1 ... PALESTINE FRONT.

WESTERN SECTOR.

- JAN 1918

(a) Air reconnaissance - Behind the southern defences of TABSOR are some 200 Tents and Shelters and behind the western defences some 300. (This shows an increase in this area of 100 tents and shelters since the 7th inst). In the IRTAH-FURDISTA-FERON area (about 1½ miles S. of TUL KERAM) are 200 Tents and Shelters. (This shows a decrease of 60 since the 9th inst). (R.F.C. 9/1/18).

(b) The camps in the area north of TABSOR, approximately covered by squares 094.T. and Y. and parts of squares A and B, are shown by air reconnaissance to have changed as follows during the period 18/12/17 and 5/1/18:-

18/12/17 ...	940 Tents and Shelters.
26/12/17 ...	751 -do-
20/12/17 ...	662 -do-
5/1/18 ...	621 -do-
8/1/18 ...	1300 -do-

(c) Patrols report the high ground N. of the line SHEBTIN (095.Z.11) - JEMMELAH (099.F.9) - 099.F.13 to be clear of the enemy. (20th Corps 9/1/18).

(d) Reinforcements are reported to have arrived at MESSUDIEH JUNCTION (098.D.35) from DAMASCUS on the 3rd inst and to have then proceeded to the Western Sector via TUL KERAM.

EASTERN SECTOR.

(a) Air reconnaissance - Short lengths of trench were observed in square 113.A.24.d and south of TALAT ED DUMM, in square 113.G.19.b); also to the N.W. of that place in square 113.G.7.a. In square 113.F.18.d there were several rifle pits. At AAR SABA only slight movement of civil was observed but to the N.E. there was about 30 bivouacs in square 114.R.14.d and some 60 horses picketed near square 114.R.7.c. (R.F.C. 9/1/18).

(b) Patrols report the country $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles E. and N. of KH. TINJIS (114.Q.9.) and the high ground overlooking MAR SABA to be clear of the enemy. (20th Corps 9/1/18)

(c) A few enemy shells evidently fired from the direction of JUFNA (099.M.13.a) burst high over SURDAH (099.M.27.a) and to the west, similar shells also burst about 600 yards N.W.E. of MEZEIRAT EL KIBLIYEH (099.G.21.b). (20th Corps 9/1/18).

(d) An agent states that on the 3rd inst at EL LUBBAN (099.H.12) there was a force of GERMAN and TURKISH infantry marching south; their destination was said to be RUMAON (113.A.7) and DAR JERIR (113.S.13).

2 ... TOPOGRAPHY.

(a) North of KALKILIEH the railway appears intact, but there is water on either side. (R.F.C. 9/1/18).

(b) The marshes in the RAMADAN area (N.W. by E. of TABSOR) are again full of water. (R.F.C. 9/1/18).

3 ... MORAL.

It is reported by natives that many deserters from the enemy forces are scattered about the country to the north of their present line. Some of these deserters stated that they had only been receiving rations about once every four days.

(b) It is reported that no BULGARIAN troops are fighting with the Turks in ASIA at the present time.

3 ... ASIA MINOR.

There is further confirmation of the withdrawal of troops from Western ASIA MINOR, and apparently, with the exception of the SMYRNA defences manned by the largely Arab 56th Division, the force has been reduced to the minimum required for Coastguard duty and Coast defence artillery. The 57th Division, and probably the whole of the 47th Div. have moved east. The headquarters of the 5th Army are still at PANDERMA (south coast of sea of MARMORA) and L. of C. depots and hospitals remain at SMYRNA.

4 ... TOPOGRAPHICAL.

(a) The railway line around the blown up bridge in 084.V.5 (west of ET TAIYIBEH) is partly under water. On the 14th there was no appearance of the bridge being in use.
(R.F.C. 14/1/18).

(b) The ground north of ARSUF (070.V.21) was still flooded on the 14th. (R.F.C. 14/1/18).

WESTERN SECTOR.

(a) Air reconnaissance - The whole of the TABSOR line is now a series of systematic defences and on the west the line is being extended to the north. The majority of the tents and shelters behind the TABSOR Defences are well dug in. To the east of the village of ET TIREH there are three cavalry lines, each for 50 horses in the gardens.

(b) There was slight enemy movement in ABU KUSH (099.M. 19) at about hours 1600 on the 9th and a British patrol in the vicinity of square 099.G.30.d was fired on by the enemy. (20th Corps: 10/1/19).

EASTERN SECTOR.

Air reconnaissance - No movement was observed in this sector during the early morning.

1 ... PALESTINE FRONT.

WESTERN SECTOR.

(a) Aerial reconnaissance on the 10th inst reported 250 boll tents and 950 shelters in squares 084.S.T.Y. and B., this being about normal. There was a camp of 200 cavalry in the wadis near ET TIREH (084.T.30). A new camp of 90 boll tents, apparently colour-washed, was observed at DEMWARIH (084.X.3). Fresh work had been carried out on the redoubt west of JILJULIEH in 084.D.14.b. There was no movement noted in the TABSOR system, but new work on trenches in 084.A.57.c and d. (R.F.C. 10/1/18).

