Line	1-6-18		Battalion in Support. For disposition see Map No. 1. Weather Fine. From 2.0 a.m. to 4.15 a.m. about 6,000 4.2 and 5.9 Yellow Cross (Mustard) Gas Shells fell on 0.22, 0.23, 0.28 and 0.29. From 4.15 a.m. onwards throughout the day enemy Artillery was very quiet. Enemy aircraft not active.	<i>By working Party reports for June in Appendices</i>
	2-6-18		Weather Fine. From 3.30 a.m. to 4.40 a.m. 5,000 4.2 and 5.9 Gas and H.E. (50% Gas) fell on 0.28, 0.22, 0.23 and 0.29. The Gas was mixed Phosgene lachrymery and Mustard. Many of dug-outs occupied by "A" Coy. in gully 0.23.d. were made untenable owing to proximity of Shell bursts. Our planes very active throughout the day. No sign of enemy planes. At 1.45 p.m. 2 American soldiers attached to Battalion for experience were wounded. Lieut. Brätton was also wounded. (Lieut. Britton died of wounds 22-6-18).	
	3-6-18		Weather Fine and Warm. Very little aircraft activity. One enemy plane flew low over our Sector at 6.0 a.m. Our planes active throughout the day. About 150 rounds 4.2 H.E. fell on our area throughout the day.	
	4-6-18		Weather Fine. During the day about 200 rounds 4.2 H.E. fell on our area and about 12 Black Shrapnel burst high, probably enemy ranging. At 7.40 p.m. 3 E.A. flew over our Sector. Our planes very active.	
	5-6-18.		Weather fine and clear. During the day about 13 rounds 4.2 H.E., 30 rounds 77 .m.m. and 35 rounds 5.9 H.E. fell on our area. Our planes very active throughout the day. 2 enemy balloons up at 5.15 p.m. No enemy aircraft activity.	
	6-6-18		Weather fine and clear. 34th. Battalion relieved 35th. Battalion in Front Line P.25.b. and P.25.c. Relief was completed without incident at 1.35 a.m. 7-6-18.	
	8.45 p.m.		3 Enemy planes flew over our Sector low. One of these flew on the 0,25 where 8 of our planes were met. One of our planes opened fire, and the Bosch plane turned round and flew home very unsteadily as if it had been hit, but not in a vital spot. No attempt made by our planes to follow him. Our plane was within 200 yards range when fire was opened.	
	7-6-18		Weather fine and warm. Artillery fire nil on our Sector. At 3.0 a.m. our Lewis Gun fired on P.25.b.50.35 where a working ^{party} was heard. Much use was made of the Mills No 36 Rifle Grenade, several being fired on enemy Front Line from our Right Coy. Sector.

Line.	8-6-18		Weather Fine. Enemy Artillery very quiet on our Sector, but very active on Back Area. Again No. 36 Mill's Grenade was made much use of by our Rifle Grenadiers who fired on Enemy Front Line posts. Our snipers have thoroughly beaten down enemy snipers and movements. Our observers report that the enemy does not dare to show his head above the parapet during hours of daylight. At 2.30 a.m. one of our patrols encountered a patrol of the 14th. Battalion A.I.F. on the Left of our Sector, and some rifles and bombs were used. Two of the 14th. Battalion were wounded and one of ours.	
	9-6-18		Weather fine. Our artillery very active ^{on} and harrassing fire throughout the night. Our aircraft very active. 12.30 a.m. enemy artillery fairly active on our Front Line and Supports. Gully in P.19.c. was heavily shelled. No damage or casualties resulted. 3" Stokes fired on Machine Gun positions P.25.c.6.4. during the night.	
	10-6-18		Weather Fine. Night 9/10th was an extraordinary quiet one. There was a marked increase in enemy's use of Verrey Lights. Practically no artillery fire on our Sector. Our artillery kept up the usual harrassing fire from 8.30 p.m. to 3.0 a.m. 11-6-18. At 9.45 p.m. our bombardment opened for an attack by 2nd. Division North of SOMME. Barrage, which could be viewed from our Sector, appeared to be an excellent one. Bombardment extended as far South as VAIRE WOOD.	
	11-6-18		Weather Fine. From 2.0 a.m. to 3.0 a.m. enemy showed great activity in Rifle Fire. Our artillery on usual harrassing fire programme during night 11/12th. Our planes very active from 5.30 p.m. to 1.30 a.m. 12/13th. 12-6-18. Casualties one other rank killed, one other rank wounded.	
	12-6-18		Weather Fine. Harrassing fire by our 18 Pdrs and 4.5's on enemy road, track, defences opposite our front from 7.0 p.m. to 2.50 a.m. 13-6-18. Our planes very active over enemy lines from 4.0 p.m. to 8.0 p.m. Great decrease in enemy rifle fire. Noticable decrease generally in enemy activity opposite our sector.	
	13-6-18		Weather Fine. Our artillery very active from 5.30 p.m. to 3.0 a.m. 14-6-18. Our planes active until dusk. Situation throughout generally quiet. Casualties one other rank wounded.

