

The following reliefs will take place on night 5/6 July.

(a) 41st Battalion will relieve 43rd Battalion in Right Subsector.
(b) 44th Battalion will relieve 42nd Battalion in Left Subsector.

On relief 42nd and 43rd Battalions will move to positions in Subsidiary and Corps lines vacated by 44th and 41st Battalions respectively.

- Guides with knowledge of alternative routes, at the rate 7 4 of 2 per Platoon, per Battalion Headquarters, per Machine Gun Coy, per Trench Hortar Battery, and per Brigade Headquarters have been arranged by Staff Captain to meet Units at T.S.c.20.55. to guide to Reserve area.
- Brigade Headquarters will close at U.S.a.1.1. and open 8. at T.2. Central at A.a.m. 12th July.



28th July 1917.

The 11th Infantry Brigade will rolieve the 9th Infantry Brigade in the line prior to "Z" day.

(2) "a" On the night 29/30th July the 41st Battalion and 44th Battalion will relieve "A" and "B" Battalions of 9th Brigade respectively, in the front line. "b" Specialists of 41st and 44th Battalions will move into the line on the night 28/29th July. "c" Details of relief will be arranged by Commanding Officers concerned. "d" All trench Maps, trench stores, aeroplane photographs, log

- books etc., will be taken over by ingoing Units. (3) "a" The four Battalions and Headquarters of the 9th Infantry Brigado will move out of the line on the night 29/30th July. "b" "A" and "B" Battalions 9th Infantry Brigade on relief will move back and occupy the Camps vacated by 41st and 44th Battalions. "c" The duties of "C" and "D" Battalions of 9th Infantry Brigade will be taken over by "E" and "F" Battalions of loth Infantry Brigade, but these Battalions will not move from their present position. They will merely be in tactical support to and under the orders of the G.O.C., 11th Infantry Brigade from 9 p.m., on the night 29/30th July. While under G.O.C. 11th Brigade for tactical purposes "E" and "F" Battalions will continue to be administered by 10th Infantry Brigade.
- (4) The Command of the line will pass from G.O.C., 9th Infantry Brigade to G.O.C., 11th Infantry Brigade at 3 a.m. on July 30th.
- (5) "a" On Y/Z night the 42nd Battalion and 43rd Battalion will move up for their minor operation in accordance with 11th Infantry Brigade Order No. 84. "b" On Z/A night subject to conditions being satisfactory these Battalions will be moved back to their present location.
 "c" All moves of Units of 11th Infantry Brigade after "Z" day will be notified in subsequent Orders.
- (6) "a" The 11th Machine Gun Company and 11th Trench Mortar Battery will be moved up to the line for the minor operation to be carried out on "Z" day, under orders of the D.M.G.O., and D.T.M.O., respectively. "b" The 9th Hachine Gun Company and 9th Trench Mortar Battery are not being relieved for the present, and will remain in the line for the operation on "Z" day, and subsequently, until the situation ellows of their being withdrawn. "c" After "Z" day, on relief of the 9th and 10th Machine Gun Companies and 9th and 10th Light Trench Hortar Batteries, the 11th Hachine Gum Company and 11th Trench Hortar Battery Will take over dispositions for the defence of the whole of the 11th Infantry Brigade front.
- Completion of all moves and reliefs will be forwarded to Headquarters 11th Infantry Brigade, in code, by wire.

Intelligence Summary "ANCHOR"

For 24 hours onding 6.a.m. 1/7/17. (Confidential).

UL OPELATIONS. Fairly quiet during morning. Several shoots corried out during afternoon, artillery becoming very lively at times. Enomy front line was engaged by 18 pdrs. while back areas confined to the heavies. WARHETON was engaged at 3.p.m. by 18 pdrs. and TRENCH MORTARS: Nil . Improvement of positions in progress.

MACHINE GUNS: Active during the night. The following were the proncipal targets engaged: KIWI FM., U.36.c.5.5. Road 0.36.a.42.25.

