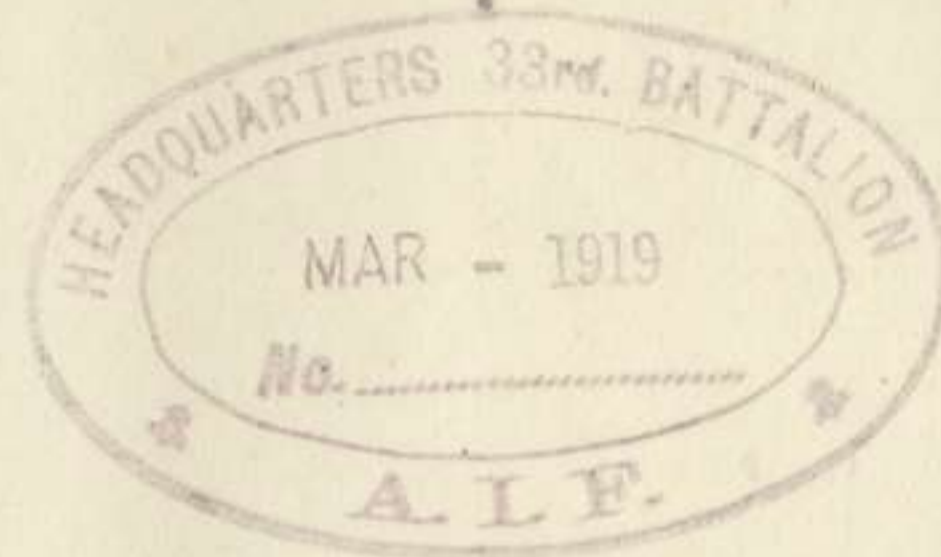

CHEPY.	1.3.1919.		<p>Fine sunny day. The usual Educational Classes and Agricultural Lectures were held in the morning. In the evening a Farewell Dinner at the Club in ABBEVILLE was given the C.O. on the eve of his departure to take up duty in ENGLAND. A Motor Lorry left with a load of Officers at 17.30 and the remainder were taken in by a Motor Ambulance kindly lent by Lieut-Colonel Smythe of the 9th Field Ambulance. The dinner was held in the small room at the Club, but by dint of much "headwork" everybody found a place. There were 28 Officers present. The dinner opened quickly but presently much amusement was caused by our two little Victorians - Lieuts Jobson and Powell - who were rendered speechless by certain aspersions cast at their native capital by certain rude New South Welshmen. After that the dinner went with a swing.</p> <p>The toast of the evening was proposed by Major F.G. Grant and was supported by Lieut. R.C. King, M.C. The Colonel in responding said how sorry he was to leave the Battalion after having been with it right through. He had hoped to see it right through to the end but much to his disappointment Higher Authority had ruled otherwise. In conclusion he wished them all every success and looked forward to meeting them all again at the next re-union in Sydney at Easter 1920. CHEPY.	3.3.1919.		<p>Fine for a short time in the morning, but rain started at about 11.30 and kept on for the rest of the day. The Battalion suffered its greatest loss so far, in the departure of its C.O. (Lieut-Colonel L.J.Morshead, D.S.O.) for duty in ENGLAND.