Correspondence will be still liable to examination at the Base and all ranks are reminded that the censorship regulations are still in force, except those orders cancelled by G.R.O. 5682. If examination at the Base shows that breaches of the Censorship Orders are common in any Units, it will be necessary to re-impose regimental censorship on those units. All letters and post cards must bear a censorship stamp except those posted in accordance with the latter portion of Censorship Orders para 30. All letters and post cards will bear in the left hand bottom corner of the address side the name and rank of the writer. They will be handed closed to the Officer in charge of the censor stamp and will not be opened by him except for the purpose of identifying writers who have failed to comply with this request. The issue of Green envelopes will be discontinued forthwith. Regimental censorship of parcels and telegrams will be maintained as heretofore.
For the purpose of interpreting "Censorship Orders for Troops on the Field" the term "franking" will be taken to mean the endorsement of the name and rank of the writer as indicated above, except as regards parcels.

PROVISIONS RELATIVE TO THE UNITED KINGDOM. Cancellation or
 transfer of allotment or transfer of residence to Australia.
 All ranks are informed that the following procedure will be
 followed with respect to cancellation or transfer of allotment
 while being paid in the United Kingdom by the Chief Registrar
 on behalf of members of the A.I.F. in the event of the allotment
 or transfer extending to Australia:-

- (1) If the member is still abroad and his allotment is proceed-
 ing to Australia, an advance will be made to the allottee
 covering allotment and repatriation allowance (if any) for a
 period of 90 days from the estimated date of the allottee's
 embarkation, and an authority for the certain sum of the
 allotment and repatriation allowance (if any) will be
 forwarded to the Military District in Australia to which
 the allottee is proceeding. The advance in Australia must
 be furnished by the allottee before embarkation.
- (2) Where the member embarks for Australia but the allottee is
 remaining in the United Kingdom the allotment and repatriation
 allowance (if any) will continue to be paid to the allottee
 for 90 days from the date of the member's embarkation and will
 then be cancelled. Provision should be made by members
 for the support of their dependents beyond this period
 immediately on disembarkation in Australia.
- (3) Members who have allotments payable in the United Kingdom
 to Banks or Non-Dependants must clearly understand that
 unless they arrange to cancel their allotments before
 embarkation to Australia payments will be continued for 90
 days from embarkation, and the amount payable to them on
 arrival in Australia will be correspondingly reduced.
- (4) The above provisions are to be brought to the notice of
 the members of all drafts selected for embarkation to
 Australia.