Cross Roads 0.26.b.22.56., over 1.000 being expended.

LEWIS GUNJ: Active. Engaged party of enemy who attacked patrol on SNIPERS: Four hits claimed on right sector. Enemy moving back at dawn were fired on. patrols: Six patrols operated on right sector; only one saw any-thing of enemy. patrol was out at about U.11.1.60.90. as covering party to witers. When proparing to withdraw at 2.a.m., patrol was attacked by about 16 enemy in two parties, one from the front and one on the left. Enemy threw 6 to 8 bombs : our patrol replied with bombs and rifle fire. Lewis Gun also engaged enemy rarty, which was quickly dispersed. No furthor trace could be found of this party atthough our patrol remained out for some time afterwards. 10 Patrols operated on left coctor. Patrols report enemy could be heard working near house 0.35.d.8.9. Works are also reported near Willows near 0.35.b.6.6. and vicinity. M.G. fired om ratrol from point in 0.5.b., location of which was unable to be given. Nothing was seen DEFENCES. Improvement of positions still in progress. Trenches are AIRCRAFT: Nil.

TEMY OPERATIONS. ARTILLERY: Active throughout the period. During the day about 100 4.28. foll between U.5.a.50.80. and U.5.d.20.60. About 300 shells of all sizes fell on centre of right sector, batteries operating from direction of U.6.c.58.20. Front line system near STEIGNAST FARM, GAPAARD, shelled intermittently during the day. At 5.30.p.m. largo number 4.2s. fell in Fm. de la CROIX. Not much damage was caused to defences. MESSINES, STEIGNAST, GAPAARD, BETLHEIM, back areas and mule tracks shelled during day and night. MACHINE GUNS: Alittle more active than usual Guns located at U.12.a.10.40 and one at approximatoly 0.29.d.7.3. North of BLAUWIL

SNIPERS: Active.

PATROLS: One oncountered by our patrols. DEFENCES: Works reported at 0.35.d.8.9. and 0.35.b.s.6. in vicinity of Willows.

AIRCRAFT: Nil . OBSERVATION: At 10.45 p.m. a shell was fired and ight of left sector (approximately opposite STEIGNAST FARM) which burst into flames and then gave off, small yellow lights. Snipers who had a clear view of enemy new line opposite 0.35. Central report no sign of enemy during the day. Wire of this line does not run North of CINEMA Road. Four men seen welking near OTIRA TRENCH opposite STRIGNAST Fm. 8.30, a.m. party of 20 men digging trench behind hedge and back towards Red roofed house at U.12.a.90.40. 9.80.a.m. party still working.

5.30 n.m. Gun flashes in roar of small house U.12.d.50.30. 8.00 p.m. Fire broke out in house along CINEMA Road in 0.36.a.

OUR OPERATIONS. ARTILLERY: Intermittent fire was maintained throughout the day by 18 pdrs. and hows. . Between 9.a.m. and 10.30.a,m. 18 pdrs. swoot Enemy front line with shrapnel, and again opposite left sector during the afternoon. Between 11.30 a.m. and 1.0.m. heavies carried out a shoot on enemy front line. WARNE-TON and Back areas also ongaged during period. TRENCH MORTARS: Nil MACHINE GUNS: Indirect fire carried out during night on Farms, Cross Roads, tracks, enemy front and support lines, over 3,000 rounds being oxpended. LEWIS GUNS: Fired bursts across NO MAN'S LAND during the night also into enemy working party.
SNIPERS: Two hits of aimed by left sector. Snipers active during period. PATROLS: Active throughout the night along the whole front. Work is reported in house at 0.35.d.8.9. and to North and South of it. A covering party was seen some distance out, on which a Lewis Gun was turned. M.G's are reported by patrons to be very active from places previously roported, particularly junction of STEIGNAST FARM Road and Road running from HUNS WALK to WARNETON. DEFENCES: Consolidation of position still in progress. Post established at 0.35.d.20.00 AIRCRAFT: Two of our planes few over enemy lines between 4 and bo,m.