</p> <p>At 10.00 the Battalion formed up on the <del>Battalion</del> Parade Ground where it was addressed by the Colonel. In a short speech he thanked them one and all, for the loyal support they had always given him during the past three years, and asked them to continue this support to those who would come after him. In saying Good-Bye he looked forward to the time they would meet again at the Annual Re-union in SYDNEY. The Battalion then marched off by road to Battalion Headquarters where the Colonel took the Salute for <sup>the</sup> last time. Companies then marched back to billets and all Officers dropped out to say Good-Bye.</p> <p>A pleasant surprise awaited the Colonel at the Station where a large number of Officers and men had assembled to see him off. During the wait for the train the Band played selections, amongst them being - "SO LONG LETTY" - which was played on board the "MARATHON" as she passed through SYDNEY HEADS with the Battalion on board en route for ENGLAND on the 4th May 1916. On the Colonel boarding the train, the Band struck up - "AULD LANG SYNE" . This was followed by cheers which were kept up right along the platform as the train passed out. CHEPY.	4.3.1919.		<p>Wet day, clearing up at about 17.00. The usual Educational Classes and Agricultural Lectures were held in the morning. At 14.00 a meeting of the Re-union Committee and Sub-committee was held in the Pay Office. Capt W.H. Douglas was in the chair. C.S.M's were also present. General matters in connection with the re-union were talked over and it was decided to issue a circular to all ranks at present with the Battalion stating what had already been arranged and asking for suggestions.</p> <p>At 18.30 a Mock Court Martial was held in the Local Hall. There was a packed house and the evening was a great success. Amongst those who took part were - Major F.G.Grant, Lieut. W.A.McLean, M.C. and Lieut. P.W.Powell (Members of the Court), Lieut. A.H.Fletcher Prosecutor, Lieut. S.F.Betts, V.D. Prisoner's Friend. Pte. W.Kirwin - Prisoner. Lieut. C.C.Wallace, Sgt A.Hodge, Pte. A.H.Lamerton, Pte. W.J.Longley, Pte. V.D.Loffberg and Capt. 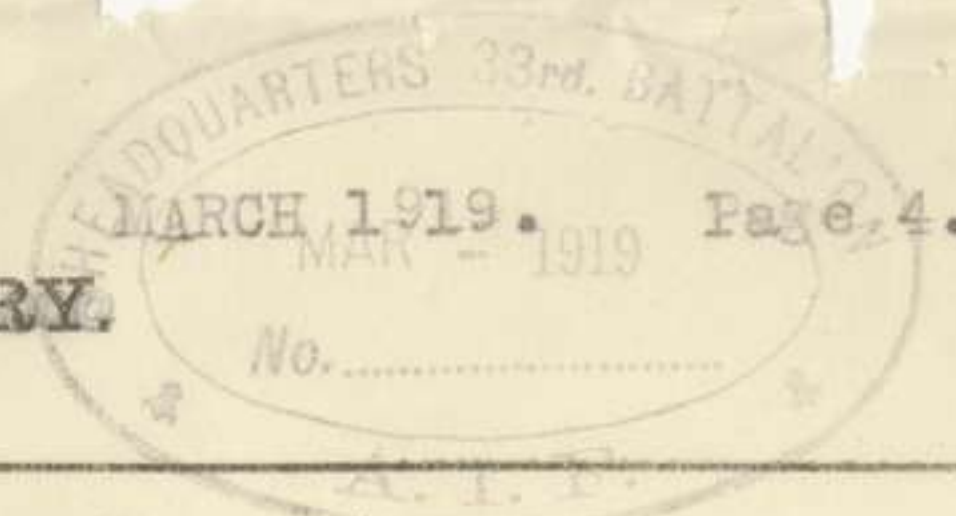

