For gallant service and devotion to duty on night of 4th/5th March 1918 during raid on enemy trenches in vicinity This N.C.O. was in charge of a Lewis Gun of WARNETON. covering the farthest point of penetration into enemy trench system. He organised and placed his men splendidly. enemy counter-attacked strongly from the right but by carefully directed Lewis Gun fire aided by rifle grenades and rifles he successfully broke up the counter-attack and thus ensured protection of our raiders. His action was most determined, courageous and invaluable to the Right Assault.

#### MILITARY MEDAL.

No.879, Corporal G. SUTHERLAND, 33rd Battalion, A.I.F. For gallant service and devotion to duty on the night of 3rd/4th March, 1918, during raid on enemy trenches in vicinity of WARNETON. This N.C.O. was a member of a party detailed to mop up a strong point. He entered the trench with four men, and formed a block in the vicinity of the strong point in spite of severe opposition by enemy bombers. In spite of having three of his party wounded, he courageously held on till relieved by a strong party. He exhibited fine leadership, and was a splendid example to his men of personal courage.

No.2823. Private R. CASEY, 33rd Battalion, A.I.F. For courageous service and devotion to duty on the night of 3rd/4th March, 1918, during raid on enemy trenches in vicinity of WARNETON. He was a member of the right assault wire crossing party, with another man cleared the entry to trench and held it against enemy bombers till the strong party came through. He also entered and bombed a dugout personally killing four of the enemy. He showed great coolness and bravery throughout the whole operation.

No. 736, Private H.W. CLARKE, 33rd Battalion, A.I.F. For gallant service and devotion to duty on night 3rd/4th March, 1918 during a raid on enemy trenches in vicinity of WARNETON. This man was wounded and had his rifle broken in NO MANS LANG. In falling he also sustained a sprained wrist. Inspite of his wounds he was first in the trench, and seeing a rifle he carried out the duties of leading bayonet man to right assaulting party himself killing three 2.

enemy. He displayed the greatest bravery and flarlessness,

No.943, Private W.H. ROACH, 33rd Battalion, A.I.F.

For gallant service on night of 4th/6th March, 1918, during raid on enemy trenches in vicinity of WARNETON. This man was one of the right party detailed to mop up the enemy support trench. His Corporal placed him in charge of half the party. He rushed his portion of the trench chasing the enemy out into shell-holes where he and his men despatched a number. His courageous and determined fighting very materially helped the Right assault.

No.94. Lance Corporal A.H. HOGNO, 33rd Battalion, A.I.F.

For conspicuous gallantry on the night of 4th/5th March 1918 during raid on enemy trenches in vicinity of WARNETON. He was leading bayonet man of one of the Right Assault parties which penetrated to enemy support line system. He had to fight the whole way and himself accounted for many of the enemy. His determination was a great factor in emabling the party to reach its objective.

The Corps, Divisional and Brigade Commanders desire their congratulations to be conveyed to the recipients.

The Commanding Officers also desires to congratulate Corporal THURSTON, Privates CASEY, CLARKE, ROACH, Corporal SUTHERLAND, and Lance Corporal HOGNO.

- 3. PICQUETS. All Units are responsible that troops under their Command do not enter civilian premises unless billeted therein, and ensure that this is strictly carried out Units will detail their Regimental Police or suitable picquets for patrol duty in their respective villages.
- 4. OBSERVATION. The picquets abovementioned will also keep streets clear of all troops notbon duty. It is unnecessary to point out that aircraft will very soon bring shelling upon us and our present billets if troops move about in large messes.
- 5. SANITATION. Immediate steps must be taken to construct proper latrines and have them supervised by sanitary men.

7. MAILS. Ther are sundry bags of mails for each Unit at Brigade Headquarters - BONNAY - awaiting delivery. Quartermaster will make arrangements immediately to clear.

8. LIGHTS. No lights whatever will be exhibited after dark and every care must be taken to guard against fires in billets from matches, cigarettes, naked lights etc..

9.BILLETS. Civilians have evacuated premises in a hurry and is the G.O.C's wish that Units occupying billets will straighten things up as fas as pessible, respect all roperty, and generally leave everything in good condition. All the bit of cleaning up here and there is all that is necessary and where possible small rooms containing civilian property will not be used.