ENEMY OPERATIONS.

ARTILLERY: More active than usual. Front line system was shelled intermittently with 5.9s., 4.2s., and 77's. The diff. orent Farms, dugouts, tracks, roads, and MESSINES were paid particular attention. Mule tracks and roads in back areas were shelled as usual during the night.

MACHINE GUNS: Fairly active throughout the night, firing into working parties and sweeping front line system. Nowapusit. ion observed at U.35.d.50.20. Guns also soon firing from all previously reported positions.

SNIPERS: Active.

PATROLS: None seen or observed, except covering party for enemy working party on which Lewis Guns were turned.

DEFENCES: Work reported at house 0.35.d.8.9. and on North and South side of it.

AIRCRAFT: Throe enemy planes flow over our lines at 7.15.a.m.

UR OPERATIONS. ARTILLERY: Fairly quiet during day. Fired at Noon, 5 p.m., and 2.a.m., in retaliation to enomy sholling, on enemy battery positions. Shrapnol was sprinkled at intervals over Enemy front line systom. TRENCH MORTARS: Nil . MACHINE GUNS: Carried out indirect fire on KINGSCLERE _ KIWI Fm .- Cross Roads - tracks and approaches in rear of enemy's lines, over 4,000 rounds being exponded. LEWIS GUNS: Active during the night; engaged enomy working partios and patrols. SNIPERS: One hit claimed by Left Battalion. Active throughout the day. PATROLS: Very active along the whole front throughout the night. An enemy patrol was encountered on CINEMA Road, but quickly retired when our patrol moved up. An Officer's patrol encountered very strong opposition at U.11.b.73.93; bombs were exchanged. neithor side gaining the upper hand: our patrol returned with three casual ties. Enemy covering and working parties were observed at different points along the front on which Lewis Guns were turned. Several fighting patrols operated during the night, but as no enemy patrols were encountered our patrols then lajup, as it was thought that several of those positions could be put to advantage as permanent posts as good observationwas obtainable our patrols dug in. A sap was run out to each of these from our front line. Patrols report several enemy strong points previously reported are held by fairly large numbers. DEFENCE: Consolidation and improvement of positions proceeded with. Damage caused by enemy barrage was not very great. We now occupy protective posts at 0.35.d.35.85., U.5.b.29.77. and U.5,b.35.44. Saps have been run out to each of these from our front line.

It is questionable, however, if Windmill posts at U.5.b.80.13 and CINEMA Road (0.35.d.35.70.) can be maintained in advance of red dotted line, and in view of proposed advance of Division on our left flank to 0.29.c.8.0., I recommend (as result of observation from our lines, patrol reports and aeroplane photos.) minor operation to establish blue dotted line as on Map attached. It would not then be necessary to establish any advanced posts, as the whole of WINDMILL post at U.5.b.80.13 could be wired in and form part of our trench system without any advanced posts. This would mean going beyond post 0.35.d.35.70., but the 200 yards extra dig is justified, otherwise there would be too much of a re-entrant in the line here. The establishment of this blue dotted line will mean clearing up of all enemy posts in U.5.b. and 0.35.d.: there is a post in 0.35.b. at 0.35.b.05.60. and a trench system West of trees on MILITARY Road (0.35.b.65.50): there is a small trench system, and it is recommended that in same operation these and all strong points, and machine guns be "mopped up" from our right flank to left flank and between our present line and OTIRA TRENCH, and that flank Divisions be asked to do the same, on right (particularly all posts West of WARNETON and South of DOUVE) and left flank (particularly post at 0.29 d.50.15.). 





These Troops will not advance closer than within 200 yards of WARNETON Line (where it exi ts) or about 125 yards from enemy wire where any exists).

It is necessary that all posts reported active are known to Assaulters in order to be ready to envelope and mop them up.

