

14th December 1917.

- 1.- The 6th A.I. Brigade will move to Reserve Brigade Area on the 15th inst.
- 2.- The 23rd Battalion will move by Route March to CANTEEN CORNER at T.26.c.6.1. on the 15th inst.
- 3.- Starting Point Entrance Gates to LOCREHOF FARM at M. 29.d. 0.4.
- 4.- Head of Column will pass Starting Point at 11.50 a.m. Coys. to be in position on LOCRE ROAD at 11.45 a.m.
- 5.- Order of March :- Band, H. Qrs., "C", "D", "A" Coys.
- 6 .- The following minimum distances will be maintained on the march .-

- 11.- ADVANCE PARTY of 1 N.C.O. per Coy. will report to Lieut. F.J. Jenkins at Battalion Headquarters at 9.30 a.m. on the 15th inst.
