

CHEPY.	1.2.1919.		Fine Day. Battalion Parade was held at 09.30. The usual Educational Classes and Agricultural Lectures were held. In the afternoon a heavy fall of snow took place and lasted well into the night.	Appendix (Part W.D)
CHEPY.	2.2.1919.		Fine and cold day. A voluntary Church Parade was held in the School Room, the service being taken by Padre Burkitt at 10.00. In the afternoon the Corps Commander (General Hobbs, K.C.B., K.C.M.G., V.D.) accompanied by General Gellibrand, C.B., D.S.O. visited the Battalion. The car arrived at 15.00 and the General inspected the Guard and spoke to several of the men about Demobilization and Repatriation. He then visited the Battalion Headquarters Mess where he met the Senior Officers of the 33rd and 35th Battalions. After a stay of twenty minutes during which time the General spoke to the Officers about Demobilization and Repatriation he departed for the 34th Battalion.	
CHEPY.	3.2.1919.		The day turned out to be very cold. Companies paraded independently during the morning. Lieut. Bale (Repatriation Officer) visited each Company and spoke to the men in regard to Repatriation.	
CHEPY.	4.2.1919.		Battalion Parade was held at 09.30. The Brigade Cross Country Run took place at 10.30 and two Companies were marched out to the CHEPY-AGNEUX Road to see the finish. After a very keenly contested race the 33rd Battalion Team succeeded in winning. During the morning the R.M.C. (Capt. Binns, M.C.) carried out an inspection of the men who are on the first draft for AUSTRALIA.

CHEPY.	14.2.1919.		Day cool, fine morning with a light cloudy sky. Light rain in the afternoon. Companies paraded independently in the morning. The usual Educational Classes and Agricultural Lectures were held during the morning. Lieut-Colonel L.J. Morshead, D.S.O. returned from leave during the afternoon. A picquet of 1 Officer, 1 Sergeant, 2 Corporals and 10 men left for LE TREPORT by train at 15.00.	
CHEPY.	15.2.1919.		Fine day. The ground very wet on account of the thaw. Lieut-Colonel Morshead having returned from leave resumed Command of the Battalion. During the morning the usual Agricultural and Educational Classes were held and several Officers and men went on leave to ABBEVILLE for the day. At 14.00 a meeting of Company Commanders was held at Headquarters Officer's mess to make arrangements re the First Quota for Demobilization. It was decided to get the Quota together in "B" and "D" Companies Billets and to move those of the above Companies who were not in the Quota into "C" and "A" Companies Billets, the move to take 17th inst. CHEPY.	16.2.1919.		Fine but dull day. The Service of Holy Communion was held in the Local School Room at 08.00 and a voluntary Service and Holy Communion were held at 09.30, also an evening service at 18.00 in the same room. These Services were taken by Chaplain W.E. Burkitt. At 09.30 a voluntary Service for R.C's was held in the Village Church. The C.O. made a tour of inspection of the Billets at 10.30.	
CHEPY.	17.2.1919.		Fine day, but the ground was still very wet and muddy. A Medical Board consisting of Major Mailer, M.C. and a Major from the 10th Field Ambulance was held in the Recreational Hut at "A" Companies Billets to examine men of the first Demobilization Quota who had already been examined by the R.M.O. (Capt. W.J. Binns, M.C.). This Board continued until late in the afternoon. Companies were busy most of the day in changing over Billets in connection with the first Demobilization Quota.

CHEPY.	18.2.1919.		<p>Fine day. Quota Company Commanders proceeded with the organisation of their Companies. During the day there was an allotment of Baths at FEUQUIERES to the Battalion as follows: 09.00 to 10.30 - "C" Company, 10.30 to 12.00 - "D" Co., 12.00 to 13.00 - H.Q., Q.M. and Transport, 14.00 to 15.00 - A Demobilization Quota Co. - 15.00 to 16.00 - "B" Quota Co. At 10.00 the Agricultural Lecture at FEUQUIERES was given by Lieut. Granter on "Ordinary Diseases of Cattle on Farms". In the afternoon a meeting of all Officers was held in the local Hall to talk over matters with reference to the Battalion Re-union to be held each year on our return to AUSTRALIA. After some discussion it was eventually decided to hold an Annual Re-union in SYDNEY at Easter each year, the re-union to consist of a Harbour Excursion on Easter Saturday and a Dinner on Easter Monday Night. The following Office Bearers were elected:- President - Lieut-Colonel Morshead, D.S.O. Vice Presidents - Lieut Colonel R.J. Massie, D.S.O., Lieut-Colonel P.J. White, D.S.O. Committee - Major J.M. Hawkey, M.C. Capt. W.H. Douglas Lieut. C.P. Kelly. Secretary - Lieut. R.C. King, M.C. Treasurer - Capt. O.R. Cormack. It was also decided to ask for a subscription of 30 francs from each Officer to cover the initial expenses of the first Re-union to be held at Easter 1920. A Meeting of O.R's is to be held at once to which the above proposals will be submitted and a sub-committee formed.</p>

