

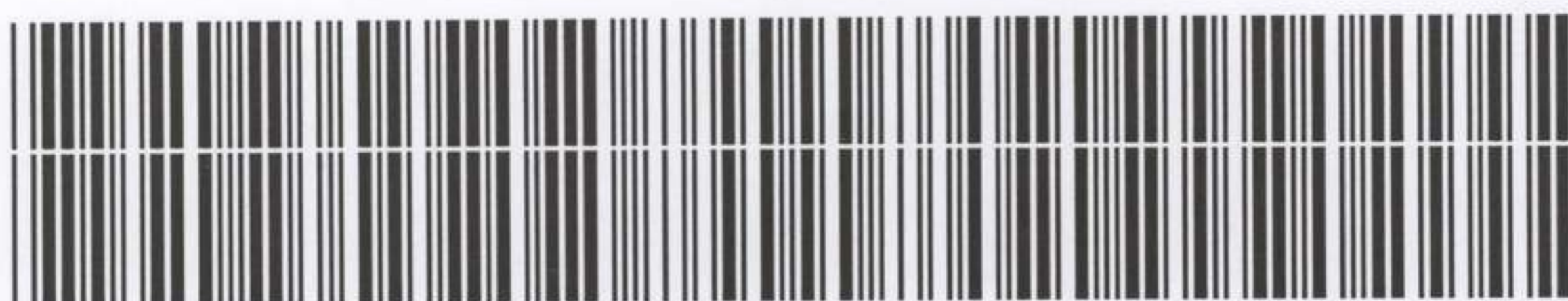

1. Locations. Quartermasters Stores, Transport Lines, and "B" Echelon will remain at present locations.
2. Area Stores. Units will ensure that receipts are obtained for all Trench Shelters handed over to Units of 11th. A.I. Brigade.
3. Reserve Ration and Ammunition Dumps. The Dumps will be handed over to Units of 11th. Aust. Inf. Brigade as follows:-
38th. Battn. hand over to 42nd. Bn. (No. 2 Ration Dump
(No. 4 Ammunition Dump.)
4. Medical Arrangements. Remain the same as heretofore.
5. Attention is directed to the following paragraphs of Administrative Instruction issued with Battalion Order No. 80 of 20/5/18.
Paragraph 2 - List of cemeteries.
" 6 - Locations of Wells and Water Points.
6. Ammunition Supply. Ammunition, S.A.A. and Grenades -
Ammunition Refilling Point - M.2.b.4.2.
S.A.A. Section will deliver ammunition and grenades on demand to Battalion Transport Lines at M.18.b.
Units first line Transport will then deliver to Battalions in the line.
Mobile Echelons must be maintained full.

7. Engineer Material. Engineer Material is delivered by the C.R.E. to transit Dump at N.28.d.8.3 where Units collect with first line Transport.