Line	14-6-18	1.1 a.m.	<p>Weather Fine. Our artillery very active from 4.0 p.m. to 1.45 a.m. 1.1 a.m. A minor operation was carried out by 1 Sgt., 1 Cpl., and 10 men of "C" Coy. From 12.50 a.m. to 1.10 a.m. 300 rounds Stokes Mortar shells were fired in support of operations on enemy lines from P.25.b.4.3. to P.25.b.30.15. From 12.50 a.m. to 1.0 a.m. Stokes Mortar fired on to position which was to be raided. The N.C.O. in charge Sgt. Mudford DCM. MM. fired a Verey light at 1.0 a.m. which was the signal for the Stokes to cease fire on position to be raided and to switch their fire on the flanks. Party entered the enemy trenches at P.25.b.3.2. at 1.1 a.m. One enemy sentry was looking over the parapet was killed. Two enemy who were in the dug-out were taken prisoner. Identification was normal 137th. I.R. Only three of the enemy were seen. The enemy trenches were found to be in good order, about 6 ft. deep and fairly wide. Trench where the party entered appeared to be a series of posts linked up by tunnels which were used as dugouts. There was no wire in front of the trenches. Unfortunately the Cpl. was killed which was the only casualty. The Sgt. in charge of party describes the Stokes Mortar barrage as perfect, and in a great measure contributed to the success of the operation for the party did not meet with any opposition from machine guns or rifle fire. The party were only 7 minutes out of our trenches. Enemy attitude quiet.</p>	
	15-6-18		<p>Weather Fine. Usual artillery activity on our side. From 10.30 p.m. to 3.15 a.m. 16-6-18 130 rounds 4.2 and 7.7 H.E. fell on our Sector. Enemy aircraft more active than usual.</p>	
	16-6-18		<p>Weather Fine. Our aircraft very active. At 8.10 p.m. over 60 of our planes crossed over our Sector to enemy lines and dropped bombs on enemy Front Line and worked Eastwards dropping bombs on enemy back area. At 8.30 p.m. one enemy plane was observed to crash near MARCELCAVE. Enemy aircraft fairly active. Enemy attitude quiet.</p>	
	17-6-18		<p>Weather fine. Enemy artillery very quiet on our Sector. Our artillery on usual harrassing fire programme. During evening our planes were very active flying low over enemy's lines. At intervals up to 9.0 p.m. 6 of our poanes flew low over enemy forward positions and directed machine gun fire on garrison. 34th. Battalion relieved 35th Battalion in Reserve position ("C" Battalion). 33rd. Battalion A.I.F. relieved 34th Battalion in Front Line. Battalion Relief was complete by 12 Midnight. Line.	18-6-18		Weather dull and cloudy. 77 rounds 4.2 H.E. and 20 rounds 5.9. fell on our Area. Two hostile planes over our Sector during the day. Our aircraft active.	
	19-6-18		Rain fell from 2.30 a.m. to 6.0 a.m. 3 planes over our area at 8.30 p.m. 20 rounds 4.2 fell on 0.28.a. from 6.0 p.m. to 10.0 p.m. Casualties, nil.	
	20-6-18		Weather fine but cloudy. No enemy artillery fire on our Sector. Our planes moderately active. No sign on enemy planes.	
	21-6-18		Weather fine until 8.0 p.m. when rain commenced to fall. Enemy artillery fairly active on our Sector. At 8.10 p.m. 50 rounds rapid fire with 4.2. H.E. was directed on 0.28.b and 25 rounds on 0.23.c. Casualties, nil. No aircraft activity on either side.	
	22-6-18		Weather fine. Throughout the day many black shrapnel shells burst very high over our Sector apparently range finding ranging fire. One hostile plane over our Sector at 8.15 p.m. and 8.25 p.m. Our artillery activity normal. Casualties nil.	
	23-6-18		Weather fine. Hostile aircraft fairly active flying high over our Sector throughout the day. Very little hostile shelling. Situation generally quiet. Casualties nil.	
		11.0 a.m.	Lieut. Col. E.E. Martin (DSO) rejoined Battalion and took over command from T/Lieut.Col. F.G. Grant who remains as 2nd in command.	
	24-6-18		Weather misty during the morning clearing up about 9.0 a.m. Enemy aircraft activity nil owing to high wind. Enemy artillery very active on our Sector from 4.0 p.m. to 11.0 p.m. when 350 rounds 4.2 H.E. and Shrapnel fell on 0.22, 0.28, and 0.29. Casualties nil.	
	25-6-18		Weather fine but cloudy. 3.0 a.m. to 4.0 a.m. 60 rounds 4.2 H.E. fell 0.22.b. Very little shelling on our Sector with H.E. but the enemy fired many rounds of 4.2 black sharpnel which mostly burst very high. It appears that this shrapnel fire is for ranging purposes. At 4.0 p.m. one shrapnel round burst low over 0.28.a. and caused 2 other ranks casualties, wounded. These are the first casualties sustained in this Sector through enemy shrapnel. Enemy high flying planes were more active than usual over our Sector. Only at 1.0 p.m. did a hostile plane attempt to fly low, but was immediately driven off by our A.A., M.G., and Lewis Gun fire. Our planes very active. At one time during the evening about 30 of our planes crossed our Sector to enemy lines. Casualties 2 O/R wounded.