(b) On the 11th aerial reconnaissance reported fresh work on the redoubt north of JILJULIEH in 084.D.12.a.23, and an increase of 10 tents at JILJULIEH since the 3rd inst, the total now being 52. The trench in 084.D.9.a, just north of BIR ADAS, was confirmed; a new trench, 20 yards long and facing south was soon in 084.D.8.d, and a new crescent shaped work facing S.E. in 084.D.9.a.78. Gun emplacements in 084.B.15.d.51 and B.21.a.59 were occupied. (R.F.C. 11/1)

EASTERN SECTOR.

(c) On the 10th considerable activity was noted about 098.Z.14 but not more than 200 infantry and 90 cavalry were seen in the neighbourhood. 100 cavalry were in camp at BALATA (098.V.10) and 500 at HUWARAH (098.X.13, 14), but this latter had decreased by the 11th, when only 250 were seen and the camp of 35 boll tents appeared to have been removed. There was no fresh work on trenches in 098.V.17 and 18, south-east of BALATA. Camps of 60 tents and shelters reported at YETMA (098.Z.9) on 10th inst, and 19 to 23 at YASUF (098.Y.12) on the 23rd ult had been removed. (R.F.C. 11/1/18).

(d) A trench 250 yards long was reported at 113.G.13 central, west of TALAT AND DUMM (113.G.13.b) on the 11th, and two circular redoubts in 113.Q.14. Round JERICHO were 100 tents and shelters, being an increase of 20 since 5th inst; round the village were 100 infantry. (R.F.C. 11/1/18).

2 ... BEST OF JORDAN.

(a) Small camps were observed on 10th and 11th at EL GHORANIYEH bridge (127.Q.2) of tents and shelters; 3 miles due east of bridge, 3 bell tents, 10 shelters; 1 mile further east, 3 large marquees, 15 large shelters, and 50 ordinary shelters. At AMMAN Station there were 130 rolling stock; 200 infantry were scattered around. Transport and traffic on AMMAN-JERICHO road normal. (R.F.C. 10/1/18).

(b) It is reported that tranchos are being constructed between SHUNET NIMRIN^N and the JORDAN. (Agent: 9/1/18).

4 ... TOPOGRAPHICAL.

- (a) Road for 300 yards on either side of GHORANIYEH bridge (127.Q.2) shows signs of much use and is badly cut up. The remainder of the road between the bridge ^{and} of JERICHO appears to be in good condition. (R.F.C. 11/1/18).
- (b) There appears to be a great deal of flood water close to the mouth of the JORDAN and at the head of the DEAD SEA in 128.A.7. and 8. Two large square tanks at 113.M.16 are reported to be holding water. (R.F.C. 11/1/18).
- (c) The bridge in 099.M.11.G.87, N.E. of JUTNA, is reported to be destroyed. (R.F.C. 10/1/18).
- (d) The wadi running north and south from 084.S.29 to 084.A.28 (west of TABSOR) appears to have steep banks, especially in (approximately) A.16.b and d and A.11.a and c. Its bed appears to be dry and sandy. (R.F.C. 10/1/18).

1 ... PALESTINE FRONT.

EASTERN SECTOR.

(a) Aerial reconnaissance on the 11th and 12th reported trenches about 500 yards long being dug facing north, south and west, in 113.D.19.b (approx) north of WADI FARAH.

On the 12th 300 horses grazing and 200 men were seen in small groups east of TALAT ED DUMA. In 113.M.27.a (north of NEBY AUSA) there were 50-80 horses on new lines, and at TEL ES SULTAN (113.K.10) a new camp of 20 bell tents was reported. (R.F.C. 11th and 12th Jan/18).

(b) 150 cavalry were seen moving north on the 12th on the LUBBAN-NABLUS road in 093.Z.26. Horse lines for 350 were seen at HUWARAH (093.X.13,14). (R.F.C. 12/1/18).

(c) Patrol to within 300 yards of KH. ANNIR (099.F.22.b) on the night of the 11/12th saw no trace of enemy. (20th Corps: 12/1/18).

WESTERN SECTOR.

(d) On the 9th inst 700 infantry were seen $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles E. of MEJDEL YABA marching east, and a working party of 250, unusually large for this area, was observed north of KH. DIKHERIY. (085.U.13). (21st Corps: 11/1/18).

(e) Aerial reconnaissance on the 11th reports that the trench in 084.A.26.b north-east of TABSOR has been made into a circular redoubt. On the 12th a slight increase in tents and shelters was noted behind the ridge in 084.B.2.b and c, and A.12.a. and b north-east of TABSOR. The trench system at TABSOR was normal. An increase of 20 shelters was observed at MISKEH (084.B.3), the total now being 100, and 40 new shelters were seen between MISKEH and ET TIREH in 084.B.5 b (R.F.C. 11/12/1/1918).

2... EAST OF JORDAN.

One mile east of the GHORANIYEH Bridge (127.Q.2) a camp of 9 bell tents and 16 shelters was reported on the 12th, being a decrease of 50^{TS} since the 10th. 3 miles further east the camp of 3 tents and 10 shelters reported on the 10th, had increased to 15 tents and 40 shelters.
(R.F.C. 12/1/18).

3... SYRIA L. of O.