10. S.A.A. Mobile S.A.A and Pick and Shovel Park is located immediately opposite Brigade Headquarters - BONNAY, between Church and Trench MortarBattery billets.

11. LIVE STOCK. It has been noticed that in several of the billets in BONNAY there are cows, calves, poultry etc. with apparently noo one to look after them. Units occupying any such billets will take care of any such animals and in the case of c ttle put them out in grass fields if possible during the daytime and back them under cover at night. If any fodder is available in the barns same should be carefully distributed if there is no grass feed obtainable. It is desired that Units will take a special interest in looking after any stock left on the premises and also leave the houses in a clean and tidy state for their owners when they return.

12. TRANSPORT. All transport will make as little movement as possible by day so as to avoid raising dust-clouds thus indicating our presence to hostile troops.

The enemy shelled CACHY from 10 acm, but wo suffored no casualties.

INSTRUCTIONS 12. At 2.15 pam. I reported to you at the Brigado Roport Contro et 3.33,0,35,40 and rocolved your ordors to capture and sectablish a line from the Copse immodiately South of the first C in MARCELCAVE to AUDERCOURT, and to capture AUBERCOURT which was in possession of the enemy

DISPOSIT BOES:

APPROACH

APPROACH MAROU:

4. At 5.10 p.m. the Battalien marched under the command of Major F.G. Grant from BOIS D'AQUENNE and moved across country in column of route to the assembly position 200 yards to the Wost of the VILLERS-BRETONNIUX - AUGERCOURT Road am U.12.9. This position was reached at 4.35 p m.

At 5 p.m. I sent forward two patrols from the Platoon of the 9th Comps dyclasts to reconnectro North and South of the wood East of BOIS DE HANGARD and then as far forward towards AUBERCOURT and MARGELCAVE as possible. I regret to report that the Platoon Comm andor (Lieut. Gratwicke) was killed.

The 18th Lancors proceeded the Battalien and reached the wood East of HOIS WE HANGARD at about 4.15 p.m.

(This wood will in future be referred to as LANCER WOOD). Tegothor with my Adjutant, Scout Officer and Oavalry Liaison Officer T redo shead with the cavalry and row nnolired the position.

STRAGLLERS and WITHDRAWALS.

APPENDIX 22 150 5. On our way to LAMBER WOOD we passed several bedies of troops poor Larly and usolopsly ontrondhad in quoor places, and large parties of stragglors. On reaching the wood we found the whole front line garrison East of LANCER WOOD withdrawing although thoro was no hostilo fire of any kind and no signs of attack. I mot two Brigadiors and a Dattalion Commander in the wood and informed then that was happening and asked them thing that they got their men back to the line at onco. This they promised to do. The Cavalry Commander also holped in the matter by sending a Squadren diamounted to ro-ostablish the line. The infantry went forward with the cavalry but in a reductant manner.

During the thole time we were forward men were con stantly leaving the line. There seemed to be no effort to

check this straggling.

ACTION of CAVALRY.

6. It was a proud privilogo to be allowed to work with such a fine Regiment as the 18th Lancors. Their approach march instilled in the men the utmost confidence and enthusiasm and I am glad to say greatly counteracted the effect of so much straggling. They lost no time in offectively clearing LANCER WOOD and got there just in time as the enemy had obtained a footing on the Southern and South Eastern edges. The Lancers protected the edges and allowed us to move forward to the attack.

On scoing the cavalry there the enemy shelled LANCER WOOD very heavily, chiefly with 5.0s. paying particular attention to the outer fringes. Fairly heavy easualties to horses were inflicted there; the horses were seen led from the wood to a position wost of the VILLETS -BRETONNEUX - AUBIER-COURT Road. The discipline during the heavy shelling was an ebjoot losson.

luring the attack the eavalry protected both our flanks, the left with two Metchhiles game. They withdrow at about

7 p.m.

All ranks were eager to give every possible help to us; throughous thore was whole-hearped cooperation. The exper-10000 gained in this our first operation with pavalry was invaluable. One was able too to judge of the splendid work they are doking for the Army at this prosent time and they cannot be too highly praised.

THEATTH AOTION.