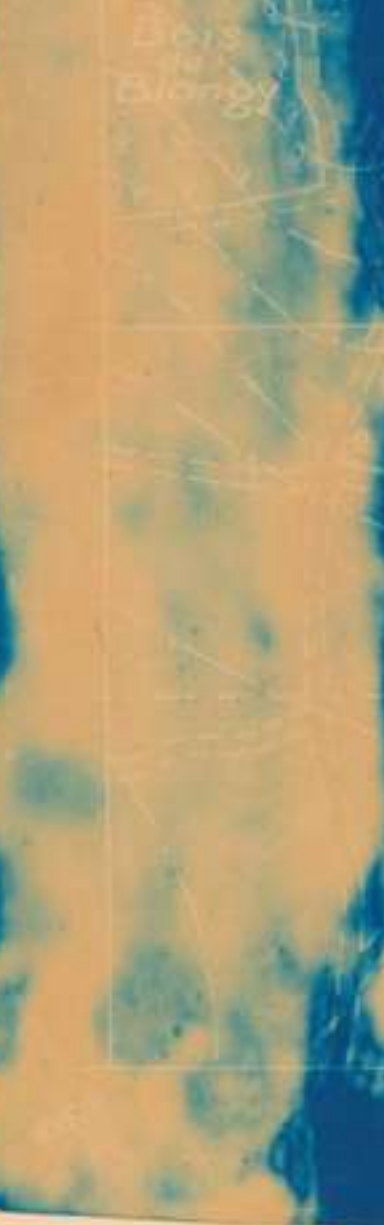

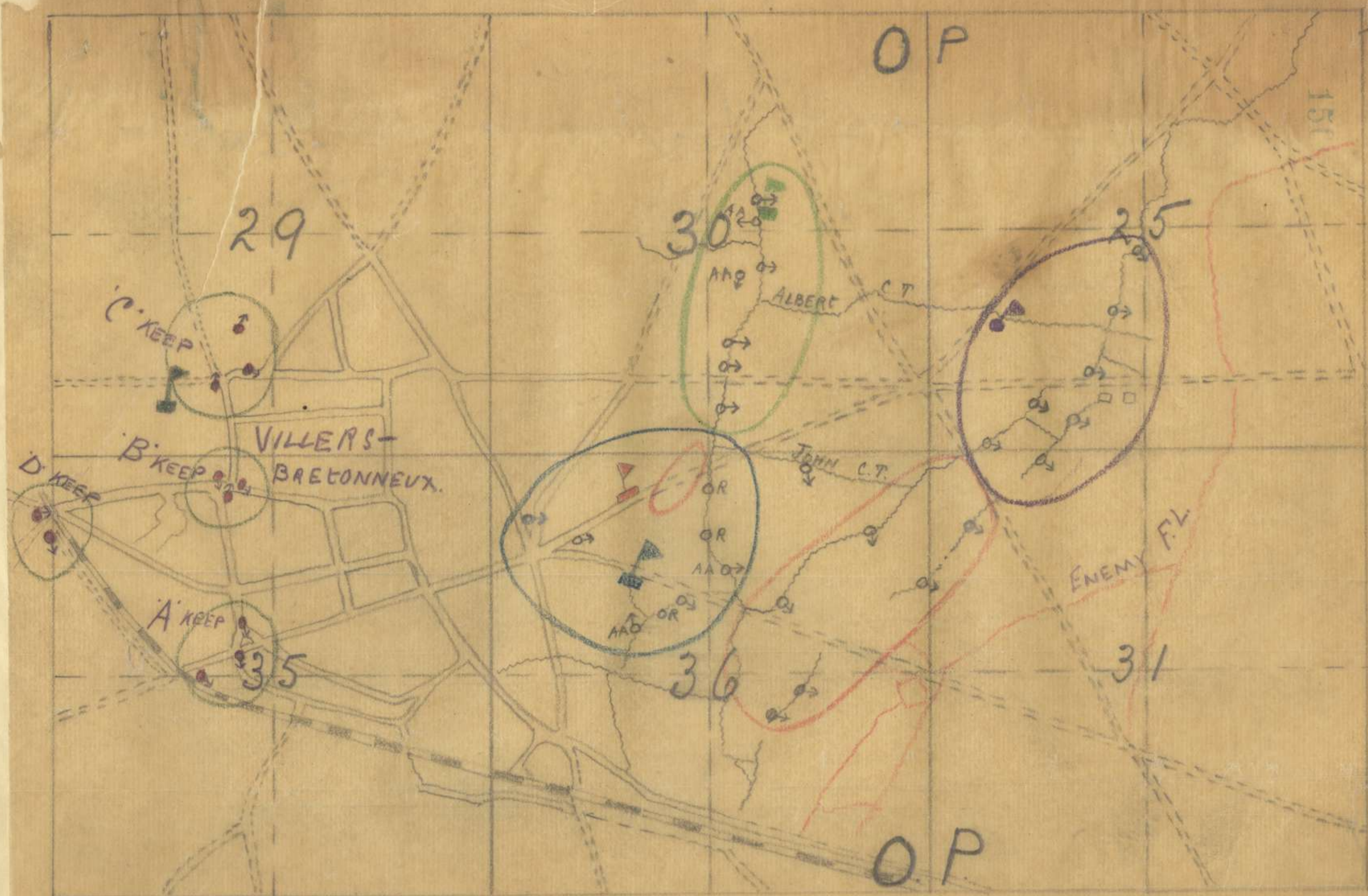