(a) Aerial reconnaissance on the 12th reports no fresh work seen on the KAKON (084.U.4) trench line.

(b) The garrison at TADMUR on 16th December was estimated as 200 CIRCASSIAN Cavalry, 700 TURKISH Infantry, and 2 small guns. The absence of road or railway construction work between DAMASCUS and TADMUR was confirmed. (I.E.F. "D", 11/1/18).

(c) It is reported that many lines of trenches exist on Point 9195, DAR EL ADIB, 20 miles south-east of TRIPOLI. (Reference map, 1/250,000, TRIPOLI sheet, square G.4 - Information is six weeks old).

1 ... PALESTINE FRONT.

EASTERN SECTOR.

- (a) Early on the 13th inst MUGHASH (099.X.5) was successfully raided, the village cleared, and 5 prisoners brought in. (20th Corps: 13/1/18).
- (b) On the 12th patrols reached ALN EL ALLA (099.V.4.d) DEIR BIWAN (099.V.22.a) and within 400 yards of BEIT ELLA (099.F.6) without any enemy being seen. Small enemy patrols were seen in SHEIKH CHEITH (099.F.10.b) on the 11th and from the direction of ET TAIYIBEH (113.S.19) in the WADI EL ALN on the 12th. (20th Corps: 12/1/18).

WESTERN SECTOR.

- (c) Cavalry patrol of 9 has been seen proceeding from MEJDEL YABA (095.J.1) towards MEZERAH (085.P.30) about mid-day on the 7th, 8th and 9th inst. (21st Corps: 12/1/18).

4 ... ENEMY RUSES.

CAMOUFLAGE - Cactus has been put on trenches in 084.C.6.b. S.E. of TABSIR, (21st Corps: 11/1/18).

5 ... TOPOGRAPHICAL.

(a) A patrol to AIN FRAH (113.F.2) on 11th found a Well there and running water in the Wadi. (20th Corps: 12/1/18)

(b) Recent information from Native sources states that the JILJULIEH-FUNDUK (C98.P.19) - SHECHEM track is now used by wheels, and that it is passable for guns and wheeled transport. The steepest and most difficult part is between AZZUN (C84.J.35) and FUNDUK. The journey from JILJULIEH to SHECHEM can be covered in 6 to 7 hours riding. A telegraph line follows the road. (21st Corps: 12/1/18).

(c) Native sources report that the following tracks could be made passable for wheels with improvement in certain places:-

- (1) BIR EZ ZEIT (C99.M.8) - UMM SUFFAH (C99.D.17) - NEBY SALEH (C99.C.12) - ABUD (C99.C.7) - DEIR DAKLEH (C85.V.27) - MEJDEL YABA (C85.U.1); worst part is from BIR EZ ZEIT to UMM SUFFAH.
 - (2) DEIR DAKLEH (C85.V.27) - EL KEFR (C99.A.14) - BERUKIN (C99.A.16) - FURKHAM (C99.B.9) - KEFR HARIS (C92.T.4); route 3 along W. AUWAD is better than this.
 - (3) BERUKIN (C99.A.10) along W. AUWAD to KEFR HARIS (C92.T.4) - JEMMAIN (C98.W.32).
 - (4) ET TIREH (C85.R.18.a) - DFIR DAKLEH (C85.V.27)
 - (5) SHEBTIN (C85.Z.11) - SHUKBAH (C85.X.34) - RENTIS (C85.X.1).
 - (6) JILJULIEH - up W. KANAH-MFS HA (C84.N.17.a) - BIDIEH (C98.S.7); steep in places.
 - (7) AZZUN (C84.J.35) - KEFR ZIBAD (C84.Z.30); a difficult stretch near KH. SIR. (C84.J.23).
 - (8) KEFR ZIBAD - BAKA (C98.G.17) - KURYET HAJJA (C98.P.16) - FUNDUK; stony near BAKA but not very steep. (21st Corps: 12/1/18).
- (d) The track DFIR EL KUDDIS (C85.Z.28) - SHFBTIN is reported as too difficult for wheels.

(a) Aerial reconnaissance on the 14th reported a new camp of 10 long brown shelters and 20 small brown shelters in 128.A.7, west of the mouth of the JORDAN. At RUJM EL Bahr (114.V.17) two boats were unloading at the jetty, and 11 more boats were 100 yards from the shore. There was a new camp of 20 bell tents $\frac{1}{2}$ mile west of the old camp by the jetty. 500 yards south of JFRICHO a new camp of 10 E.P.'s was observed in 113.K.30.a, and 100 infantry were seen in the village with 200 cavalry scattered about. On the north side of the rising wooded ground, but clear of the woods, south of SHUNET NIMRIN (127.P.17) 4 guns are in action; also $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles east of the GHORANIYEH Bridge (127.Q.2) and $\frac{5}{8}$ mile south of the main road 4 guns in action, and $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles east of those $\frac{1}{4}$ mile south of the main road 4 more guns in action. There are many boll tents, sholtors, brush-wood huts spread about west of SHUNET NIMRIN (127.P.17). East of the JORDAN on both sides of the main road there are over 100 boll tents.

3 ... SYRIA L. OF C.