Battalion camped in terraces, banks, etc., under trench shelters.

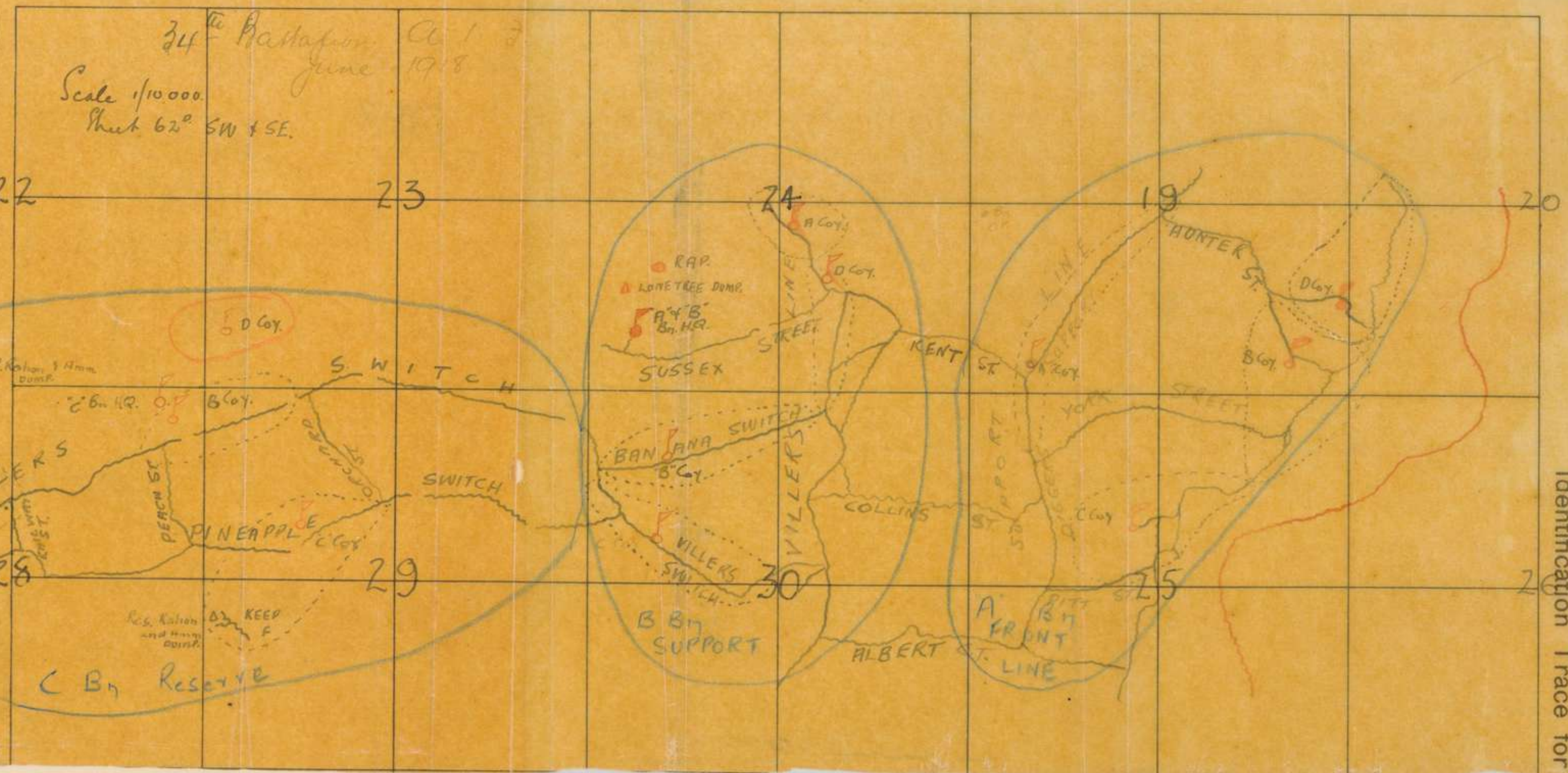

POLICY. 1. The Defence Policy of the "C" Battalion.

DISPOSITIONS. 2. "C" Battalion (in reserve) will occupy the Viller's Switch, Keep F and Pineapple Switch, and is the reserve Battalion with the following alternative roles :-

(a) To counter-attack to regain ground lost either in the Brigade forward system or in the Hill 105 Area.

(b) To garrison and defend Villers and Pineapple Switch and Keep F in the event of the enemy penetrating into VILLERS BRETONNEUX.

(c) To operate in the Forward System on the flanks of "A" Battalion.

(d) Two Companies "A" and "B" accommodated in Viller's Switch.

One Company "C" accommodated in Keep F and Pineapple Switch.

One Company "D" occupying the embankments in O.22.d. and O.23.c.

In the event of an alarm or "Stand to" the Battalion will stand to in a position of readiness in the positions now occupied, and one Officer per Company will immediately report to Battalion Headquarters for orders.

RECONNAISSANCE 3. To facilitate prompt action, all Officers and N.C.O's will reconnoitre the routes from present location to forward System.

All Officers and N.C.O's will make themselves acquainted with all Dumps in the Area.

1. (a) The 34th. Battalion will relieve the 35th Battn. in the Line, on the night of 6/7th. June 18 and will then be "A" Battn. of the 9th. Brigade Defence Scheme.
- (b) The 33rd. Battn. will relieve the 34th. Battalion in the Support Line, on the same night.
2. (a) "C" Coy. 34th Bn will relieve "C" Coy. 35th. Bn. in the "RIGHT" Coy. Sector.
- (b) "B" Coy. 34th Bn. will relieve "B" Coy. 35th. Bn. in the "CENTRE" Coy. Sector.
- (c) "D" Coy. 34th. Bn. will relieve "D" Coy. 35th. Bn. in the "LEFT" Coy. Sector.
- (d) "A" Coy. 34th. Bn. will relieve "A" Coy. 35th Bn. in "DIGGER'S SUPPORT".

"A" and "B" Coys. in the Southern Kitchen.

4. ROUTES. BLANGY TRONVILLE - LAMOTTE - CAMON to Bivouac
5. ORDER OF MARCH. Companies will march with 200 yards interval and 100 yards interval between Platoons.
6. BLANKETS. Blankets from the Line will be carried on the man.
Q.M. will arrange to remove valises, packs, spare blankets, and Q.M. Stores in the two Motor Lorries provided plus two G.S. Waggon.
7. LEWIS GUNS. One Limber per Company will be at Cross Roads on Sunken Road, North of Battalion Cook-houses at 11.0 p.m. for loading guns. Each Company Limber will move out with its respective Company. Sgt. Sadler will supervise loading of guns.
8. TRENCH STORES. Trench Store List for Stores handed over to relieving Unit will be forwarded, in triplicate, to Battalion Headquarters, within 12 hours after relief.
9. BATTALION HEADQUARTERS. Location of Battalion Headquarters in new Area will be at M.9.a.7.8.

