PAY, ALLOWANCES, LEAVE &c continued,1
attSUBSISTENCE.

- Three shillings each day for leave granted as above for all ranks with over one year's service abroad, except for those who have taken long service furlough abroad, vide sub-para. (e).
In the case of Officers, Field Allowance will cease as from date of disembarkation.
6. Soldiers will be discharged from A.I.F. upon expiration of their leave.
 7. The District Paymaster in Australia will make available within 4 ~~xxxxxx~~ days of disembarkation all balance to the credit of the soldier's pay account to date of discharge, together with 75 per cent of accrued Deferred Pay, also subsistence allowance if payable. Balance of deferred Pay will be payable as soon as the soldier's Pay account has been finalised.
 8. Final Settlement of the soldier's account will be made by the District Paymaster in Australia.
 9. If a soldier has enlisted in one Military District, but has his home or relatives in another, he will be permitted to disembark and be discharged in that other District, on the understanding that the Commonwealth will not subsequently be liable to transfer him to the District of his original enlistment. Any soldier desiring such change of District of Disembarkation can arrange same by application to the Officer commanding the Transport.
In all cases where the home or family of the soldier is situated at a distance from the port of disembarkation a free warrant to the railway station nearest such home will be issued from port of disembarkation.
 10. All the above provisions apply to the Australian Nursing Service.
 11. Cases have occurred of men absenting themselves during the journey from France to England, and during the journey from Depots in United Kingdom to the ship's side, and of men overstaying leave and being therefore absent from embarkation.
Such practices not only very seriously dislocate embarkation procedure, but also involve that the men guilty thereof remain a charge upon the State for longer than necessary.
It is to be clearly understood that any man so offending will become liable to the forfeiture, in whole or in part, of any or all of the privileges or payments prescribed above, both before embarkation, during voyage, and after disembarkation.
The instruction is to be made known widely among all ranks.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS NO. 3ANNEXURE A.

INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING PREPARATION OF REPATRIATION PRECEDENCE ROLLS.

6. It must be clearly explained to all ranks throughout the A.I.F. that any soldier of whatever rank required "for duty" must continue to serve, whether in Europe, Australia, or elsewhere, until his services are no longer required, or until he can be released, even though he may under these rules have become entitled to repatriation and discharge in priority of others who are repatriated before him. Such "duty" personnel will be of the following natures:-
 - (a) Unit Cadres - who must remain with their Units to the last in order to close up its ~~xxxxxx~~ affairs.
 - (b) "Demobilisers," i.e., personnel employed in connection with the demobilisation, such as Staffs of the Demobilisation Service, Ordnance duties, embarkation duties, transport duties, caretakers of animals and equipment and the like.

QUARTERMASTER'S REPORT - MONTH ENDING 31st JANY., 1919.

During the month, no change was made in the Battalion's billeting area.

Rations were drawn from first line transport from A.S.C. dump at THY-le-CHATEAU, and delivered to Q.M. Store, where they were cut up, and delivered to C.Q.M.S.'s.

Vegetable ration was light, but this was supplemented by purchases from the villagers, the articles purchased being paid for out of Regimental funds, and issued to Companies according to their ration strength.

Bread ration was good, and meat ration was as usual.

During the month, a good supply of Hats, Tunics, Freeches, and Boots was drawn from Ordnance, and issued to the men.

Baths at NALINES were arranged by Brigade once a week, when a change of underclothing was given in exchange for those worn by the men.

The whole staff is now completely changed, as the old hands (1915 men) marched out for Australia, and new men were taken in from the Companies to fill their places.

TRANSPORT SECTION - MONTHLY REPORT - MONTH ENDING 31.1.19.

During the month, the transport remained with the Battalion in the village of GOURDINNE.

There were no changes from the ordinary routine of work, this consisting merely of drawing rations from A.S.C. dumps at THY-le-CHATEAU, and delivering to Q.M. Store, the number of limbers required for this purpose being four per day.

A few limbers were used at different times for the purpose of carting shale, to be spread in the streets of the village traversed by Battalion traffic. Owing to them being covered with snow, and the whole surface frozen, they were in a highly dangerous condition, both for foot and horse traffic. With a coating of shale on top, the danger was minimized.

There was a slight change in the personnel of the section, a number of the older members (1915 men) marching out, and proceeding to England for return to Australia under the Repatriation scheme. Their places in the section were filled by men of a late category from the Companies.

The fodder ration for the month was fair, and the horses are all in fair condition. There were no cases of sickness or disease, and no evacuations from other causes.

The work of painting the limbers was proceeded with, and repairs carried out where necessary.

The attendance is low, due chiefly to leave, and visits to factories, etc.

Text-books for the elementary classes have arrived.

A small reading library has also been obtained from England.

There are 22 men attending schools outside unit area.

About 50 men have visited works and factories in the Charleroi area.
