



As firing from the air is centinually being practiced on many Aerodromes and as this may be a source of danger to Pilots from other Aerodromes, a large white diamond must be placed as a warning in the centre of an Aerodrome on which such practices are taking place. Failing this being done, the airship is to open fire as soon as the plane gets within the machine gun range. The woman had gone down for the third time when Cadet Gaze reached her, dived and brought her to the surface, undoubtedly saving her life".  The attention of all ranks is called to the necessity of obtaining permission from land owners for shooting game and rabbits.