MESSENGER DOGS. 95.

The latest record of traffic per Messenger Dog Service shows a notable increase taken on the run between Units and kennels. On return to kennels the dogs now consume only a very small amount of food. There is every reason to believe that the dogs receive food and attention from troops either at the units' Headquarters to which they are detailed or at cook-houses en route.

The Messenger Dog Service can be made very efficient providing orders as regards the treatment of dogs are obeyed.

The following hints are drawn from practical points which have been noticed and which seriously tend to spoil the efficiency of this service :-

(a) Passing Battery positions men have tried to entice dogs away, thus hampering their run.

(b) That the dogs must be kept away from the ordinary dogs in the vicinity of their work, as these dogs hinder the runs of messenger dogs.

(c) If possible owners with their dogs should be given some shelter by themselves apart from other troops.

(d) On no account should the dogs be petted, or offered food, or made much of by persons other than their keepers.

(e) Lost messenger dogs should be taken to the nearest Signal Service Unit.

Instances have come to notice of troops in the lines firing at messenger dogs that are carrying despatches to the rear. This practice must stop forthwith.

IMPROPER FEELING is an impression existing that horses are
 of horses etc. likely to be unsafe when Australian troops are about.

107. Whilst fully appreciating that this impression may be
 of belief without foundation, the C.O. asks that all Officers will
 advise and take steps to see that all ranks are warned that any
 form of illegal possession of animals, cycles, or other property
 will be dealt with drastically. The C.O. Brigade
 wishes it to be made known that he will hold responsible
 commanding officer who is in charge of a unit or detail which is
 found to possess unauthorised animals or vehicles.

108. The use of telephones is to be limited and calls must
 be reduced to a minimum. Such unnecessary use is made of
 the 'phone. The character of 'phone messages is to be
 established with the intention of drawing attention of Units
 to cases where 'phones are used unnecessarily.
 A sufficient amount of time is set aside for the 'phone is
 not generally taken into consideration. Discretion must be used.
 It must be remembered that the imparting of information to
 the enemy by unguarded telephone conversations may have
 consequences of a serious nature. A listening set is
 to be established and the Brigadier trusts that it will
 be able to detect any laxity in this regard.

109. The close attention of all Units is called to
 the Fourth Army Routine Order No. 5039 of May 15th 1918.
 The distance between transport or horses will not exceed 50 yds.
 without an interval. Intervals will be 25 yds.
 Sliding on vehicles is forbidden. This order has been
 disregarded. Commanding Officers will take steps on
 all occasions to see that it is strictly carried out in
 the future. When vehicles are specially used for conveyance
 of men, or men for some special reason are given special
 permits to do so, such men will be provided
 with a written authority to do so.

110. The importance of the maintenance of discipline at
 the present juncture will appeal to every commanding
 officer and the very earnest efforts of all are asked to
 aspire to a very high standard of discipline both while in
 the field and at the line. The salute must be insisted upon.
 It is noticeable that Junior Officers are often slack in this
 connection; also in themselves saluting senior Officers.

111. A great deal of loose rifle fire is taking place.
 Men are found firing at marks or targets, gaps, or in water.
 An N.C.O. of Artillery has been seriously wounded in this
 area and a man of this Brigade has been caught firing rifles
 without any apparent thought of where the bullets might go.
 Commanding Officers will take immediate steps to stop this
 practice and will punish all men offending. Men do not
 seem to realise that when a rifle is fired into water the
 bullet will invariably ricochet from same.

112. Men do not appear to be instructed in what may or may
 not be demanded from them if taken prisoner. All ranks
 must be carefully instructed that they need give no further
 information than their name and regiment; that on no account
 should they tell anything they know of dispositions,
 neighbouring Units, intentions or rumours that they may
 have heard, nor anything they have seen. Men who talk
 freely will be despised by their captors and can gain nothing,
 - by what really means a betrayal of their comrades - They
 should also be warned about talking amongst themselves of

... military matters when in company of other prisoners as means are sure to exist to overhear such conversations.

