.6. heavily shelled between noon and 6 p.m. During afternoon enemy positions in V.1.c. and d. were shelled. Immediately double green and single red flares were fired and shelling ceased.

Machine Guns. Right Sector. Occasional bursts on our posts in C.4.c. Guns located at approximately C.4.d.3.2. - C.10.b.4.6. - C.10.a.1.2. Occasional bursts over posts at U.23.d.5.3.

Left Sector. Tracks and trenches were searched throughout the night. Large number of guns appear to fire from direction of STRIP COPSE U.23.a. Guns located by sound at approximately U.6.d. central and U.6.c.2.3. Gun located in enemy trench V.1.b.5.5. Gun at approx. V.11.a.15.40. fired throughout night. 6 M.G. are reported to be situated in north-east corner of HANGARD WOOD U.11.c.8.2. These guns onfilade our trenches particularly at V.1.b.9.5.

HOSTILE AERIAL ACTIVITY. Right Sector. At 7-30 a.m. one plane flew high along our front line.

ENEMY DEFENCES. (continued)

TRENCH MORTARS. Left Sector. At 4 a.m. positions at U.5.d.5.8. and V.1.c.3.7. were fired on from V.1.c.9.5.

WORK. Left Sector. Enemy heard wiring at distance of 100 to 150 yards from our trenches in U.10.d. sounds of picking heard on metal road leading south-east from V.1.a.6.0.

IDENTIFICATIONS. Right Sector. At 9-35 p.m. one Gorman walked to our post at U.4.c.5.3. he was fired on and captured. He belonged to 2nd Bn. 373rd I.R. Stated he was French and a native of LORRAINE and had only been forward for two days. He did not take part in raid on night of 3/4th. and did not know definitely how many prisoners were taken but had heard that 3 were captured.

Observation Post. Located in tree at V.23.c.4.4.

MOVEMENT AND ORGANIZATION IN AND BEHIND THE ENEMY LINES. Left Sector. Between 5 and 7 p.m. several small parties observed moving about in vicinity of STRIP COPSE, U.23.a. and b. Transport heard during night between U.6.c.5.4. and U.5.d.4.4.

MISCELLANEOUS. In vicinity of U.5.central between 2-30 and 3-30 a.m. enemy used shells with H.E. effect and a dull burst louder than ordinary gas shell. On bursting a ball of fire resembling a dud flare shoots straight up to a height of 30 or 40 foot. These were mixed with a few 5.9 shells. No gas was noticed. Sound of explosion resembled sbapnel bursting on ground.

1. In continuation of 1st Canadian Division Operation Order No. 270, the 3rd Canadian Infantry Brigade will relieve the Centre Battalion of the 13th Australian Brigade in the line on the night 7th/8th August, 1918. Relief will commence as soon as it is sufficiently dark to prevent movement being seen.
2. Upon completion of relief, the 13th, 14th and 16th Battalions will move directly into their Jumping Off positions or into a line immediately in rear thereof. The 15th Battalion will take up its position close up behind the 13th Battalion, and the 5th Battalion will occupy a position close up behind the 16th Battalion. The 3rd Light Trench Mortar Battery will detail guns and personnel to the various battalions as already arranged.
3. On completion of relief, units will notify Brigade Headquarters by runner to Advanced Brigade Headquarters U.15. central.

As regards the 49th. and 50th. Battalions no one has yet come to Brigade Headquarters to make arrangements for taking over command of the line, so that for the present the G.O.C. of this Brigade will retain command. The Brigade Headquarters will in any case remain for the time being in its present position even if the command of the line passes. Orders will be issued at a late hour tonight.

6TH AUGUST 1918.

1. In continuation of 2nd Canadian Division O.C.221, moves will take place on nights 6th/7th, and 7th/8th August, as per Table "A", attached.
2. Engineer Transport, as in Serial 4, will consist of transport required for road repair, in accordance with para. V(f) 1 of 2nd Canadian Division O.C.222.
5th Canadian Infantry Brigade transport as in serial 5, will consist of the minimum of "A" echelon transport (including M.G. Company) required for their advance.
Remainder of "A" Echelon transport, 5th Canadian Infantry Brigade and Engineer Transport required for carrying tools in accordance with para. V(f) 5 of 2nd Canadian Division O.C.222, will move up on the night of 7th/8th August under arrangements to be made by G.O.C., 5th Canadian Infantry Bde., and C.R.E. respectively to same rendezvous as in Serial 4.
Move to commence at dusk.
3. All transport must be parked under cover of woods, and no movement whatever is to be allowed outside the woods by day. 5th and 6th Canadian Infantry Brigades and C.R.E. will post special sentries, if necessary, to ensure this order being obeyed.
No water is available in the areas to which transport is moving, and horses must not be taken to watering points by day. Water must therefore be carried by all transports.
4. Headquarters, 13th Australian Brigade, will be relieved from Command in the Line on the night 6th/7th August, and will proceed to GLISY, and rejoin the 4th Australian Division.
5. The relief of the 50th Battalion, Australian Infantry, in the line will be completed as early as possible on the night 7th/8th August, under arrangements to be made by G.O.C., 4th Canadian Infantry Brigade.
On relief, 50th Australian Bn, will proceed via VILLERS BRETONNEUX road to GLISY.
6. All moves will be conducted as in this office O.C.219. para. 3, except that distances will be reduced to 200 yards.

1. (a) The 13th. AUST. INF. BDE. will be relieved in the front line tonight 7th/8th. August by Units of the 3rd. 1st. and 2nd. Canadian Divisions and will move to GLISY - BLANGY Area in accordance with table overleaf.
- (b) Relief will take place as soon as possible after dark; detailed arrangements being made direct between C.O.'s concerned subject to the orders of the Canadian Infantry Brigades in command of the respective sectors.
- (c) Movement after relief will be by small parties and the routes laid down must be followed as far as traffic will permit.
- (d) Transport will be moved under Brigade arrangements.
2. (a) Command of the three Battalion Sectors which coincide roughly with the three Canadian Divisional Sectors has passed to 8th. Canadian Infantry Brigade on right, the 3rd. Canadian Infantry Brigade in the centre and the 4th. Canadian Infantry Brigade on the left.
- (b) Battalions will deal with the Canadian Infantry Brigades under whose tactical command they come, and completion of reliefs will be notified to them.
