

BEUGNIES AREA	3th	38	420.	As from noon today the 32nd Battalion was amalgamated with this unit the Bn to be known as the 30th Bn. Owing to the move on the 10th inst. a reorganisation of billets was not made it being decided that the actual joining together as one unit should be deferred until the move, though 32nd came under the orders of the C.O. 30th as from today. Yves-Gomezee was reached at 1430 and it was found that the billeting area was hardly as good as expected owing to thefact that a large number of Civilians had returned to their homes during the last week or two. C. O.'s Report.

The progress of the Demobilisation of the A.I.F. has necessitated the move of the unit from its winter quarters nearer to the Railhead from which the A.I.F. is being despatched to the Bases, and the end of the month brings another move still nearer to that Railhead.

The move from the BEUGNIES area was not a popular one either with the soldiers or the civilians, who had got on so well together during the twelve weeks stay of the Battalion in the area, and it was with deep regret on both sides that the unit left the area on the loth of the month.

Our stay in the YVES COMEZEE has not been long enough to permit of the same friendly feelings being attained between the villagers and the troops, so that this next move is being looked forward to by all ranks.

mation of all battalions of the Brigade into one Battalion under the name of the 8th Brigade Battalion, and the combined strength of all the Units after the next Embarkation Quota leaves will just be over a full strength Battalion; however 40% of this personnel are away from the Unit on detached duties, but the full number will pass through the Bn for demobilisation.

of the Unit, and at the present time only 15 animals are left on charge, whilst practically all the vehicles are to be returned to D.A.D.O.S. before the next move.

The departures of all the older members of the Bns have had its effect in many ways on the discipline, turnout and general conduct of the Unit, but from present appearances it should not be long before most of the unit is on its way to AUSTRALIA.
