REPORT OF QUARTERMASTER'S BRANCH FOR DECEMBER 1918. The "Q" Service was carried out during the minth under normal conditions in billets, there being nothing of special interest to report. RATIONS AND SUPPLIES. Rations and supplies were drawn from the A.S.C. and were well up to standard . ORDNANCE ISSUES. Demands for maintenance of supplies were regularly executed by D.A.D.O.S. ASALVAGE. All available salvage was returned to main dump. The area is now completely cleared. REGIMENTAL CANTEEN. The canteen was open for business every day. Stocks were more easily obtained than in Nevember. The sales for December were 22,000.90 francs. OTHER DEPARTMENTS. The following departments carried out usefull and satisfactory work for the Battalien : - 1. PostOffice. Beet Repairing. 3. ArmoureRs Shep. 4. Tailers Shep. SALVA GE. 


