

	4.8	.18.	The day was showery. C.O's orders were held at 2 p.m. Orders received from Brigade that the Battalion would move to bivouacs at H.29.c. (Sheet 62D.) tonight. Bn.0.0. No. 126 (Appendix 2.) was issued and preparations made for the move. As the Battalion is to be mobile in future, all spare gear, Officers Kits, packs etc were sent to Brigade Kit Store at VAUX. Nucleus Personnel marched out at 7.30 p.m. to bivouacs at BOIS-de-MAI, West of ADLONVILLE. The Battalion moved out at 8.30 p.m. by march route to bivouacs as ordered skirting AMIENS on the N. and N.E. via Main DAOURS-AMIENS Road, thence through BUSSY to bivouacs on West side of River HALU in H.29.c. Movement along roads was very difficult owing to enormous traffic. Huge supplies of materia and a great number of guns of all calibres were being sent forward for an intended attack on the enemy positions. Many tanks passed the Battalion during the move.

BIVOUACS, N.W. of BUSSY.	6.8	.18.	The C.O. attended a conference at Brigade Headquarters at 11 a.m. Weather slightly improved. The C.O. and Adjutant reconnoitred routes to 0.7.a. and from there to VILLERS-BRETONNEUX. Enormous movement of guns and material forward under cover of darkness. Battae Instructions No. 1 received from Brigade stating the part the Battalion would take in the projected attack on the enemy defences. Enemy bombing planes were very active during night time. Battalion Battle Instructions No. 1 (Appendix 3.) issued to all concerned.	Appendix 3.
	7.	8.18.	Notification received from Brigade that today is "Y" day. Final preparations were made for fitting the Battalion for the operations on "Z" day. Each man is to carry 170 rounds S.A.A 2 bombs, 2 sand bags, 2 water-bottles (full) and 48 hours rations over and above the iron rations in addition to the unexpired portion of today's ration. Battle Instructions No's 3 and 4 received from Brigade. The C.O. attended a conference at Brigade at 5 p.m. He returned at 7 p.m A Neeting of Company Commanders was held to discuss the forthcoming operations on "Z" day. Notification received from Brigade that tomorrow, 8th. inst., will be "Z" day and that Zero hour will be 4.20 a.m. During the evening by an unlucky shot the Hun struck one of our supply tanks with a "77" H.E. shell. These tanks, 18 in number, were parked in a small orchard on the Northern side of VILLERS-BRETONNEUX. The tank that was struck contained petrol and explosive stores of all description. Heroic attempts were made to draw the remainder clear but unfortunately only 4 could be got away, the remainder were set on fire by the explosion of the first tank and were completely destroyed.	
ASSEMPLY POINT 0.7.8	. 8.	8.18.	The Battalion moved from Bivouacs in H.29.c. (Disposition Sketch, appendix 4.) by march route at 1.45 a.m. and arrived at Assembly position on start line in 0.7.c. at 3.10 a.m. At this point the Battalion rested until 4.20 a.m. (Zero hour). Everyone is keyed up to concert pitch awaiting the time when our barrage will fall and set them moving forward to take their part in the effort to boll back the Hun lines At 15 minutes after Zero the Battalion moved off as per Battle Instructions No. 2 (Appendix 5.) via Artillery tracks to point wherePIONEER SWITCH crosses the main FOUILLOY-VILLERS-BRETONNEUX Road then over land along PIONEER SWITCH to DIGGERS SUPPORT LINE, the last named was the old support line in this sector during the months of April, May and June. Shortly after the Battalion arrived at this position the Division making the initial attack had passed beyong range of the Field Artillery which at once stated to move. Large numbers of prisoners were being passed hack to the cage as the morning went on. At 10 a.m. one of our planes landed in MXXX 0.23. owing to engine trouble. At midday orders were received from Brigade to move forward to P.30.a. N.E. of WARFUSEE-ABANCOURT and take up position approximately on the GREEN LINE. The BATTALION moved from DIGGERS SUPPORT at 12.15 p.m. and arrived at P.30.a. at 3 p.m. where it rested. The XW C.O. and Adjutant visited Brigade Headquarters and the C.O. and G.O.C. Brigade went forward to reconnoitre new positions in Q.33. Reconnoitring parties were sent forward from the Battalion at 4.30 p.m. and the Battalion moved forward at 5.30 p.m. and was in position in Q.32. at 7.30 p.m. Battalion H'qrs was established at Q.32.c.2.6. on the Northern edge of BAYONVILLERS. Great aerial activity during the whole of the day, with enemy bombers very active at night. Two planes, identity unknown, were brought down at about 7 p.m.