Distance to advance Eastward must be known and recognised

on man and ground.

The cleaning up of enemy posts is merely supplementary to the establishment of our Red posts, and also the consolidation of our

Red Dotted Line, but it is considered that the cleaning of "No mans Land" is necessary to allow of digging to commence on these posts.

At conclusion of advance there should be reorganisation

in order to bring Sections of same Platoons together.

Lateral touch of platoons and Companies will be necessary, for as the various Sections of Rifle Grenadiers, Riflemen and Bombers withdraw, Lewis Gun Sections must be reassured as to lateral touch, and in the event of Units being spread laterally at certain points, the Sections of Rifle Grenadiers, Riflemen or Bombers will not withdraw until Zero plus two hours, and will then withdraw with Lewis Gun Sections, otherwise Lewis Gun Sections become isolated and are unable to withdraw, The platoon Commander must not therefore withdraw until Bombers are withdrawing.

(b) parties TO ESTABLISH THE RED posts.

Special precautions will be taken to prevent the Levis Gun Sections covering the Red posts mistaking the first or subsequent wave moving back, for the enemy. Hen the Assaulters are all back, the protection of the Red posts will devolve on the garrison of the hed posts and their Levis Gun Sections in front of them. This protection is supplemented by Artillery and Lachine Fun fire, on a call for S.O.S.

At night patrols and posts from these posts will furnish local protection 50 yards to East of these posts to give early

warning of attack on nosts.

- (5). The governing principle of digging C.T's., posts and trenches will be to get under cover by Sections. It is better to have four sections of trench down early to proper depth of 4 or 5 feet with 5 or 10 yards between each, than to have a shall ow trench throughout. Sapping under cover and out of observation can go on later and make trench continuous then or at night fall, which will allow diggine above ground.

If digging on posts or Red Dotted Line, Bombers and Rifle Sections should dig on right or left flank of platoons as case may be and Lewis G nners in the centre and generally in advance of the position. tifle Grenadiors start the C.T. to the rear.

- (3). If lachine Guns or Artillery provent large digging parties on the C.T's., or Red Dottod Line by day, an Officer on the spot must thin men down into our two present lines from 0. 5.d.l. .. to U.5.d.40.75., and rest them preparatory to a vigorous dig when it gets dark.
- (7), a. Nos, 1 and 2 of Lewis Gun sections with Gun and all magazines of platoons of parties "O" and "D" (see para 1 above) for original C.T's., and Red Dotted Line will remain in our old Front Line until a nosition is dug for Lewis Gun, which should be ready for their accommodation at Zero plus 2 hours.

Artillery plan prior to Zero day (Divisional memo

G 1/343/8 of 12/7/17) can be perused at this Office.

On Zero day Artillory will commence barrage on a frontage of 1,500 yards (line 0,35.b..d., on North to 1 ine U.5.d.. U.11.b., on South) starting at a point 150 yards East of our present Front Line and posts.

It will remain on this line for three minutes, to give our Assault Troops time to issue from their trenches. It will lift at Zero plus three minutes and creep forward at rate of fifty yards

a minute, and will come to a halt on the WARNETON Line.

The barrage will be thickened and continued from U.11,b. on South by Artillery from NEW ZEALAND Division and 3" Stokes Mortars by 11th Infantry Brigade - particularly on enemy posts 16,17. & 18.

On North the Artillery barrage will be continued from 0.35.b., Northwards by 10th Brigade 3" Stokes Mortars and will co. operate with Artillery action of Division on our loft, particular attention will be paid by 10th Brigade 3" Stokes Mortars to enemy post No. 2, and enemy trench astride MILITARY ROAD 0.35.b.9.1. to 0.35.b.7.8. Construction of Mortar positions will be started forthwith.

The barrage will be at rate of four rounds per gun a minute from Zero to Zero plus fifteen minutes _ it will then drop to 3 _ then 2 _ then 1 round a gun a minute. Heavies and 4,5 Hows.

reserved for Counter Battery and for shelling back areas.

