

On 11.10.18 Orders were received from 7th A. I. Brigade (Brigade Special Order 260/31 of the 11th instant) that the 25th Battalion would be absorbed into 26th Battalion as from 12.10.18.

Prior to this both 25th and 26th Battalions had been reorganised into 2 Companies each: the idea being that 26th Battalion would form "A" and "B" Companies and 25th Battalion

"C" and "D" Companies of 26th Battalion.

The transfer of personnel was completed by 6 pm 12,10,18. It was not necessary to shift the men into new billets (as the two Battalions were billetted side by side) except in the case of Battalion Headquarters details. These changes were all completed on 13.10.18 and the new Battalion Headquarters reorganised, living and working together.

No trouble was experienced in the re-organisation as the men, who had had the situation explained to them, realised the necessity and soundness of the re-organisation, and, although it was a bitter blow, to them, accepted the situation like soldiers and men and rendered every assistance by their whole-

hearted support.

Both half Battalions, briginal 25th and 26th are being kept together and commanded by their own Officers and N.C.Os. The first Battalion Parade was held on Sunday 13th inst for a Church Parade. Since then we have held a Battalion Parade each morning where a satisfactory, high standard of discipline has been maintained, the men of each Battalion mingling and chatting with each other during spells, "Smoko" and etc.
On 13.10.18 the First Line Transport was handed over to

2nd Australian Div. Train. Personnel which had been transferred to 26th Battalion accom-

panied Transport until such time as it is finally disposed of

when they will report back to the Battalion. Return of Mobilisation Stores to D.A.D.O.S., 2nd Australian Division, was commenced on Tuesday 16.10.18 and completed on Thursday 18.10.18. A complete list of all Shortages is attached, giving reasons for the shortages. D.A.D.O.S. informed us that the return of Stores was very complete and he considered it highly satisfactory, considering our many recent engagements

and long and hurried moves. Complete copies of all the following records were handed

to 26th Battalion on 15.10.18:

1. Copy of records of all O/Ranks transferred. 2. Particulars and descriptions of all men now Absent

without Leave.

3. Court of Enquiry Proceedings on men reported "Missing". 4. Outstanding F.G.C.M. papers.

5. Nominal Rolls of Officers and O/Ranks recommended for Decorations; but to whom no award has yet been made.

6. Nominal Rolls of Officers and O/Ranks who have been awarded decorations, specifying whether Medal or Riband has been awarded.

7. Particulars of all men undergoing suspended sentences. 8. Particulars of all men undergoing Imprisonment and Field Punishment.

9. Army Forms "B. 122".

10.. Particulars of Schools attended by N.C.Os and men.

11. Gradation List of N.C.Os.

12. Nominal Roll of all Ranks transferred to 26th Battalion together with records of Officers, showing Schools attended and Leave Roster for Officers and O/Ranks.

All Paybooks of Unit have been completed. Officers' and Sergeants' Messes have been wound up. Completed "War Diary" has been completed to 12th instant and forwarded to Australian War Records Section.

All Records: Books and Documents of the Battalion which are required for record purposes have been packed and sent to Officer in Charge Records, Horseferry Road, London.

The Regimental Canteen was wound up and the entire stock

bought by 26th Battalion. This amount was refunded to Regimental Trust Account and the Whole amount, totalling £531.6.1 (Five hundred and thirty one pounds six shillings and one penny stg.) transferred to 26th Battalion Regimental Trust Account on 20.10. 18.

Mobile Echelon of S.A.A. and Bombs was taken over by 7th A.I. Brigade, to be utilised for training purposes for

the Brigade.

I now report the absorption of 25th Battalion into 26th
Battalion entirely completed, including personnel, personal
equipment, Regimental Trust Account & etc/; and the return
of all Mobilisation Stores completed. The whole re-organisation

has been carried out in an entirely satisfactory manner.

The remaining personnel of 25th Battalion - Myself, Adjutant, R.Q.M.S., Orderly Room Sergeant and two clerks are now ready to proceed to England as per Orders, and conclude with the wish that the day is not far distant when we shall be returning, to re-organise the 25th Battalion prior to return to Australia.

- 3. One Guide for the 3 Companies will report to 0. C. "D" Company at 10.45 p.m. - Order of March will be "D", "C", "A". Companies will maintain touch with company in front, as only one guide is available. Relief will commence on receipt of this Order.