(a) Agent reports mid-December that a 75 mm. gun has been placed on the plain N.E. of the Junction of railway lines at RAYAK in place of the anti-aircraft machine guns formerly there but now removed.

20/4/17. The men on the march have been beaten until blood came.

13/6/17. The lock of the (machine) gun was lost, so we searched for it for an hour. I was very much afraid that a private had taken it and deserted to the enemy; so I called the sergeant and beat him till he fell. I picked him up and kicked him down again.

27/6/17. The O.O. of our division on a visit last night said to the O.O. 3rd battalion "Beat those officers who don't obey".

(a) Aerial reconnaissance on the 13th reports no tents or shelters observed at RUJIA EL BAIR (114.V.17); on the 14th 60 tents and shelters were reported here. 30 infantry were moving east on the road at TALAT ED DUMM (113.G.13.b); on the JERICHO-ES SALT road 100 cavalry were moving west in 113.L.11 and 200 infantry were also moving westwards in 113.L.12.

In 097.K.27, south of ATTARA (099.K.21) a new small redoubt was observed. Throughout the whole area there was but little movement. (R.F.C. 18/1/18).

Western Sector.

(b) On the 15th a Wireless Station near a large two-storyed house N.E. of BERUKIN (099.A.10.c) village was reported. A signal section of 30 GERMANS is reported to be here. On the 16th an unusual number of Natives, some of whom were armed, were observed moving about at DEIR ALLA (095.W.5.a) and DEIR BALLUT (095.V.14.b). (21st Corps 17/1/18).

(c) Aerial reconnaissance on the 16th reports that several columns of smoke were observed rising from the vicinity of the trenches at JILJULIEN (094.D.1a). There was apparently fresh work on the trench in 094.D.12.a.19, and there were several newly dug scrapes and holes near the road in 094.D.20.B. There was fresh work on the trenches in 094.D.1.a, B.31.c, and B.32.a.

Desertors from the 16th and 18th Rgts. (6th Division) state that the relief of this division by the 2nd Division had been completed, and that their regiments were under orders to move out of the line on January 16th. The probable destination of the 6th Division is KIRKUK (150 miles N. of BAGDAD) but some units will possibly remain at DOZ KHURMATLI (120 miles N. of BAGDAD). The 6th Division held the DIALA line, and the KIFRI (100 miles N.E. of BAGDAD) line was held by the 2nd Division prior to this relief.

(d) WESTERN ANATOLIA.

The following information was obtained from prisoners of 1st Bn. 172nd Rgt, 56th Division.

This regiment was formed in December 1916, and consisted of 4 battalions. The 3rd battalion is all ARAB, and officered by Arabs. All TURKISH troops are divided into 4 categories, the 4th Class being used only for Coast defence; the 1st and 2nd battalions of this regt belong to the 4th Class.

All men in the firing line carry one hand grenade, 210 rounds of ammunition and an iron ration. Coast Defence troops carry the same without bombs or rations, but have 2 hand grenades at each post of 6 or 8 men. From previous information received the 4th battalion 172nd Rgt proceeded to MEMEL (15 miles N. of SMYRNA) probably as a draft for the 47th Division.

(e) EUROPE.

A deserter from the 45th Rgt. 15th Division, taken on January 10th, confirms the departure from ROUMANIA for

It seems quite probable, whilst negotiations are proceeding with RUSSIA and ROUMANIA, that the Turks will keep a division on that front, so as to maintain their claim to some of the spoil.

4 ... ORGANIZATION.

Prisoners frequently make statements that a certain regiment has been practically destroyed and the remainder has been absorbed into some other regiments. What often occurs is that in such a case practically all the rank and file remaining, and most of the remaining officers, are so drafted and that the Cadre of the regiment is then withdrawn to reappear at a later date, having been in the meantime replenished in personnel.

5 ... TOPOGRAPHICAL.

(a) Bridges. Iron bridge at 099.L.19.1 reported by agent to have been destroyed; also one bridge on main road N.E. of JUTNA (099.M.16) and two south of same.

Eastern Sector.

(a) Aerial reconnaissance on the 19th reports 100 infantry were observed moving west in 113.F.18, west of TALAT ED DUMM (113.G.13). In 113.F.18, 23 and 24, west of TALAT ED DUMM, there was a distinct increase in rifle pits. In squares 113.G.14.a. and 1, G.25.b. and G.26.a, around TALAT ED DUMM, a series of short lengths of trench was observed, being apparently the commencement of a new system. The trenches in 113.D.14, astride the MUKHMAS (099.X.5) - JERICHO road, appeared not to be manned. (R.F.C. 19/1/18).

(b) On the 17th 200 Turks were seen moving north about square 113.D.32, 2 miles north of TALAT ED DUMM, and 400-500 Turks were seen moving from 113.C.16 towards RAS ET TAWIL (113.C.15). (20th Corps: 13/1/18).

(c) On the 19th two new horse lines of 30 each were observed in 099.H.12.b and 150 infantry in small parties were seen on the road near KHAN LUBBAH (099.J.13). 100 cavalry were moving south on the road in 098.Z.8 and at HUWARAH (098.X.13, 14) 450 horses were seen on lines (normally 300-350 horses here).