It is proposed to cease fire at Zero plus four hours. It is not definitely decided whether prior to Zero plus four hours certain guns or Batteries will be taken out to extend barrage of 18 pounders to North or South of 1,500 yards frontage and to cover from DOUVE to BLAWEPOORTBEEK from Zero plus 30 minutes and to quicken fire on this line or the 1,500 yards frontage on a call for

S.O.S. to repel local counter attack,

It is quite definitely fixed, however, that after Zero plus four hours the S.O.S. line will extend from LA DOUVE RIVER to BLAVEPOORTBEEK, the line of S.O.S. being U.II.b.85.45, thence to WARNETON Line at U.6.c.37.60, thence along WARNETON Line to 0.36.c.1.5., thence to 0.35.b.9.1., 0.35.b.7.8., 0.29.d.45.05. This S.O.S. can be thickened up by 3" Stokes Mortars of all three Brigades, but a re-arrangement of 9th Brigade 3" Mortars will be necessary to fire 150 yards East of new y established Red post and Red Dotted Line.

(2). All four Machine Gun Companies will employ 12 Guns (48 in all) on whole Divisional front; barraging a line 50 yards East of WARNETON Line in squares 0.36.c. - U.6.a., and U.6.c., and in squares U.12.a. and 0.36.a., barraging on enemy wire. i.e. 50 yards West of WARNETON Line. This barrage will extend to LA DOUVE RIVER on South and to BLAWEPOORTBEEK on North. From Zero to Zero plus 30 minutes fire will be practically continuous, but from Zero plus 30 minutes to Zero plus four hours, fire will gradually slacken, ceasing at Zero plus four hours, but increasing rate of fire on S.0.8.

The Lawis Gun teams of the 9th Brigade remain on this

G.O.C., Brigade Major, and one other Officer 11th Brigade are to be allowed to come into 9th Brigade Headquarters and use their Signal service runners and communications from Zero minus 8 hours until relief of 11th Brigade troops at 3.a.m. on Z/A day.

It is considered that by midnight digging will be complete, and if the relieving troops of 9th Brigade could bring up wire and picquets the posts could be partly wired on the same night. No. VII post to be wired on South and South-East back to our front line in vicinity of U.5.d.45.65 and No. III post to North to join up to post II.

Observers of 9th Brigade will assist with information re advance and action of our tropps.

No carrying parties are being provided by 11th Brigade and 9th Brigade are responsible for defence of line the replenishment of the four Company Dumps at U.5.b.25.05.

These Plans should be kept up to date with any newessary alterations or additions by Company Commanders, and at Battalion Headquarters, and should in all cases be handed over to relieving Companies and Battalions of the same or other Brigades.

In addition Battalion Intelligence Officers should make it part of their duty that any alterations or additions made on these Plans are made on all of them, and that such alterations and additions are also communicated to Brigade. Brigades will forward such alterations and additions to Divisional Headquartors.

Iny information gained by reconnaissances or raids undertaken by patrols from day to day, and recorded in the Divisional Intelligence Summery, should be automatically put on the Plan at Brigade, Bettalion, and Company Headquarters.


By this means everyone from Division downwards will be working on the same Plan and can communicate information to each other concerning NO MAN'S LAND in terms of that Plan.



Our troops advanced to the attack under cover of our artillery barrage, and a smoke screen on either n ank South produced by Van ey bombs and North by Artillery, both of which were vory successful. A Hachine Gun barrage from 48 guns was also put down on prearranged lines. Stokes shells were al so usod.

> Enomy S.O.S. barrage came down at Zoro plus 2 minutes 11 seconds immediately in response to green rockets followed by red and green reckets sent up in pairs from wither flank and opposite our attack at Zero plus 2 minutes. Artillor fire was exceptionally heavy on our Front Line system and main C.T's in forward area. Enemy Machine Gun fire was also heavy.

4.75 a.m.