INE LEFT,	23.	3.18.	The Engineers with the assistance of the forward Companies taped off the start positions for the 2nd. Brigade and at 12.30 a.m. all was ready. The 5th. Battalion moved past Bn. H'grs at 2 a.m. picking up their guides at this point, at the same time Support and Reserve Companies moved back to positions already allotted. Owing to hostile shelling the unit moving forward suffered a few casualties before Zero hour. As soon as the 5th. Battalion were in position our forward companies moved back to positions East of North and South Grid through R.19R.25. Central and reportedm in that position at 4.10 am. having suffered no casualties. At 4.45 a.m. (Zero hour) our barrage fell and withing a few seconds the enemy flare throwers were sending up light signals of all descriptions. At Zero plus 5 minutes a few of the enemy gund began to speak but no shelling fell further to the rear than the Western edge of PROYART. The Railway line running from LA FLAQUE to PROYART was bombarded very heavily. The attack seemed to develop without hitch and by 6.30 a.m. most of the field guns had ceased firing and were moving forward to fresh positions. Prisoners began to stream back including a great number of enemy wounded which showed that our barrage had been most destructive. All prisoners seemed glad to be in rear of our attacking forces. Our contact planes were active over the forward areas. With the exception of 1 Flight of Battle planes no others were seen until at 10.15 a.m. when 14 hostile planes flew low omer the Battalion area firing their machine guns at Artillery Columns moving forward and other bodies of troops. They did not fire at troops in Hospital Copse at the Dressing station. By mid-day the enemy began using his long range gun and a few shells fell near the Battalion area. Throughout the operation the Battalion sustained no casualties.







- 1. The 2nd. Aud. Division have established a line facing East of Mt. St.QUENTIN-FOULIAUCOURT Road and are endeavouring to clear squares I.21 and 22 with the object of advancing their line to the HAUT-ALLAINES-BUSSU ROAD. The attack is to be carried out by the 6th. A.I.Brigade.
- 2. It is not known whether the enemy will still be in possession of PERONNE when the attack is launched or whether the waterways on the Morthern outskirts of the town are passable.
- 3. EThe 14th. A. I. Brigade has been ordered to clear the high ground in I.35 and 0.5. and 0.11 and to maintain touch with the 6th. A.I. Brigade at I.24.
- 4. (a) The final objective (from N. to S. is to be approximate lineroad through I.24. b and c., I.30. a and c., thence I.35.d.2.2. thence S along road to 0.11.a.8.7.
 (b) The inter Battalion boundary on the final objective will be the COLOGNE RIVER inclusive to left Battalion.
- 5. METHOD OF ATTACK (a). The attack will be carried out by the 54th.


 Battalion (line right), 53rd. Battalion (line left), 56th. Bn. right support, 55th. Battalion left support.

 (b) The 53rd. Battalion are to have the 23rd. Battalion (assembling in I.20.b.) on their left during the attack. The 53rd. Battalion will therefore arrange to get touch with the 23rd. Battalion and to occupy before Zero a position which they can move (in conformity with the 23rd. Bn. attack) to the vicinity of I.22. and thence attack S.E. towards their objective protecting their own right flank during the move.
 - (c) The 54th. Battalion with follow the 53rd. Bn as far as I.22. and will then move South under cover of 53rd. attack and secure high ground in I.34. and 35., thence exploiting to the limits of their objective.

FOOD. The cooks continue to do good work in preparing hot food of a high standard and good variety which is transported to the line in "hot boxes". Goods received from Comforts and the Y.M.C.A. has enabled us to supplement the issue rations considerably also to increase the variety.

ORDINANCE STORES. All demands have been supplied punctually and there are no items of importance outstanding.

BOOTS. The Bootmakers have repaired 90 pairs of boots and when last inspected all men were in possession of serviceable boots.

FAT. The quantity returned for the month was 2,300 lbs.

WORK. Owing to the fast advance of the past month, work has been exceptionally heavy.

INSPECTIONS. Captain Tucker, Brigade Vet. Officer, inspected the lines regularly. Captain Graeves, M.C. made his usual monthly inspection.

CASUALTIES. 1 0/Rank wounded, 1 0/Rank Died of wounds.