Attention of all ranks must be repeatedly called to the necessity of continuous alertness for gas. Gas casualties can be avoided in most cases and greatly reduced in many cases by care and a prompt action by Officers. The G.O.C. Brigade directs that action will be taken against Officers who have not used every possible means to avoid gas casualties or who neglect to take such action as may militate against the number of men affected.

The G.O.C. Division was informed that Officers were very slack in the wearing of their Respirators and had been seen frequently in the Forward Areas with their Respirators slung at their sides. The G.O.C. recently called attention to this of Units to this disobedience of orders, and hears with much displeasure of its continuance. Officers Commanding Companies must take disciplinary action against Officers further offending in this direction.

Attention is drawn to Divisional Routine Order 433. The utmost cleanliness and ordliness must be maintained in trenches and billets. It has been noticed that billets and dugouts occupied by Officers have been left in a dirty and untidy condition. Billets and dugouts occupied by Officers should be an example. Officers Commanding Companies will take measures to ensure that Junior Officers keep tidy and clean the premises occupied by them.

Scrupulous cleanliness in connection with Kitchens and Cookhouses must be insisted upon. All cooks or men handling food in course of preparation must keep their hands clean. Men must not be allowed to sleep or wash inside Cook-houses. Cooks and others must wash their hands after visiting latrines. This is seldom done.