". Enomy post No. 7 contured after stiff opposition and consolidation of Rad Dotted Line in this vicinity commenced. First capture of prison rs reported.

5. a.m.

All objectives can tured after strong opposition with exception of post 8, situation of thich was obscure. consolidation of captured posts and Rod Dettod Line in progress. Batches of prisoners continued to come in from captured positions. 2 Machin Guns and one Granattenworfer were taken.

8.30 a.m.

Enemy reported thickening opposite post No. 7, but counter_ attack did not material ise, being smashed by our S.O.S.

9 a.m.

Information received that po. t No. 8 was captured and was being consqidated. We were therefore successful in all our objectives at though strong opposition was encountered. Rod Dottod Line, C.T's, and Posts in process of consolidation.

Throughout the day Enomy kopt up a strong intermittent fire both from Artill dry and Machine Gume on all our captured positions.

1. p.m.

Enomy again appoared to be thickening on WARRETON Line. but nothing eventuated, being dispersed by our S.O.S.

Conso idation in progress. Northern posts have been sighted so as to give assist. ance as regards covering fire on posts 6 and 7. C.T's have been commenced from Red Dotted Line towards all posts and latoral communication between all posts has also been commenced. Red Dotted Line is being dug in Platoon locations at intervals of 80 yards and is now down to an average of from 4's" to 5' and fire bays are being commenced. Tire has been put up in front of Red Dotted Line for 50 yards on the right flank of the loft Battalion Sector. A Bomb block has been constructed in trench at post No. 5.

Work on port VII was greatly interfored with by enemy

artill ory and ilachino Cama.

Remarks. Enemy post Ho. 15 was apparently missed by our Artillery and Stokes Hortars' barrage and consequently hald up attack on post No. 8. Alargo number of the enemy counterour attack began, which murther dol and the capture of post No. 8. Almost all the Officers and senior N.C.Os. of the right Battalion Assaulting troops were casualties before our attack was very far advanced, consequently as the posts were left in command of junior N.C.Os. reorganisation of the right Battalion was necessary, this naturally delayed our advance on this flank.



On coming out of the line after the Eighteen Days in MESSINES the Battalion was camped in Le DOUVE VALLEY, and at the Conferences of C.O.s Battalions, it seemed apparent that at an early date the Division would be engaged in active operations The C.O.s. Battns, were paired off as follows :- Colonel BUTLER D.S.O. (43rd Battn) and Major HERON D.S.O. (41st Btn.) Colonel WOOLCOCK D.S.O. (Bind Battn .) and Major WOOTTEN (11t Brigade Major), Colonel MAINSBRIDGE and Brig.General CANNAN C.B. and asked to prepare Schemes with the object of capturing German posts in N.M.L. west of WANNETON establish posts ourselves and at the same time to advance far enough beyond these posts, to give the impression that WARNETON was our objective. incidently this advance beyond the posts, would act as a covering party to the parties digging the captured posts. These Schemes were duly prepared and discussed and all the good points picked out and a final Scheme decided on. In the Scheme the 41st and 44th Battns, were to relieve the Battns. in the line two nights previous to the assault, that is to say, on 29/30 July, and on the night 30/31 st the 42nd and 4345 were to take over the line and assault in the morning. It is also necessary to mention that it was the duty of the assaulting Battns, to mop up the posts in N.M.L. and to dig n in the Med Posts, connect them laterally and with C.T.s from each post back to the Front line. Amongst the posts to be attacked was the redoubtable windmill, which so far had resisted all efforts. Elaborate preparations for training were under taken by the assaulting Battalions, the whole of which work we followed carefully in order to be able to intelligably assist in the attack failed. The training included digging replica posts and trenches and many conferences of all officers during which the Brigadier (General CANNAN) would call on any officer to describe in detail to the assembled officers, the part he had to play in the operations and the part of his neighbours. Two days before the operations took place full information was received as to the reason for the attak which was to co-operate in the big attack which stretched from the LYS River North to the sea.