At 09.00 the first Quota for Demobilization (Quota No. 18) moved out en route for GAMACHES where they were to entrain for LE HAVRE. Accompanied by the Regimental Band they marched to FEUQUIERES to join the 35th Battalion Quota, thereby having the benefit of a Band for the whole of the journey. At 11.00 the 34th Battalion Quota arrived in CHEFY, having left MIANNAY at 09.00. They were accommodated in the billets vacated by our Quota before they moved out. 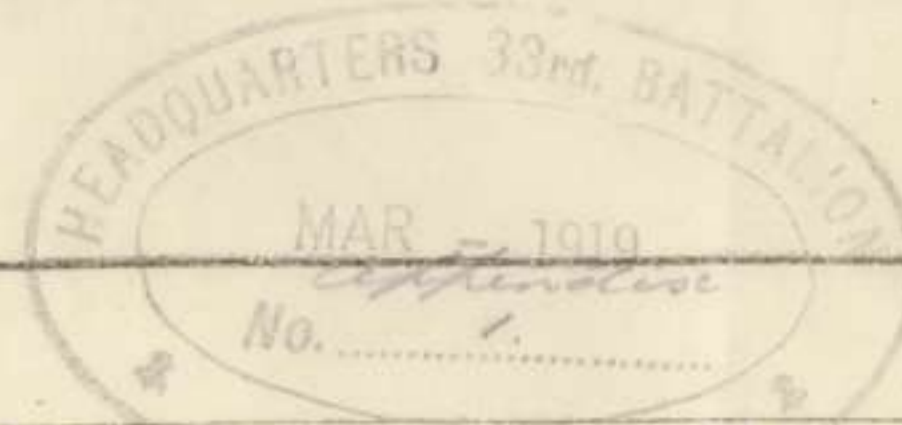

(2) The Corps Commander wishes to bring to the notice of all ranks the following information supplied by the Director General of Demobilization in explanation of the delays that have occurred:-

Despatch of Drafts and Quotas.

The consequences of the Shipping Strike in all the ship repairing trades are now making themselves severely felt. We have not merely irretrievably lost a period of 16 days while the strike actually lasted, but the dislocation of the whole programme of shipping for February and the early days of March has brought about such a congestion of Troops in the Depots in U.K. and at Havre, that it will take some time and patient handling to resume a regular and normal flow of Quotas from France. Every possible effort is being made again to speed up the movement. The delay which has arisen has affects the interests of the men, not only in the mass, but also large numbers of individuals who have applied for various demobilization privileges but for whom space in Trains, Ships and Camps cannot be made available until the situation is eased.

Applications for Early Repatriation, Discharge in England, etc.

Complaints have reached the Demobilization Depot, some of them from responsible sources, that there is a growing dissatisfaction with the long period of time which it appears to take for applications to be dealt with and finalized. While in the past this has been largely due to the time it has taken to get together the essential staff of sufficiently competent Officers, it has also been partly due to a vast collection of arrears with which the staff were confronted, and which had to be reduced.

The time has at last arrived when assurance can be given that all individual applications of every kind are now receiving prompt attention, and are being dealt with and finalized at the rate of several hundreds per day. Soldiers are actually arriving from France in considerable numbers to take advantage of privileges such as Early Repatriation, Discharge and Non-military Employment. From now on the situation as regards all individual applications should steadily improve.

The following is an extract from a report on the condition of a leave train on its arrival at the Base :-

Dirty. Many stoves missing. Many stove pipes missing where stoves have been left. Benches have been burnt in several trucks. First class French coach D.P.Y. 140 has been entirely gutted. Not only have cushions been taken, but the general structure of the inside of the coach has been destroyed apparently with an axe. All windows broken; sashes, straps, cords and curtains out out or in other ways destroyed. The coach is in a disgraceful state and is certainly of no use on the train.

The above is only one of many similar reports which have been received of damage being caused to railway stock of trains employed for the movement of personnel both for deshabilitation and leave. The damage usually takes two forms, either damage done by carelessness, such as broken windows and doors of passenger stock, or damage due to deliberate abstraction of fittings, such as stoves, seat cushions etc.

This damage has lately reached such proportions that it is impossible to effect repairs, or to replace fittings sufficiently quickly to maintain the stock in condition, and considerable hardship is inevitably caused to troops who have subsequently to use the damaged trains, more particularly in cold weather.

Damage of this nature can be avoided. Deliberate damage is caused by a small minority who do not appreciate the hardships they inflict on their comrades by their action. Damage caused by carelessness is only the result of thoughtlessness. All ranks are therefore urged in the general interests to do everything in their power by loyal co-operation to maintain trains in the best possible condition.

