Our billets in present area are not good, although disenfectants have been used in goodly quantities a considerable amount of sickness occured amongst the men.

RATIONS.

Rations have been drawn from ALIERY daily and are in man quantity and quality alike excellent(with the exception of vegetables) which have been purchased locally at reasonable prices they are of exceptionally good quality also.

COMFORTS.

The rations have been supplemented with Comforts of which a total of 65 cases has been received comprising, Sugar Milk, Oatmeal Curry Powder, Jam Fruits, Cigarettes etc These are greatly appreciated by the men at all times, and Muc-h cred-it is due to those concerned. (Australian Comforts).

ORDINANCE.

Ordnance supplies have not been equal to previous periods boots and leather being rather difficult to procure, also soap soda etc.

Winter clothing has been received and issued, comprising singlets, underpants, gloves, cardigans, etc of good quality.

Service dress clothing comes along in small quantities and of poor quality. A more satisfactory state of things would exist if Australian material were used in our Tunics Ereches and Hats puttees etc.

Y.M.C.A.

The Y.M.C.A. attached has proved a great comfort to the men generally.

SALVAGE.

This important branch has kept up a good average and compared favourably with other Units in the Division. Fat is being eaten a great deal more by the men and this is always encouraged although the fat salvage return is deminished.

It is assumed that maps are available for all parties. No warning order.

The assumption of train accomadation for conveyance to AIRAINES seems reasonable although the distance does not make it essential -trains may be more profitably be employed for old and sick and food stuffs.

The evacuation party would be rather tired when it come to prague; picquet duty after their many previous duties on this day some of which may have been obvicted by better organisation of the work to be done.

No report to Brigade Head quarters. Method of despatch of orders ommitted.

Most of the schemes omit any reference to control of evacuation towns. I would consider it necessary to take over all Post Office and telephon e communications on arrival to prevent unauthorised messages. Food supplied in the villages must certainly be un guarded; especially in view of troops coming in and threatened landing. Steps may have been taken to send supplies to AIRAINES. All public houses, wine & spirit shops must be placed under Military control and private property guarded. All water supplied should have been picquitted. The question of local transport and vehicles does not seem to have been thought out. Bicycles would have been useful for military work. I consider to carry out the scheme effectively the evacuating party much to small . Might I suggest a Company as a suitable unit to carry the work out.

NARRATIVE.


- 1. The low ground running from MAREUIL via BRAY DUACQ LIERCOURT to LONGPRE and the Valley thence to RIVIERE forms the N. coast of SOUTHLAND. The whole coast is watched by coast-guards whilst SOUTHERN Field Troops are being moved into the district as a precaution against a threatened landing from a NORTHLAND port about 10 hours steam to the N.W.
- 2. The population of SOUTHLAND is of doubtful loyalty and in this district there are a number of sympathisers with NORTHLAND.
- 3. Armament and moral of both sides are equal and neither possesses a numerous or efficient air service.
- 4. On "A" day the 3rd Division (less Artillery) moved Brigade Groups from the South to THILULLOY 1'ABBAYE area (11th Bde.); HORNOY Area (10th Bde.); LIOMER Area (9th Bde.)

 The same day the coast was bombarded and a feint landing made by a NORTHLAND expedition about 30 miles W. of MAREUIL and orders were issued to evacuate alle civilians within 5 miles of the coast.
- 5. On "B" Day orders were issued at 20.00 for close billets:
 11th Bde. Group to ALLERY METIGNY.

NOTES ON TRAINING SCHEME.

- 1. The outline of the scheme has already been distributed to Battalions. It will be seen that the role of the 9th Brigade will be Divisional Reserve.
- 2. It is intended that this Divisional Scheme shall be continuous and that during the next phase a greater amount of actual work will be carried out.

During this phase the work must necessarily be largely paper work, though where possible Brigade and Battalion work will be made to fit in with the general scheme.

- 3. It is not proposed to interfere with the "sports" hours of Officers more than is absolutely necessary. At the same time all Officers must take part. The greatest part of this work will therefore be carried out during the morning.
- 4. In order to effect this, the following scheme is suggested.
- (a) The Officers of each Battalion to be formed into Syndicates -

Four Company Commanders form No.1 Syndicate.
Four Platoon Commanders, whether they be Officers
or N.C.Os., to form a Company Syndicate.

(b) Though it is advisable that all Officers should carry out reconnaissances, it may only be possible to send out one or two Officers per Syndicate. The work should nevertheless be given to all Officers; the preliminary consideration of the work to be done should be taken part in by all, and the final report of the Syndicate should be considered and signed by all members.



- (111) Representatives of all of such Syndicates which the same the such syndicates which as necessary will then carry out the actual reconnaissance.
- (iv) On their return Syndicates will discuss their reports and then submit them to higher authority.
- 5. Throughout the scheme such reports will be submitted only to such authority as would no mally require them in actual operations, unless for the purpose of supervision they are asked for by higher authority for the purpose of perusal.
- 6. It is intended that in the initial stages ample time shall be given for C.Os. to enlarge on each exercise as they



may think fit and a fresh exercise will only be commenced when the one in hand has been brought to a satisfactory conclusion.

- any remarks it wishes to make with regard to points which the reconnaissance etc. has not brought out.
- 8. Apart from this it is desirable that schemes should be set by means of tactical orders and that they should be solved by orders and reports in strict service fashion.

 It should be borne in mind that the purpose of the exercise is to accustom Staffs and all Officers to deal with various contingencies as they arise, and in so doing apply the principles laid down in the various text-books.
- 9. All necessary assumptions will be made either in setting or solving each problems subject to the condition that such assumptions are definitely stated and fit in with the general tenor of the scheme.





- No l. The object is to defend GRANDSAR in the best ways that the natural features and buildings permit. The buildings are situate on high ground sloping away on both sides and in front and the village is thickly timbered the only means of approach being along the roads shown on attached map. The village can be best defended from outside its Northern bounderies when the Enemy can be engaged to our adwantage. The buildings are not bullet proof and do not offer any serious obstacles to the enemy once he has entered the village. The facilities for launching counter attacking troops are given by this system of defence.
 - 20 There is a good field of view and fire across the front just North of the Copse on the rising ground in S. 8. a. and on the forward slope s.7. b. This ground is bare and the slopes conwex which will make the concealment of posts difficult . It is therefore proposed to hold the zone of observation with 2 Companies.
 - I consider that the knoll just North of the village n.S.8.a 3. is the key to the line of observation. It is therefore prope proposed to place a counter attack company just S. of the fork road in S.8.c where there is a good covered line of approach to the knoll.
 - The Hill on which the village stands is a conspicious featu 4. which could not be held by direct means once the enemy had taken the high ground just North of it. It is proposed to deny it to the enemy by arranging a cross fire in front of it from either flank.
 - It is therfore proposed to hold the line of observation 5. with two Companies . One Company in support and one Company in reserve in the village of GRANDSAR.
