

	4		<p>Our artillery caused a fair amount of damage to the enemy's parapets today. Enemy's retaliation caused 6 casualties amongst the units in our lines. Enemy discovered repairing his wire during the night 3/4th by our patrol. Enemy searchlight busy during night searching for aircraft.</p>	<p>Battalion Strength: 20 off 702 of Ranks Casualties: 1 other rank killed 3 " " Wounded</p>

The parapet has been strengthened in several places, the parados improved - Several new dugouts have been constructed in the front line. 2 concrete dug-outs in the 300 yards line, and 2 at FORAY HOUSE are under construction. Throughout the front line, duck boards have been raised above the ground level.</p> <p>We bombarded enemy line with Stokes mortars about midnight. Enemy sent up an abnormal number of flares.</p> <p>2 Officers and 58 other Ranks left today to attend School of Instruction in raiding.</p> <p>Battalion Strength: 23 off. 746 Other Ranks</p>	
	25		<p>The enemy are apparently carrying out extensive repairs etc. near TURKS POINT and CLAPHAM JUNCTION as a considerable amount of noise is heard there.</p> <p>The whole of "D" Company left at 11 a.m. for SAILLY where they are to undergo a special course of training for raiding parties.</p> <p>A fighting patrol of 1 Officer and 7 men operated from 9.30 p.m. to 12 midnight in front of enemy trenches, but no enemy patrols were encountered. 	28		Everything quiet up to 4 p.m., when our Artillery and Trench Mortars commenced an intense bombardment which lasted till 11 11.50 p.m. Considerable damage caused to enemy parapet near TURKS POINT, it being breached in one part. Enemy retaliation caused little damage with the exception of 2 men slightly wounded. - The Artillery and Trench Mortars again bombarded enemy positions from TURKS POINT to the NEEDLE <small>(Map ref N.S.d.81)</small> from 11 to 11.45 p.m. - Retaliation caused 1 slight casualty only wounded. Enemy plane driven back from our lines at 11.15 p.m. Battalion Strength: 26 Off. 737 Other Ranks.

Machine gun fire more active than usual during the night. Our patrol operated from 9.30 p.m. to 11 p.m. but encountered no enemy parties.</p> <p>Battalion Strength: 26 off. 754 O/Ranks</p>	
	31		<p>Weather is now fine and ground drying fairly as same has been drained as well as possible. Everything is quieter than usual and very little activity has been displayed by the artillery.</p>