The Company morna whome the Northann odge-of LAHUER woon and wildoned its front on clearing the wood. "A" Company moved throughthe wood. Owing to enemy pholling while moving through, the whole Company was extended into throo lines and resumed the normal formation on clearing the wood. No casualties were sustained in the wood. "D" Company worked in single file along the bridle track near the Southern edge of the wood and formed up under cover of a terraced bank on the South East edge. Three canualties were sustained on entering the wood.

not whore was first erdered, owing to the hestile shelling.
The movement forward was splendidly carried out. On the right elight opposition was encountered but easily disposed of. No real opposition was not with until we were about 200 yards clear of the wood when all three companies came under very heavy machine gum and rifle fire. They deployed at once and move deformed without flinehing. All ranks displayed the greatest determination and eagerness to get to the Bosch with the bayonet; this eagerness was to some extent responsible for the heavy casualties as the principle of advancing under covering fire was not sufficiently observed. On the left most progress was made in spite of heavy lesses, and the enemy hurriedly retired but on discovering lesser our strongth he reformed.

The enemy was well entronched and in strong force; as we had no artillory support his fire was consequently extremely hoavy and unfortunately very accurate. Owing to such strong apposition we were not able to reach our objectives. The attached map shows approximately the line we established. This line is well sited and is a very good defensive position. With determined troops the enemy could easily be held, and any advance he attempted would be very expensive.

Owing to organities and to the wide front I sent the Reserve Company to reinferce the right flank at 7.5 p.m.

This Company made good the gap between the right and centre Companies. At the same tim I requested the 34th Battalien, which was in support in U.12.a. and U.D.c. West of the VILLER BRE COMMENT - AUBERCOURT Road, to send forward a Company to reinferce the left flank. I instructed the Company Commander (Captain T.S. Gilder, M.C.) to reconneitre the position first and then to move forward at 8 p.m. This Company advanced in two lines f two Plate one each and teck the newly-made enemy trenches about 250 yards East of the line then held by us, wapturing two light machine guns one of which was damaged, and four prisoners belonging to 91st Oldenberg Regiment. Captain Gilder then withdraw and made good the gap between the left and centre Coys.

At 10 p.m. I requested the 0.0. 34th Battalien to send two Coys. forward, one to the sunken read in U.18.a. the other to a position 300 yds. North East of LANCER WOOD.



# REPORT ON RECEIPT OPERATIONS DY SORD AND SATE DATTALIONS.

Major STEAL was placed in charge of roar evaluations and Major STYTH in oh rgo of forward ovacuations.

Ambulance Headquarters were at GENTELLES

Major SIMAL had with him the Transport, one Section of bearers, and a Hoporto mado up of special duty men.

Hajor SixTH had two Soctions of boardro.

Captain McLEAN was sont forward to CASHY with one complete Section of boarers and 2 squads from romaining Soction, the romainder being held in reserve at GENTELLES.

Thros horse-drain Ambulances and one G.S. wagon were sent forward

to Captain McLEAN at the commonsonent of operations.

The total number of care in the Ambulance were four Talbot cars and one Ford car. These were distributed as follows :-2 Talboto and 1 Ford with Captain McLEAN and 2 Talbots

with Major SMEAL.

#### ROUTES OF EVACUATION.

From R.A.P. clong VILLERS-DRETONNEUX - AUDIERCOURT Road to junction of CAOHY-- HARCELCAVE track to CACHY, thence to BOVES, thence to C.C.S. at NAMPS, a distance of 40 kilometres roughly.

A.D.M.S. 61st Division promised to let us have further transport if available but owing to casualties at night among Importal troops this

was found to be impossible.

Cars were commandoored during the night from Ambulances along the road which were at the mement stack.

Arrangements were made with Erigade to send two 3-ton lerries to DACHY, then to DOVES and from there to 0.3.8. Those reported about 4.30 a.m.

Thore was considerable conjestion at Doves at times owing to lack o transport and distances to be covered.

The lerries helped considerably to clear the position and no

further trouble was experienced.

Thore were no great difficulties at any stage to evercome from R.A.P. to OAGHY.

About 9 a.m. on 31.3.1918 CACHY and DOVES reported all clear. One Scotton, brought up from Major SMEAL at 9 a.m. on 31.3.1918, was sont to CACHY and all loarers and M.Os. from forward area withdrawn
