

The billet allotted to the Battalion was at BERTHAUCOURT so as the route measured 13½ miles it was decided to have breakfast before we moved. The Battalion moved off at 0850 and passed through CANDAS - MONTRELYTHE FIREFES HALLOY arriving at BERTHAUCOURT at 1730. A halt of 20 minutes was called at the first bour ½ hour. and (20) minutes halt at every clock hour afterwards with the exception of a two hours halt from 1200-1400 for lunch. 1½ miles passed CANDAS. The march was a very strenuous one as the day was very hot and the men were very soft owing to having very little marching since April. All ranks were comfortabley billeted by 1930. Strength. 


