



INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING BILLETING AND SUPPLIES TO BE READ IN CONJUNCTION WITH 10TH AUSTRALIAN INFANTRY BRICADE ORDERS NUMBERS 27 and 28.

Ref: - 1/100,000, HAZEBROUCK Sheet.

BILLETS. 1. Troops will be billeted as shown in attached Table "A".

SUPPLIES. 2. Two days supplies will be drawn from Railhead, ST.OMER and issued to 39th and 40th Battaliens on the 4th instant. Supplies for the remainder of the Brigade will be drawn from ST. OMER Railhead as usual on the 5th and thence from Railhead STEENWERCK.

GUIDES.

3. Units will arrange for guides to meet supply wagons or Motor lorries on the main EBBLINGHEM - WALLON CAPPEL road, 37th Battalion at road junction North of L in WALLON, and othermunits at cross roads North of E in CAPPEI, and guide them to their Dillets.

A reliable N.C.O. should be loft with each leading party to ensure that those lorries are collected immediately they have dumped the stores of the N.Z. Brigade. Two lorries each for 39th and 10th Battalions will remain with those Units until the morning of the 6th when the blankets will be loaded and then sent ahead to ARMENTIERES. In addition one lorry will be available for the details of the 39th Battalion which are going by route march on the 5th with the main column, this lorry will also carry the Brigade Chaff-cutter at present in charge of the Brigade

SALVAGE.

5. A Salvage dump has been established at the Q. M. Store
40th Battalion TATINGHEM. Lists should be propared
and the articles packed in convenient bundles.

Each Dattalion will leave one man at the dump, who will act as leader and guard. He will also obtain receipts from D.A.D.O.S. representative when collecting same. These men should be supplied with rations and will return to STEENWIRCK on the lerries.



The enemy withdraw and a fighting patrol was immediately sent out from our trenches to search for casualties and identifications but failed to find any.

(5) night of the raid but on night of 13th/14th April the body of one dead German was brought in, on whem was found a disc showing him to belong to R.J.R. 228.

2 K N R. 1144. His equipment and rifle were also found together with other portions of equipment and many stick bombs. The equipment had in most cases been made in SAXONY. The rifle was from DANZIG (1916). On a belt found in NO MAN'S LAND on under-Officer's sword-knot was attached.

It is probable that other casualties occurred but we have no direct proof of this except

at 1.45 a.m., a party from "D" Company moved out into NO HANS LAND to endeavour to ascertain if any casualties had been inflicted on the enemy. They returned without finding trace of any such casualties.

Enemy put down an extremely heavy barrage on our Front and Support Lines in Square U.15 and U.21.b. Hostile fire came from both flanks as well as from front and consisted of shrepnel and H.E. of all calibres up to 5.9, and also trench mortars.

Some enemy were noticed in NO MAN'S LAND.

One man from this Lewis gun team is missing. A close examination of the bay in which this Lewis gun team was posted disclosed the fact that the enemy must have passed. into it when in the front line as a German cartridge and the tops of 2 stick grenades were found on the duckboards. There was a good deal of blood on the duckboards and in one of the dugouts, and it was smeared up the side of the parapet to the top. It was noticed that in this bay things such as Very pistols and their cartridges, equipment, &c., were all untouched, which seems to point to the fact that the enemy discovered the missing man wounded and, probably, in the dugout where he would crawl for concealment, and dragged him over the parapet. Were they not thus occupied they would in all probability have collected the available booty above indicated and amongst which wase also some letters addressed to men of the 11th Brigade and which they would have regarded as establishing identity