CHEPY.	22.2.1919.		Dull and showery. Educational Classes were held as usual. A number of Officers went into ABBEVILLE on leave for the day. At 17.30 a Motor Lorry left Battalion Headquarters with Officers of the Battalion to convey them to ABBEVILLE where a farewell Dinner was held in connection with the departure of the first Demobilization Quota. On the arrival of the Lorry at the ABBEVILLE Officer's Club it was found that the C.O. and Major had been left behind. Dinner was put back a $\frac{1}{2}$ of an Hour but eventually was found necessary to start without them. In the absence of the C.O., Capt. Douglas took charge. At 2030 the C.O. and Major Grant arrived having ridden all the way in an Hour and a quarter. Toasts of the King and the C.O. were drunk. The proceedings were purely unofficial and a very merry evening was spent. Capt. Mailler, M.C. (a former R.M.O. of this Battalion) was a guest during the evening, and helped to relieve the congestion in the Motor Lorry by taking several Officers home in his Ambulance. At 15.00 Sgt Ostrom gave his last lecture on AUSTRALIA entitled "Progress of Industry and Rural Development". The Cinema Show was held for the last time in the local Hall and was well attended. 

HEPY.	25.2.1919.	Cpl. S.A.J.Reid, M.M., Sgt. W.A.Blair and W.O. J.K.Wilthew being joint secretaries. It was also suggested that a quarterly journal be run and that C.S.M's keep in touch with their Companies as much as possible.		
CHEPY.	26.2.1919.	Dull day with light showers. In the morning General Birdwood presented Medals to O.R's at Brigade Headquarters. The C.O., 2nd in Command, and the Adjutant were invited to meet the General there. An amount of 250 francs was paid to the Cure for the use of the Hall and for damage done to the garden and to furniture. The Cure has helped the Battalion in many ways by his kindness and consideration. During the wet weather his garden and footpaths have suffered considerably through the heavy traffic to and from the Hall. DEMOBILIZATION. The following instructions and procedure are issued for the guidance of Officers in completing Demobilization Form No 500 (Q.1) and dealing generally with Kit and Equipment.

DEM. 3365. Articles of Equipment are to be entered on Form Q.1. by Company Equipment Officers and not by Quota Platoon Commanders. The latter will however be responsible for completion of this Form as far as clothing and necessaries are concerned. Great care must be taken in filling in these Forms and entries are to be made neatly. When completed an ink line should be ruled the whole length of the Form on the line next beneath the entries and also in columns where no entries appear.

The duplicate is to be completed in a similar manner and each entry checked so that this form will be an exact replica of the original.

Company Equipment Officers will furnish certificates for such men to cover the shortages indented for on 9th January 1919 or by supplementary indents up to 23rd January 1919. They will also supply the "Minimum Clothing Certificate" on the pro-forma issued.

Lewis Gunners will, in addition be given receipts for revolvers handed in by them.

The Credit and Debit sides of the Company Equipment Book are to be balanced and initialled by the Officer in charge of it.

Although Officers are not responsible for the kit and equipment of men accompanying the Quota who are not on the strength of the Battalion, these men are nevertheless to be furnished with a minimum Clothing Certificate after examination of their kit.

Detached men rejoining the Battalion to accompany the Quota are to have the entries made in the Equipment Book of the Company on whose strength they are borne, and they will be furnished with receipts and certificates and dealt with generally in the same manner as other Company men.



February shipping, which was arranged to take 19,000 A.I.F. and 2,730 others, has been delayed by strikes in the dockyards and on the railways. The Shipping Ministry have been asked to provide for the embarkation of 20,000 during March.