This order will be repeated in all Company Orders.

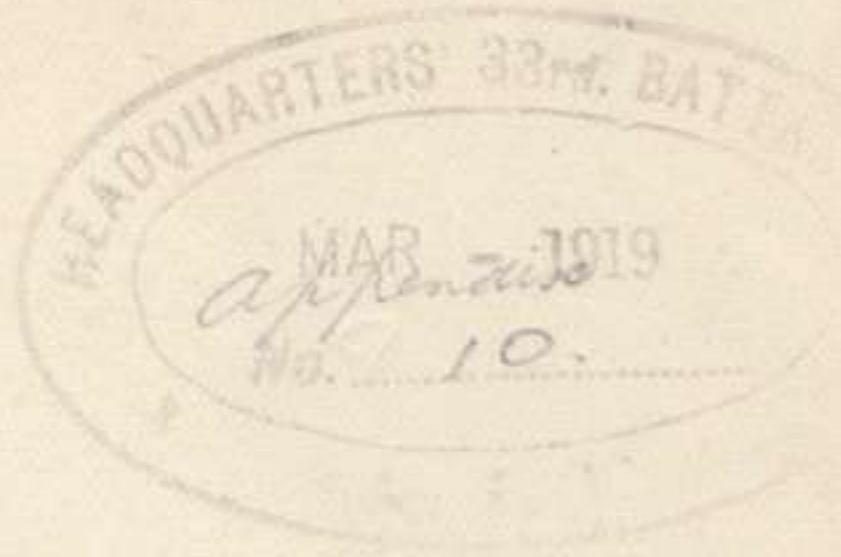

- (4) Influenza cases will be removed to hospital and isolated; cases are not to be treated in quarters.

  3. Any Medical Reports not signed by the A.D.M.S. will be completed by him at GAMACHES before entrainment.
  4. O.C. Battalion quota will carry six complete copies of the Train Nominal Roll, four copies of which will be handed to Major F.G. GRANT on arrival at GAMACHES.
  5. All duplicate 21 forms and duplicate certificates covering shortages will be handed into Battalion Headquarters (Demobilization Office) by 16.00 on the 11th instant.
  6. A certificate to the effect that all members of the quotas are complete in all detail of forms enumerated in Appendix "X" A para 2 is required from O.C. quota by 18.00 11th instant.
  7. A certificate to the effect that no ammunition or grenades are in possession of men of the quota will be furnished to Battalion Headquarters by 18.00 11th instant.
  8. All waiting men will be returned to their Companies on the morning of the 12th instant. None will accompany the quota to GAMACHES.

THEFTS OF WOOD. 3456. In connection with the many complaints that have been received from French civilians throughout the Area with regard to the stealing of wood fuel, the Brigade Commander points out to all ranks that the situation is as follows :-

1. There is a great shortage of fuel of all descriptions in the area.
2. Every French civilian depends for heating material on the Government ration.
3. This ration is at present over 4 months in arrears.