REPORT ON OPERATIONS - - - OCTOBER 3, 1 9 1 8.

On night 2/3rd October the Battalion which was concentrated in G. 6. b and d relieved the 20th Battalion, A. I F. in front Line from B. 25. d. 6.9 to A. 24. b. 8.1. Relief was completed by 1. 15 am. 3rd instant without casualties or trouble.

PREPARATION: After receipt of orders for attack time was short but all preparations for an attack had been made beforehand.

A reconnaissance was made during daylight and plan of attack carefully explained to all ranks.

JUMPING OFF LINE: The Front Line as taken over from 20th Bn. was practically the jumping off line and was used as such. FORMATIONS: Attack was carried out on a three company frontage; each Company having two platoons in front Wave and one platoon (as mopping up party) in second wave.

The frontage being fairly wide (about 1400 yds) necessarily made the line fairly thin.

ADVANCE: At Zero our men formed up close under barrage and followed it on No enemy were encountered for the first 500 yards of the attack.

Posts were then encountered echeloned across the front up to the BEAUREVOIR LINE.

This line was very strongly held by the enemy who put up a stiff fight here. He was also very well supported by machine guns. This line checked us for a few minutes but the finest dash and initiative was shown by each officer N.C.O. and man in surrounding and out-manoeuvring these posts. While this fight was in progress two tanks (none of which had been with us up till now) caught us up and with their assistance this line was rushed and captured. A large number of enemy and machine guns were taken here. Battalion then continued their advance meeting with considerable resistance to our objective, which was captured at 7.15 a.m.

At one strong post alone about B. 13. b. 6.0, 50 prisoners (including a R.M.O. and Adjutant) and 8 M. G. were captured.

Report on Operations, 3.10.18 (Con) -2- 25th A. I. Bn.

ENEMY RESISTANCE: The first isolated posts encountered and not show much fight and surrendered freely. In the BEAUVOIR LINE the enemy put up quite a good fight for a time but seeing our eattack was being pushed on in a determined manner and on the appearance of the two tanks and his line being rushed, he surrendered.

As in many previous operations his machine gunners fought well while his infantry gave in easily. Most of his machine gunners were killed at their guns.

OUR BARRAGE: was quite good in ratum volume but the shooting was very poor and a great deal of short shooting which caused us a good number of casualties. The shooting all round was erratic.

For the opposition encountered the rate of barrage was found to be too slow.

ENEMY SHELL FIRE: At 6.8 a.m. enemy dropped a barrage across our whole front not very heavy and scattered all about. Mostly 4.2 and 77 mm. With some 5.9. One noticeable feature about his shelling was that he used more shrapnel than usual but the bursts were too high and not very effective. He also fired a number of incendiary shells which scattered a shower of burning phosphorous over a considerable area.

TANK CO-OPERATION: None of the tanks were up with us at Zero hour - only co-operated with us during the day. These two tanks caught us up at the BEAUVOIR LINE and assisted in the capture of that line. One tank capsized and caught fire about B. 14. a. 6.9, the other came back to MUSHROOM QUARRY and was used by a crew of our own men as follows:--

The 5th Bde on our right were not up with our advance and a couple of enemy M.G. about B.15.c.3.1 were causing the 5th Bde. a deal of trouble and shooting into our backs. The crew of the tank were exhausted so I mammed the tank with a crew of my own men and the tank officer and driver. This tank then started for the machine gun post but unfortunately received a direct hit right through the tank which completely placed it out of action.

The work of the two tanks was of the greatest assistance and the tank crews were anxious to do all they could to assist us.

COMMUNICATION: Bde advance Signal Station was established at

96

MUSHROOM QUARRY by about 7.45 a.m. Their line was cut almost at once but communication was re-established about 8.30 a.m. and was well maintained all day. We were in touch with Pde. Adv. Station by 7.45 a.m.

Visual communication was established, and successfully maintained betweed Bn. H.Qs and Companies.

CONSOLIDATION: On capture of our objective and after 26th Bn had passed through us the Battalion was reorganised and disposed in trenches in B. 14.a and C. When it was discovered the 5th Bde had not advanced with us a flank defence was established with two Companies, one Coy. in trench running from B. 14.c.8.5 to B. 14.d.2.7 and one company in trench from B. 14.c.6.6 to B. 14.c.9.1 where we were in touch with 5th Bde.

One Company was also sent up to 26th Bm. and came under their tactical command.