Between HUWARAH and 098.V.22 there were 300 infantry in small groups on both sides of the road. The trench line in 098.V.16 - V.18 is evidently falling into disrepair. (R.F.C. 19/1/18).

(d) There was heavy destructive fire on the newly captured positions north of BEITIM (099.U.12) on the morning of the 19th with 7.7 cm and 10.5 cm H.E. and shrapnel. Intermittent destructive fire with H.E. and shrapnel on our posts immediately east and west of the JERUSALEM-Nablus road was also reported. (20th Corps: 19/1/18).

The 701st GERMAN Infantry battalion came by the following route from GERMANY to TURKEY.-

NEUHAMMER (80 miles N.N.W. of BRESLAU) -
HUNGARIAN Frontier - DANUBE - BUDAPEST -
BELGRADE - SOFIA - ADRIANOPLIS - CONSTANTINOPLE.

The journey took $7\frac{1}{2}$ days by train. The men travelled in cattle and goods trucks, either 20 men or 5 M.C.O's with 200 cases of ammunition per truck.

7 ... MAN-POWER.

A GERMAN prisoner in a letter home states he saw TURKISH recruits drilling at HAIDAR PASJA (SCUTARI) in civilian clothes which wore in rags, without shoes, and with but two rifles among 18 men.

8 ... ENEMY MORAL.

The following extracts are taken from the diary of a Turkish Artillery Officer:-

8/11/17 ... I gave a good whipping to the signaller who had taken my horse and forced me to walk all night.

15/11/17 ... For the last 3 days we have been wandering about with the 4th battery of the 13th Artillery Regiment. Hope is lying within me. HILMI came back and reported that our SADIK had deserted to the enemy. I was very cold last night and had very little to eat.

26/11/17 ... The battalion is alone for - no ammunition, no transport.

7/12/17 ... Our sergeant beat an officer of the 9th battery.

1. PALESTINE FRONT.

LOCATION OF ENEMY TROOPS AND POSITIONS.

Eastern Sector.

(a) Aerial reconnaissance on the 20th reported 50 new heaps of stores in 113.G.15, east of TALAT ED DUKK. At JERICHO 200 tents and shelters were seen, of which at least half were bell tents; this is a decrease of 40 bell tents and 30 shelters since the previous day. There were 600 infantry in small parties in the north of the town. There were apparently no troops in RUMMON (113.A.7). (R.F.C. 20/1/18).

(b) On the 18th considerable movement was observed from 113.F. 15. central to 113.F.23.d; enemy troops were also seen moving from east to west across the JORDAN VALLEY. Four parties of 125 Turks in each with pack transport were observed moving west along the track in 113.D.11, and some 600 Turks with wagon transport were seen moving from the low ground in the WADY FARAH (113.F.5,6) towards RAS ET TAVIL (113.C.15). There was continual movement on Point 2791 (099.K.20.c). (20th Corps 19/1/18).

These movements are additional to those already reported on the 18th in I.S. No. 178, para. 2. It is probable that reliefs have been taking place in the line east of JERUSALEM, but whether the movement indicates the arrival of fresh troops is not yet clear.

(c) Aerial reconnaissance on the 20th reports that the trenches in 099.K.20.d., 20.a. and 19.c., with a small length in 099.K. 26 Central, do not appear to be properly constructed fire trenches and seem unfinished. (R.F.C. 19/1/18)

(d) A reliable native, who was in BIR EZ ZEIT, about the 13th, confirms the report that it is unoccupied by the Turks.

He states that the Turks hold an outpost line ATTARA (099.K. 21) - DEIR GHUSSANE (099.A.27). At KHAN LUBBAN (099.J.

13) about the 4th he saw 5 or 6 guns, each drawn by 2 mules only, coming south. Just east of RAFIDIA (098.M.29), about 1st Jany, were 200 Turkish shelters, and between NABLUS and RAFIDIA were 5 large tents occupied by Germans.

Western Sector.

(e) Aerial reconnaissance on the 20th reports that the earthwork astride the road in 084.C.5.b.71 has been enlarged to a large oblong pit, the width of the road; work was observed to be proceeding on it. The Wadis in 084.S.25 and 26 were reported to contain a large force of Turks, though there were no trenches in those squares. (R.F.C. 20/1/13).

2. EAST OF JORDAN.

Aerial reconnaissance on the 20th reports 280 tents and shelters and 6 F.P. tents between EL GHORANIYEH (127.Q.2) and 127.U.13. On the 19th 111 tents and shelters and 6 E.P. tents were reported in this area. It is evident that shelters are lowered at certain times of day (R.F.C. 20/1/18).

3. SYRIA L. OF C.

An agent reports that between 25th Dec. and 6th Jany 7150 Turkish troops, 1610 Austro-German troops, 16 15-cm. guns, 3 other guns, and 9 machine guns, passed south through ALEPPO. 300 Turkish troops under German officers left ALEPPO in addition for ALEXANDRPTTA.

While it is probable that the above figures are somewhat exaggerated, there is little doubt that the enemy is straining every effort to reinforce the Syrian Front.