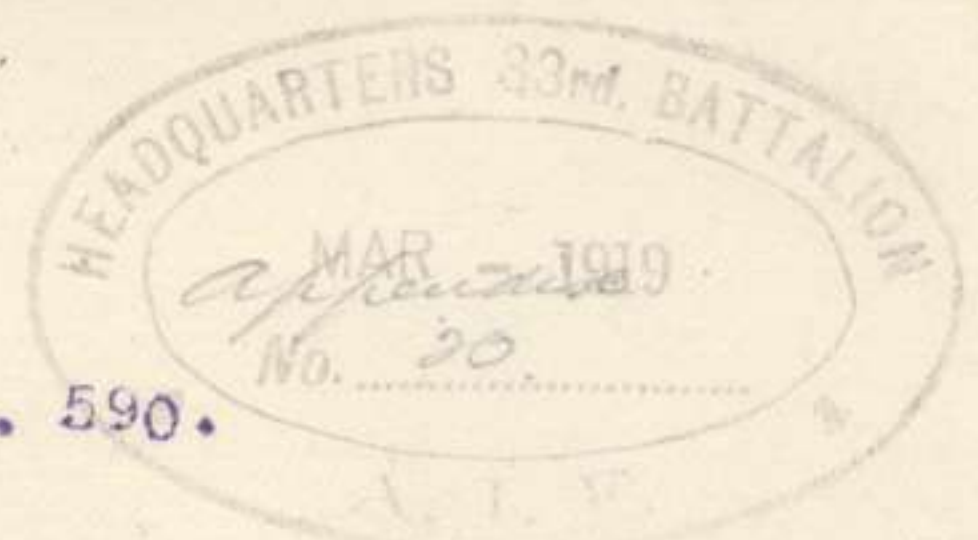

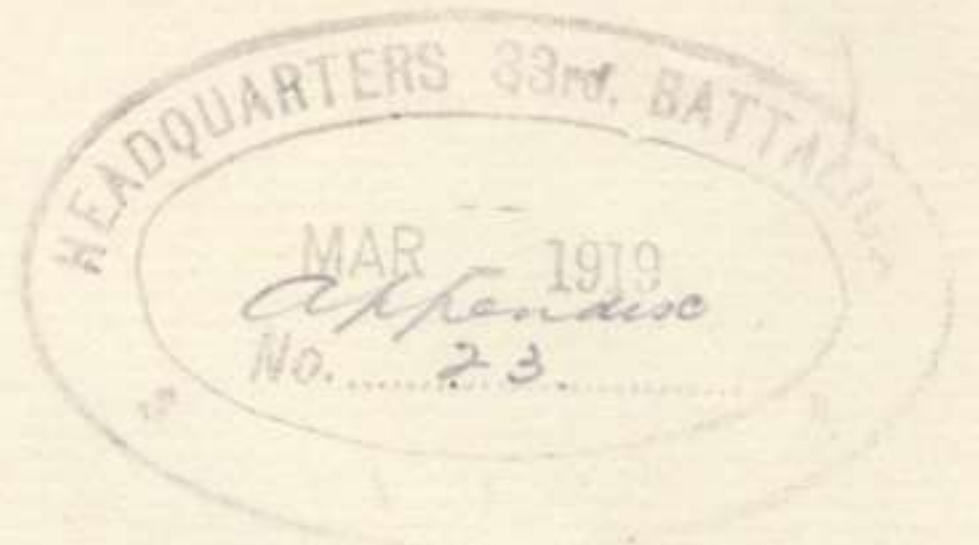
The attention of all ranks has repeatedly been drawn to the matter of thefts of civilian property, particularly food, fuel and coal in the village of CHEFFY. These acts of theft and damage are still occurring, however and claims amounting to a total of over 6,500 francs have already been lodged at these Headquarters since the Battalion arrived here. It is pointed out to all ranks that in cases where the loss or damage can be traced to the individual, he will be compelled to pay for it, either in cash or from the accumulation of his *dejeuner* pay and that furthermore the severest disciplinary action will be taken against him. When the claim is proved against the Battalion but the individual offender cannot be traced, the amount has to be paid out of the Regimental Funds of the Battalion. In this connection all ranks are informed that Regimental Funds are utilised solely for their benefit in the purchase of vegetables, foodstuffs and comforts and that payment of claims correspondingly reduces the amount available for these purchases and thereby deprives the men of the comforts that would ordinarily be provided for their welfare. The present balance at credit of the Regimental Funds Account of this Unit, however is quite inadequate to settle the claims so far received and at the same time to continue the purchase of comforts so that unless the thieving immediately ceases no further purchase of comforts will be made and the Battalion will be obliged to carry on with the bare issue of rations as obtained from the Divisional Supply Column, otherwise to settle the claims a general levy will have to be made on all ranks to raise the amount required.