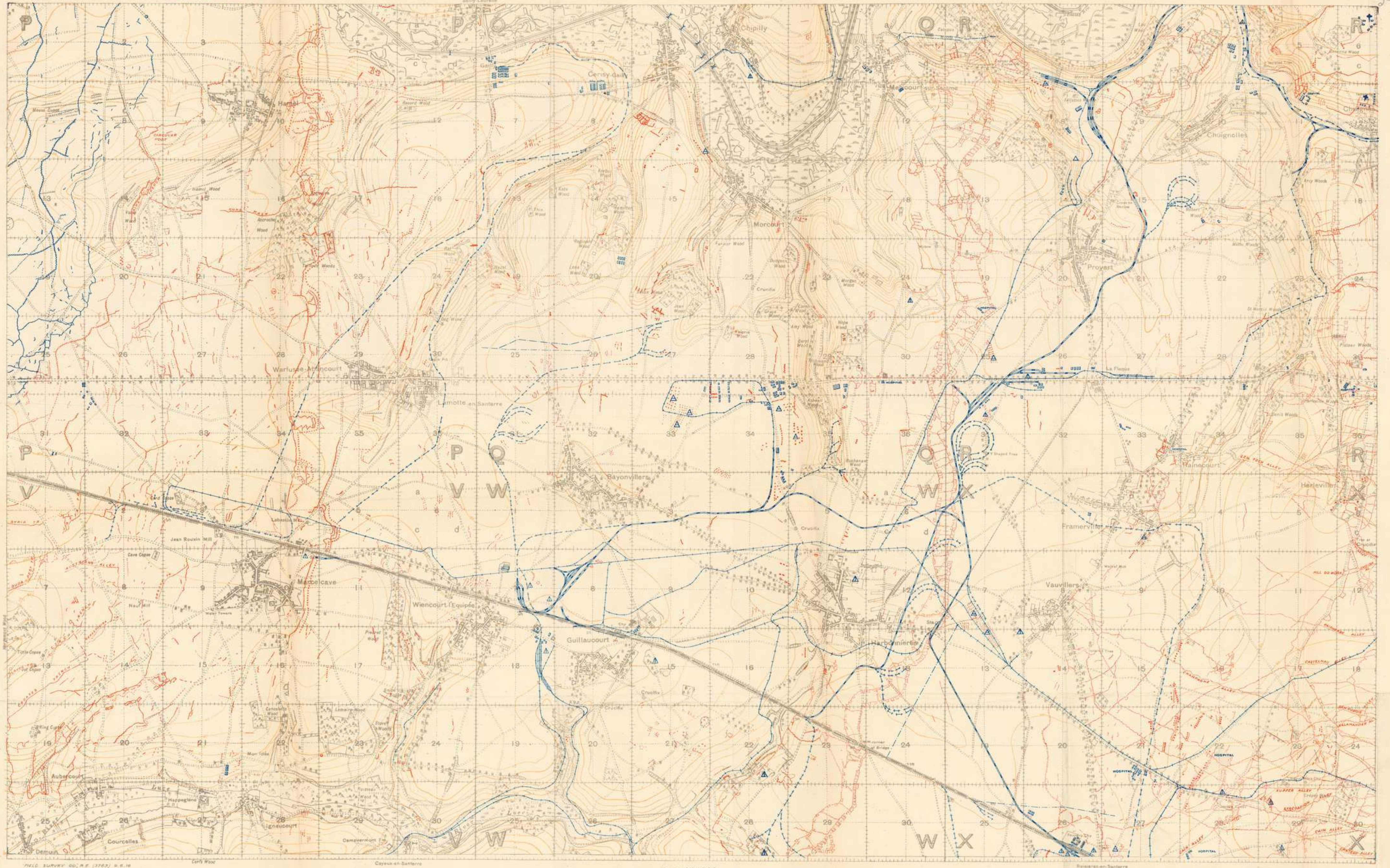