I will wander for a moment. In our training for this period, bayonet fighting physical fitness and recreation secured main attention and it is worthy to note that at a Brigade Sports Meeting held in the La DOUVE valley in the presence of the Major General J. MONASH C.B. (Divisional Commander), the this to Battn. won the Brigade Cup for securing the greatest aggregate number of points securing more points than the other three Battalions put together. To resume the 31st July operation.

The Battalion on the night 29/30 July relieved the 35th Battalion A.I.F. in our old Sector east of MESSINGS taking over the line from U5a 70.55. to La Douve River Without suffering casualties. The day 30th July passed peace uneventfully except for heavy shelling all along the front. The 434d Battn. who were assaulting on our sector with the And on our left arrived to time and our Coys, moved back slightly in rear trenches and remained there throughout the day, 31st July. Meanwhile at 3.50.A.M.

south of us, the New Zealand Brigade took LA BASSEVILLE About 6 a. to. Bosche prisoners began to stream back and they were the first intimation received that the attack was progressing favorably. Later on word was sent back that the attack had succeeded and the three nosts No. VII. VIII and IX established. During Owing to the heavy casualties sustaind the task of connecting un the posts and digging the C.T.s was not carried out. That night Jist/4st Aug. we relieved the 450d Battn, and while relief was in progress word came through that the Wind will past (VIII) had been recaptured A counter attack was organised by the 43rd and with a platoon of that the post was reoccupied. Posts VII and IX were relie ad without difficulty. Then for lowed the most trying period that the 4 st had yet had to face, as that night it started to rain heavily and kept on almost continuously during our occupancy of the 'ine. The condition of the ground was avful, and the trenches were waist deep in water, in which the few gum boots we possessed were of little value, as the water came in over the top. The garrisons of these post had a particularly rough time as besides the trenches full of water, it was impossible to improve their position, as the ground fell in as fast as dug, and lateral communicatin between posts and C.T.s to rear could not be built in the sea of mud. Added to this were the determined counter-attak made repeatedly without success, the scarcity of hot food of any description, the trouble with rifles and L.G.s clogging due to mud, and the lack of rest. Owing to the water men could not even sit down and often fell asleep standing un. It is not to be wondered at that the sick rate went up and platoons that went in 35 strong came out with about 5 men. The shelling was also very severe as the nosts had been roughty located by the Bosch. On the 3rd morning Lt. Price was shell shocked and his nost was taken by Sergt.R. Goodwin. It was originally understood that we would be relieved on night 3/3 Aug. but relief was postponed and men stuck it out until night 4/5th Aug. It is of interest to note that all communications were by O.L. Lamps. On the night 3/3 Au two Coys. of 35th Battn. were sent up to try and dig C.T.s between Posts but were unsuccessful. These Coys, were sent up as we were too weak to attempt it ourselves and the next night these two Coys, were definitely handed over to us to strengthen the garrison. With these men the posts were manned and the exhausted personnel withdrawn and sent back The covering barrages dropped by the artillery and M.G.s were excellent and it was due to them to a great extent that all the enemy counter attacks failed. The M.G. barrage especially is worthy of mention. Consisting of 68 guns on roughly a front of 1000 yards the S.O.S. Rocket (107 den rain had scarcely burst in the air when like a mighty electric he bell a screen of there dropped on the attacking bosch. At 7 a.m. on the morning of the 3rd Aug. we allowed German stretcher bearers to remove dead and wounded who were lying by the score in front of the nosts. This seems trivial but neverthe less was not customary, as the bosch as far as our experiences went was very seldom an observer of the Red Cress flag, in fact rather considered a stretcher party as a = topping= target.

On the night of 4,5 Aug. we were at last relieved by a battery of New Zealanders and were taken back in Noter lorries to Deseule Camp between Neuve Eglise and Steen-werch. The men were so exhausted that they had to be helped form from the waggens. A few days rest however had them as o