4. TOPOGRAPHICAL.

1. Bridges. (a) The bridge over the W. ISHKAR (084.D.32.a.) is of stone and can carry 5 tons weight; slightly damaged by gun fire. (21st Corps 19/1/18).
(b) Bridges on the railway between NABLUS and JENIN are reported to have been mined.
2. Railways. (c) The rails S. of KALKILIEH (084.H.26) have been removed.
3. Roads. (d) Motor lorries seen travelling S. by E. on road from KALKILIEH (084.H.324K.2).
(e) H.T. reported on road running N. from TABSOR (084.A.23). (21st Corps. 19/1/18).

5. SUPPLIES.

Prisoners from the 2nd Battalion, 58th Regt. captured north of BEITUN (099.U.12) on the 18th, state that their battalion had received no food from the army for several days, and that the men lived on what they could take from the inhabitants. (20th Corps 19/1/18).

6. ORGANISATION.

A German private while on active service in Turkey is paid 15 marks 90 pfennig every ten days, in the form of 4 marks (1 mejidieh) cash and the remainder in Turkish paper at the rate of 20 pfennig to 1 piastre. Prior to the war this would have been equal to 1s. 6d. per day, but now, owing to depreciation of exchange and the value of Turkish paper, it is only equivalent to 5d per day.

7. DARDANELLES.

A report states that about 7 a.m. on the 20th Jany, the BRESLAU and GOEBEN emerged from the DARDANELLES. The BRESLAU is reported to have been sunk, and at about 10 a.m. the GOEBEN and enemy destroyers returned up the Straits. The GOEBEN, apparently badly damaged, was beached at NAGARA, which is about 20 miles N.E. of the southern entrance of the Straits.

Note:- The GOEBEN is a battle cruiser of the MOLTKE Class, and displaces 22640 tons. Its armament consists of ten 11 in., twelve 5.9 in. and 12 21 pounder guns, with four submerged torpedo tubes. Its complement is 1,013 officers and men.

The BRESLAU is a light protected cruiser of 4473 tons, with a speed of nearly 28 knots. Its armament consists of twelve 4.1 in. Q.F. guns & two torpedo tubes. It has a complement of 370 officers and men.

LOCATION OF ENEMY TROOPS AND POSITIONS.

Eastern Sector.

(a) Aerial reconnaissance on the 21st reported 50 cavalry seen moving east on the TALAT ED DUMM (113.G.13) - JERICHO road. On the JERICHO - EL GHORANIYEH (127.Q.2) road 200 infantry were observed entering JERICHO from the east; 3 miles west of EL GHORANIYEH there were 100 infantry proceeding westwards, and one mile west of that place there were 50 cavalry and 50 infantry moving east, and 100 infantry moving west. (R.F.C. 21/1/18).

(b) On the 21st a well laid out camp of 24 large long white shelters, 30-40 scattered shelters, and 30-40 horses was reported in 099.L.5 central, S.E. of TURMUS AYA. This is probably the Headquarters camp reported by Agent (Intelligence Summary : NO.177 of 18/1/18 , para 1.e).

At HUWARAH (098.X.13-14) 640 horses on lines were reported; this is an increase of 190 horses since the 19th. Camps at NABLUS were normal. (R.F.C. 21/1/18).

(c) Deserters who left NABLUS about the 12th inst estimate the force there at 3,000 TURKS and 300 GERMANS. They state that they saw two battalions and 12 small guns, each drawn by two mules, leaving the town going north along the JENIN road.

(d) Aerial reconnaissance on the 21st reports 20 men seen working on what was apparently a gun position in 084.D.12.d-K.7.c. There was fresh work on the trench in 084.A.20, 21.

(d) At LT TIRAH (094.T.30) 160 tents and shelters were observed, being an increase of 110 since 16/1/18. On the KALKILISH (094.H.25) - TUL KERAM (094.X.2) road 90 horse transport were observed moving north, the main part of the column being about 3 miles south of TUL KERAM. 40 tents were observed at TUL KERAM, being a decrease of 30 bell tents and 30 shelters since 16/1/18. In 094.V.35, 100 infantry with 6 horse transport were halted on the road. (R.F.C. 21/1/18).

(e) In the Coastal Sector, east of the railway in squares 094.M.K.H and west of the railway and south of squares 094.S and T inclusive, 1130 tents and shelters were counted on the 19th, being a decrease of 200 since the 10th. (R.F.C. and 21st Corps).

(f) On the 21st there was destructive artillery fire on 070.V.34, 28, 27, X.3.b, from 0900 to 1010 with 7.7 cm; on 094.C.1.d. at 1030 with 10.5 cm, and on 094.C.22.a., C.16, C.9.a. and d., C.2.b. and C.7.b intermittently with 10.5 and 7.7 cm.

2 ... EAST OF JORDAN.

(a) An agent reports, dated 15th inst, that 1½ miles east of JORDAN, 220 yards N. of the main JORDAN - ES SALT road and 130 yards from the woods, there are 2 lines of trenches running N. and S., 110 yards between them. A short distance E. of these and 275 yards N. of the road there are 4 A.A. guns in action. At ADIAN there are 2 battalions of infantry, and at the railway tunnel ½ mile to the south, another battalion.

3 ... SYRIA L. of C.