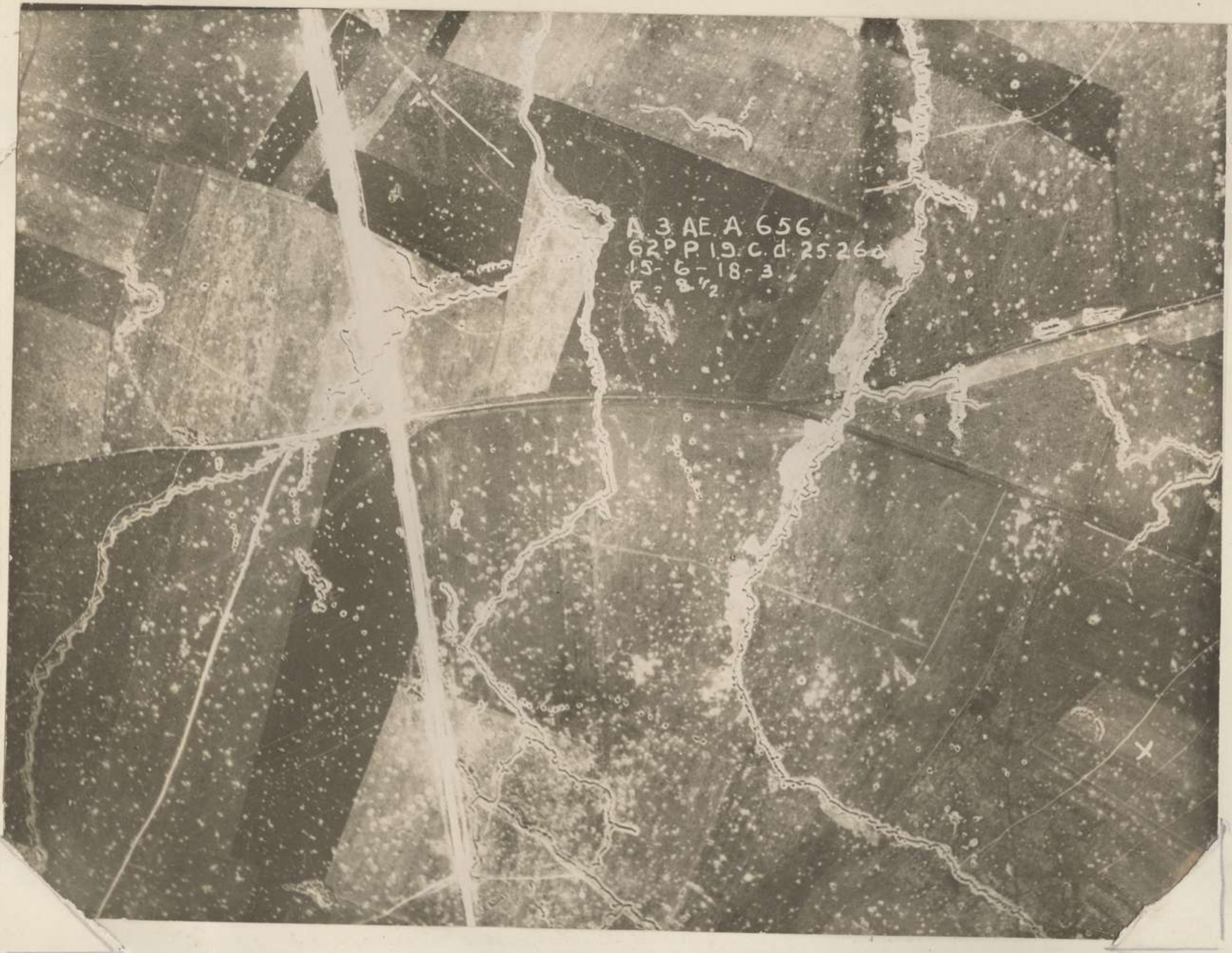