Desertors, who were at AFULE about 5/1/18, state that they were told that the air raid on that place on the 3rd inst had killed 40 Turks and exploded an ammunition store.

At JENIN about the 8th they saw 25 marquees and a number of motor lorries. It is possible that a motor lorry column is based on this town.

4 ... TOPOGRAPHICAL.

(1) Bridges. (a) Aqueduct bridge in 113.K.23 is used by foot passengers.

(b) There is no sign of the pontoon bridge, which, according to native reports, was being built S. of the JORDAN bridge.

(2) Water. (c) W. HARAB EL MISKEH (094.A.1 - S.20) reported to be fairly shallow and to have water in its bed nearly all its length.

(d) NAHR EL FALIK (094.S.1) reported to be very narrow near the outlet from BIRKET RAMADAN.

(3) Roads. (e) Wagon transport is possible from low ground in W. FARAH (113.G.3, 4) towards RAS EL TAWIL (113.C.15), but information as to actual route not available.

(f) ATTARA (099.K.21) - JILJILIA (099.K.5.a) is used by enemy for H.T. This confirms previous information.

(g) SEBUSTIEH - BURKA (099.K.7) is used by motor lorries.

(h) EL KERAK (Q.R.10) - EL KUTRANI (V.10) reported to be in good condition and the road from KERAK - RABBA (R.9) to be in excellent condition. A track leads down the SEIL EL BUKSASE to R.EL MEKEITA (N.09) on the DEAD SEA.

5 ... IDENTIFICATIONS.

- (a) An agent reports that the 74th Regt. (25th Div) was in NABLUS about 2/1/18.

This report requires confirmation.

This division was in ROUMANIA until early October, and was reported at CONSTANTINOPLE in transit east in early November. Its arrival on this front is therefore quite possible, but, as the divisional area of the 25th Division is in NORTHERN PALESTINE, its depot may have been mistaken for the unit. The Division is stated to be composed of 1/3rd Arabs and 2/3rds Turks, and its Commander in September, 1917., was reported to be ECKHARDT, a German,

- (b) A captured report dated 5/12/17 shows that on that date there were no machine guns in the battalion, (probably the 3rd) or the Attack Coy of the 150th Regt on this front. The 7th Cavalry Regt. then had 8 TURKISH Schwarzloze machine guns.

6 ... ORGANIZATION.

- (a) A captured report dated 5/12/17 states that the total effectives of the 20th A.C. on 1/12/17 were 9,718, of which only 3,828 were effective rifles. The non-effective include gunners, machine-gunners, signallors, A.S.C., Medical Services and men employed at Headquarters of Divisions etc. together with (probably) Labour Corps.

- (b) A captured document shows that on the 5th December a total of 714 officers and men were employed in JERUSALEM with the following units:- Jerusalem L. of C. Inspectorate, 1st & 2nd National Hospitals, Supply, Provision, and Ammunition Depots, Armoury, Transport Column, Jerusalem Workshops, Industrial School, Building stores, and horse shoe and nail factory.

7 ... ENEMY MORAL.

The following is an extract from a captured order and proclamation dated 6/12/17 and signed by the G.O.C. 20th A.C.,

"Reports arriving from various units bring to notice the fact that certain individuals from JERUSALEM and neighbourhood have been wandering about among the troops behind the lines and within the war zone for the purpose of buying arms. They have been seducing the ignorant and simple among the troops into selling their arms. This circumstance will seriously interfere with the defensive duties of the army".

The order further states that all persons trafficking in arms, both buyers and sellers will be shot.

8 ... ENEMY RESOURCES.

A GERMAN document recently captured on the WESTERN Front draws attention to the necessity of only destroying guns as a last resource "in view of the extraordinary wastage of heavy artillery material. It still frequently occurs that guns are blown up before the enemy has penetrated into the battery position".

9 ... SUPPLIES.

A GERMAN order, signed by LUDENDORFF, dated 23/9/17, states that owing to a great shortage of coal leave will be drastically reduced. Hitherto men on leave composed 75% of total railway passengers, but from 1st November onwards only 5% from Field Units and 3% from L.of C. Units, will be allowed on leave at one time.

(a) Aerial reconnaissance on the 22nd reports that slow but distinct progress has been made on the trench line near TALAT ED DUMM (113.G.13); sections of it are however, not yet joined up. A series of new trenches was reported in 113.C.11 and 17, one length of 150-200 yards, semi-circular in shape, facing south-west. The trenches in 113.C.12 and D.14 appeared to have been improved. In square 113.D.18, 100-150 infantry were moving west. There was a newly dug trench about 150 yards long in 113.C.3.b, and new trenches were reported in 113.A.23.a and 113.A.10.a. and 4.b with bivouacs and men in vicinity. (R.F.C. 22/1/18).

(b) Agents report from two sources that about 17th inst 1500 troops arrived at JERICHO from the east, and proceeded north via 113.K.10.a, and K.2.d; their destination was said to be DEIR DIWAN. (099.V.22.a). Probably troops of the 49th Div.

(c) Inhabitants of JERICHO report that there are now no troops in the town. Munitions have been removed from the mosque there to SHUNET EL NIMRIN (127.P.17), whence all supplies, both of ammunition and food, are now drawn. (20th Corps: 21/1/18).

(d) Aerial reconnaissance on the 22nd reports that the trench line from 099.K.26 to K.29 has been extended through 099.K.30.d. to L.23.c. They appear well constructed and strongly held. (R.F.C. 22/1/18).

(e) Aerial reconnaissance on the 22nd reports a new trench system facing south-west running from 070.N.18.C.99 to 070.N.17.B; those tronchos were apparently occupied.

(c) 098.M.25.c - KUSEIN (098.G.24.a) - DEIR SHERAF (098.M.7) a path fit for pack transport.

The following roads are reported to be metalled and in good condition:-

(d) SAFED to ACRE, via ER RAMEH (109.F.22) and MEJD EL KERUM (098.H.6) very narrow and mountainous and unfit for wheeled traffic.

(e) EL FULE - NAZARETH - TIBERIAS, JISR BENAT YAKUB (bridge across the JORDAN, N. of lake TIBERIAS) - EL KUNEITRA (lat: 33.8; long: 35° 47') - KATAMA (lat: 35° 27'; long: 36° 6') - DAMASCUS. This road was constructed a year ago.

(f) NABLUS - JENIN - EL FULE - BEISAN - JISR MEJAMIE - IRBID (lat: 32° 32'; long: 35° 50') - DERAA - DAMASCUS.

(a) Aerial reconnaissance on 23rd reported no unusual movement in the area East of JERUSALEM. On the ATTARA (099.K.21) - SINJIL (099.J.33) road, 200 infantry halted were observed. (R.F.C. 23/1/18).

(b) Inhabitants of AIN YEBRUD (099.N.19) state that a regimental Commander moved his Headquarters from DURAH (099.M.23) to AIN YEBRUD about the 17th inst. On the 19th a shell fell into the neighbouring house, so he again moved his Headquarters northwards. Another shell fell into the Mosque where 12 Turks were billeted, killing one and wounding two of them. (20th Corps: 21/1/18).

He gave the impression of being lazy and un-soldierlike, as well as cynical and rather unscrupulous. His Turkish colleagues however evidently thought highly of his abilities, and he was much consulted on ALBANIAN questions.

An Abteilung normally consists of three batteries each of 4 guns. While the term "Light Ammunition Column" is ordinarily used of a 7.7 cm field gun Abteilung, it is possible that with the Pasha II units a 10.5 cm Light Field howitzer battery may form one of the batteries of the Abteilung.

7 ... SUPPLIES.

An agent reports, dated the 22nd, that the Mukhtars of the villages in the neighbourhood of KALKILIEH (094.II.27) have been called upon by the Turkish military authorities to furnish a return of cattle and poultry, and a list of the able-bodied men in their villages.

8 ... MAN-POWER.

Reinforcements. Prisoners from the 2nd bn. 19th Regt. state that their battalion received a draft of 180 men a month ago; these were returned wounded and sick from hospitals. There have been no subsequent drafts to their battalion.

9 ... AERONAUTICS.

On the 25th a half ton of bombs were dropped on two bodies of 1,000-2,000 troops in all in close formation north of HUWARAH (099.X.13,14) and on the horse lines at that place. Sixteen bombs fell among the troops before they scattered, and fifteen direct hits were obtained on the horse lines from which the horses stampeded. A large number of other effective hits were also observed.

(b) A GERMAN prisoner states that while he has been in the area west of TABSOR and next the sea (since about 10/1/18), Turkish dismounted troops have manned the trenches in front at night, leaving their horses behind. Those are probably men from the 2nd Caucasus Cavalry Bde.

The river is fordable here, 1½ metres deep, with sandy bottom. (P. of W.).

(g) AMMAN - KALAAT EZ ZERKA (lat, 32° 4'; long, 36° 6') is fit for wheeled transport and artillery, but not for motors.

The track north from KALAAT EZ ZERKA along the Wadi SHABA, through ET TIMEIRI (lat, 32° 24'; long, 36° 0') and ER REMTE (lat, 32° 35'; long, 36° 2') to DERAA is unfit for wheels. (P. of W.).

6 ... ECONOMIC.

(a) Conditions in CONSTANTINOPLE - Nov. 1917. Raisins which are easy to obtain are replacing broad to a large extent as staple food owing to the high price of flour. Owing to the scarcity of rice, sugar, tea and coffee, only the wealthier classes can afford to pay the price demanded for these luxuries. Wood fuel is plentiful and can be obtained at a reasonable price, but coal is practically unobtainable. Korosino, owing to its scarcity, is almost a Government monopoly. Animals owing to the shortage of fodder are in a very poor condition.

(b) Extract from a letter written to a GERMAN prisoner by his wife, MUENSTER, WESTPHALIA, 23/12/17.

"Mother was here this morning and asked after you. She is still well, although she is becoming so thin and frail. I gave her two cups of coffee and broad and she could not thank me enough. Poor soul! she receives nothing other than the municipal allowance except that on Sundays she receives food from HEPPENBERG's no fat, no vegetables, only dry potatoes. It is a great shame that the brothers do not pity her. I gave her sausage and lard which I got from Katherine. She was here yesterday and brought me that.