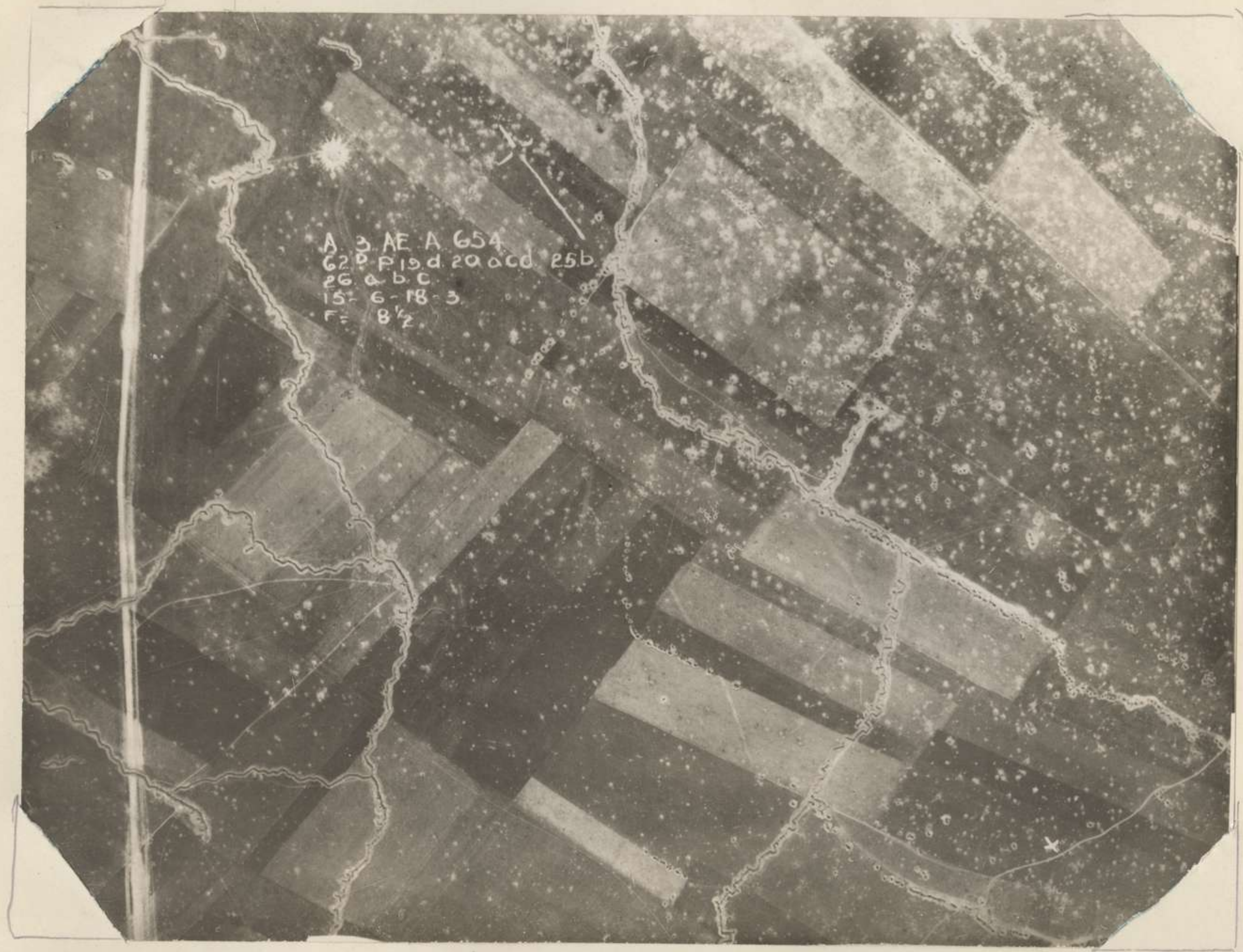
